What Is NENA?

- **NENA** is an outdoor destination bringing together over *165,000 acres* of wild Florida lands and more than *12* different activity & education centers
- **NENA** provides a wide range of outdoor recreational activities from bird watching in an area open only to foot traffic to hunting in areas open to off-road vehicles.
- **NENA's** trail network offers access and connections to several different conservation lands while providing alternative routes for transportation.
- **NENA** is a working partnership with many different governmental and private organizations that manage the **NENA** places.

Where is the Trail?

- Pântano Trail extends *10 miles* along the C-18W Canal from Riverbend Park in Jupiter to J.W. Corbett WMA in Loxahatchee.
- Phase 1 extends *4 miles* from Riverbend Park to the Loxahatchee Slough Natural Area.

Project Features Phase 1

- Total **4 miles** of hardened bicycle and pedestrian trail
- Chickee shade shelter and other amenities
- Shared-use access for equestrians, bicycles and pedestrians
- Educational kiosks and signs

Project Benefits

- Provides a connection between Riverbend Park in Jupiter and J.W. Corbett WMA in Loxahatchee on an improved trail
- Offers backcountry shared-use access to the Loxahatchee Slough Natural Area and the Hungryland Slough Natural Area
- Excellent opportunity for wildlife viewing, bird watching & nature photography
