Rules and Regulations

Show management agrees that all rules and regulations at Jim Brandon Equestrian Center (hereinafter “JBEC” or “facility”) shall be enforced and supported, including but not limited to the following:

GENERAL RULES

- Show management/exhibitors of any animal brought to the facility must observe all regulations of the State of Florida Animal Health Division.
- No horses are permitted on spectator berms around show arenas.
- Stall assignment/identification cards will be removable in nature, and secured so as not to damage the stall panels. Staples, screws, etc. may not be used. Show/event management is responsible for removal of all materials at the completion of the show/event.
- Show management/exhibitors are responsible for cleaning and maintaining stable areas at all times. All manure must be disposed of in designated areas only (covered manure receptacles), and receptacles will be cleaned in a manner determined by the facility management.
- Only bedding and manure is to be placed in manure bins.
- Trash must be placed in the proper receptacles, including recycle bins when available.
- No glass, all liquids must be enclosed in shatter proof containers.

- No class or event may be scheduled to begin before 8:00 a.m. If an earlier start of the show/event is necessary, show management must notify JBEC two (2) weeks in advance and negotiate charges for the early watering and conditioning.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

- If management allows exhibitors to arrive before noon on the day before the show/event date, an additional One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) per day charge will be added to the Management's bill.
- No vehicles are permitted to park within 30 feet of any stabling facility unless loading or un-loading. You are allowed 15 minutes upon arrival to unload after which time you must move your vehicle to a designated parking area away from the barns, or the vehicle may be towed at the owner's expense.
- If a show has exhibitors who wish to arrive early (before noon of the day before the show date) JBEC cannot guarantee availability of specific stalls, and show management may incur an early arrival fee.
- Before placing horses in stalls, check with Barn Manager to receive stall assignments. Barn Manager is an adult named by Show Management as a representative to be present during event move-in to insure this policy is enforced, to un-lock stalls and collect all stall fees, and to make sure all vehicles load and un-load in a timely fashion.
- Only 1 horse per stall, unless nursing mare with foal.
- Initial stall bedding is not supplied and can be purchased from the facility Management Office. No outside vendor may deliver shavings to competitors. Stalls must be adequately bedded, no horses are allowed in dry stalls.
- No nailing into stall walls, or alterations of stalls in any way.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

- All personal injury or property damage must be reported to the Equestrian Facility Manager or other Park staff so that an official incident report may be prepared and filed.
- **FOR ANY EVENT WITH SCHOOLING OR SHOWING OVER FENCES:** Show management shall have qualified medical personnel with no other duties and suitable medical equipment present during all scheduled schooling sessions over fences and during all scheduled performances (Article 1213, Paragraph 6, USEF Rule Book).

- Riders 16 years of age and under are required to wear an approved safety helmet (regardless of riding style) and must be accompanied by an adult.
- Anyone riding in a ring containing jumps, whether warm-up or show, must wear a helmet regardless of age.
- No smoking in barns, buildings, offices, or around manure receptacles.
- All medical waste must be kept separate from manure and trash, and disposed of in the proper receptacles provided (Sharps containers).
- Show management/exhibitors are responsible for maintaining the stable areas at all times. All manure must be disposed of in designated areas only (covered manure receptacles), and receptacles will be cleaned in a manner determined by the facility management.
- No horses will be permitted on any areas designated for pedestrian traffic; roped areas, chained or fenced off rings or grounds, or otherwise off limit areas.
- No horses will be longed in any show or schooling ring. There are designated longeing areas, complete with round pens for such longeing and training activities.
- Horses are to be washed in designated wash stalls only. No washing of horses in the barn aisles, barn breezeways, aisle ways, parking lots, or roadways will be allowed.
- All dogs must be on a leash no longer than 6 feet at all times, and must be picked up after and the waste disposed of in manure receptacles. Show office is off limits to dogs unless required by the disabled. Dogs must yield to horses.
- Horses cannot be tied to bars on stall fronts, or stall doors, fences, gates, pavilions, or other equipment. Horses may be tied to tie rings in stalls.
- Horses shall not be loose or unattended when not stabled.
- Horses are not permitted to be turned out in any arena, including round pens.
- If participants stable horses overnight, show management must provide a security guard to be on site during non-event hours. Approved security guard service providers will be provided by facility management, upon request. Show management must provide additional security if participants stay on premises overnight in recreational vehicles. Facility management will assist you with contracting through the Palm Beach Sheriffs Office for this security.

VEHICLES AND PARKING

- All motorized vehicles, including but not limited to cars, trucks, golf carts, motorcycles, Mopeds, etc. shall only be driven by licensed drivers. They are to be driven in a safe and courteous manner at all times and are to be parked only in designated areas. No golf carts or motor bikes shall be permitted in other areas designated for horse traffic only. Golf carts will be impounded by security or park personnel if underage drivers are caught operating them. Golf cart usage will be strictly monitored.

- Anyone operating a motorized vehicle of any type on the premises must have in their possession a valid driver's license. This applies to golf carts, mopeds, motorcycles, cars, trucks, etc. Children who have a valid learners' permit may operate the above mentioned motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid drivers' license.

- Security and/or traffic access control will be arranged as necessary for all scheduled events staying overnight by show management and will be included in the cost for the use of the facility (see fee schedule).

- No trailers shall be unhooked on any of the asphalt roadways.

- No skateboards, in-line skates, or roller skates are allowed.

Under Florida law, an equine activity sponsor or equine professional is not liable for an injury to, or death of, a participant in equine activities resulting from the inherent risks of equine activities.
