Seagrasses are vital nursery and feeding areas for fish and other marine animals. Please protect them.

If you run aground or enter grass flats to fish, stop your motor, tilt it up, and pole or push your boat through.



FISHING THE SEAGRASS FLATS

1. Do not operate your boat in areas that are too shallow for your equipment. Use nautical and tide charts to plan your course.
2. Never cut through seagrass beds with a propeller. Watch your prop wash for mud or plant life which may indicate you are too shallow.
3. Pole or use a trolling motor when traveling across or fishing flats. Quiet fishermen catch more fish.
4. If you run aground, turn off your engine. Raise the motor and push or pole your way to deeper water. If necessary, wait for high tide to move your boat.
5. Remember, prop scars take years to recover!
6. Do not crowd another boat. If you see another boat fishing on the flats, do not approach unless beckoned.

HELP PRESERVE OUR WATERWAYS

1. Do NOT allow fuel to spill. Leave 5% empty space at the top of the tank for expansion.
2. Discard trash on shore. It is a federal offense to discard any trash overboard within three miles of shore. It is also illegal to dump plastic trash overboard anywhere. Transparent plastic bags, nonbiodegradable fishing line and six-pack beverage rings can be fatal to birds, dolphins and other marine life.
3. Minimize use of soaps/detergents when cleaning a boat in the water; they encourage algae growth.
4. Collect bottom paint scrapings and dispose of them with on-shore trash. Do not leave scrapings where they can wash into the water.
5. While underway, use a holding tank or portable toilet until you can dispose of wastewater at a pump-out or dump station. It is illegal to discharge raw sewage overboard into Florida waters. Use an on-shore toilet whenever possible.

POPULAR FISH

Name & Habitat	Description
COMMON SNOOK - Inshore, in coastal and brackish waters, along mangrove shorelines, seawalls, and bridges; also on reefs and pilings.	
SHEEPSHEAD - Inshore around oyster bars, bridges, and pilings; abundant in winter and early spring over boat structure and artificial reefs.	
GREYALE (SHOWN) AND POMPAÑO JACKS - Common in inshore waters, and the open sea; peak spawning occurs offshore from March through September.	
WHITE GRUNT - From shallows to the outer reef edge; on an offshore hard bottom abundant in water less than 80 feet deep.	
GRAY AND LANE (SHOWN) SNAPPERS - Juveniles inshore over grass beds or shallow reefs; adults offshore, more common in south Florida.	
TARPON - Primarily inshore; can flourish at the surface; slow grower, matures in 7 to 15 years of age.	
LADYFISH - Inshore fish, in bays and estuaries; occasionally enters freshwater; leaps when hooked.
