East Side Amenities--Red Dot ● Tour

1. West side boat docks.
2. Pedestrian bridges to access the reef island.
3. Reef island with shallow lagoon, snorkeling reef, & floating swim platform.
4. Pedestrian bridge to access pile crib breakwater and walkway.
5. Pile crib breakwater and walkway.
6. Panoramic viewing area.

West Side Amenities--Yellow Dot ● Tour

7. Tidal pond, boat basin, & floating docks.
8. Mangrove flushing channels.
9. Mangrove boardwalk.
10. Maritime hammock habitat.
11. Dune planting.

Sand from Florida Inland Navigation District's (FIND) dredged material management area on Peanut Island was removed and used to create the Snook Island Natural Area adjacent to the Lake Worth Municipal Golf Course. This natural area will include new seagrass beds, mangrove islands, oyster reef, and deep water habitat with flushing channels. FIND's dredged material management area will be left with the capacity to address future waterway and inlet maintenance needs.
