REVISED SUMMARY: On May 1, 2001 the Board selected the proposal submitted by Trump to develop an additional 9 holes on the County-s Section 6 property. Staff has concluded negotiations using essentially the same form as the existing 18-hole golf course lease. The term is for 30 years roughly 27 years, running concurrently with the existing lease until October 31, 2029, with extension options for a total of 75 years.
