I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve on Preliminary Reading and advertise for Public Hearing on October 17, 2006 at 9:30 A.M: AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING CHAPTER 10, SECTION 10-9, PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE, TO INCREASE THE CIVIL TRAFFIC PENALTY SURCHARGE COLLECTED TO FUND DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN SCHOOLS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS; PROVIDING FOR CAPTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Summary: On September 10, 2002, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 2002-063 as amended by Ordinance 2002-071, dated December 17, 2002 (Attachment 2), which provides for the collection of \$3.00 with each civil traffic penalty to fund a Driver Education Safety Trust Fund program. This proposed amendment will increase the surcharge from \$3.00 to \$5.00 for each civil traffic penalty. Since the inception of this program 13,547 students have been trained. The Palm Beach County Safety Council conducts the Driver Education classes for the Palm Beach County School Board and has indicated that the current funding is insufficient to keep up with maintenance costs and the number of requests for training. (See Attachment 3.) Countywide (SF)

Background and Policy Issues: During the 2006 Legislative session, the Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act, Section 318.1215, Florida Statutes, was amended to increase the amount of the surcharge to be collected on each civil traffic penalty, which is to be used to fund driver education programs in schools. On September 10, 2002, the Board of County Commissioners passed Ordinance No. 2002-063 to implement the Driver Education Safety Trust Fund program, pursuant to the Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act (the "Act").. The original ordinance provided for collection of a \$3.00 surcharge with each civil traffic penalty. The proposed amendment increases the amount of the surcharge the County will collect to \$5.00, as provided for in the amendment to Section 318.1215, Florida Statutes.

16	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County adopted
17	Ordinance No. 2002-063, later amended by Ordinance No. 2002-071, which implements

19	Safety Act," which authorized counties to enact an ordinance requiring the clerk of the court to

22	WHEREAS, the Legislature has amended the "Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety
23	Act", now codified as Section 318.1215, Florida Statutes, to increase from \$3.00 to \$5.00 the
24	amount of the surcharge counties may collect on each civil traffic penalty; and
25	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County desires to
26	amend Chapter 10, Section 10-9, Palm Beach County Code, to increase the amount of the
27	surcharge the county may collect on each civil traffic penalty from \$3.00 to \$5.00; and
28	WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County finds that
29	collection of the increased surcharge will facilitate the implementation of driver education

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County enacted Ordinance No. 2002-063 to implement Section 98, Chapter 2002-20, Laws of Florida, known as the "Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act," which authorizes counties to enact an ordinance requiring the clerk of the court to collect an additional three dollars (\$3.00) with each civil traffic penalty to be used to fund driver education programs in public and non-public schools; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2002-063 No. provides for annual disbursement of a percentage of Driver Education Trust Fund monies to the School Board of Palm Beach County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County finds that quarterly disbursement of Driver Education Trust Fund monies will facilitate implementation of driver education programs in public schools.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. QUARTERLY DISBURSEMENT OF DRIVER EDUCATION TRUST FUND MONIES TO THE PALM BEACH COUNTY SCHOOL BOARD

Section 3 of Ordinance No. 2002-063 is amended to read:

Section 3. DISBURSEMENT OF DRIVER EDUCATION SAFETY TRUST FUND MONIES

Monies deposited into the Driver Education Safety Trust Fund shall be used to financially assist driver education safety programs in public and non-public schools in the County. The funds shall be used for

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direct educational expenses and shall not be used for administration costs.

- b.) On an annual basis, A percentage of the funds collected under this Ordinance shall be disbursed at the end of each fiscal quarter to the School Board of Palm Beach County for driver education programs in public schools. The percentage of funds disbursed to the School Board shall be based on the number of students enrolled in public schools that are eligible to participate in driver education programs. In order to receive funding under this Ordinance, the School Board shall execute a Grant Acceptance Agreement, acknowledging that funds received under this Ordinance shall only be used for direct educational expenses for driver education programs, and promising that funds received under this Ordinance will not be used to replace existing driver education funding levels or funding sources.
- c.) A percentage of the funds collected under this Ordinance shall be made available for disbursement to eligible non-public schools as part of a grant program. The percentage of funds disbursed to eligible non-public schools as part of the grant program shall be based on the number of students enrolled in non-public schools that are eligible to take driver education.
- d.) Grant program procedures shall be developed by the County Administrator and approved by the Board of County Commissioners. A Grant Program Administrator may be designated by interlocal agreement, resolution of the Board of County Commissioners, or other formal directive by the Board of County Commissioners. In order to receive funds from the Driver Education Safety Trust Fund, eligible grant applicants shall apply for funds and receive grant approval in accordance with grant program

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procedures, and shall execute a Grant Acceptance Agreement, acknowledging that funds received under the Ordinance shall only be used for direct educational expenses for driver education programs, and promising that funds received under this Ordinance will not be used to replace existing driver education funding levels or funding sources.

- e.) Non-public elementary schools, middle schools, and high schools that offer driver education instruction are eligible to apply for a grant under this Ordinance.
- f.) Criteria that may be considered as a basis for grant selection includes, but is not limited to the following:
 - 1.) The number of years the grant applicant has administered a driver education program;
 - 2.) The number of students who have successfully completed the grant applicant's driver education program;
 - 3.) The grant applicant's safety record;
 - 4.) The extent to which the grant applicant's curriculum meets all applicable local, state, and federal guidelines for driver education programs.
- g.) Final approval of grant awards shall be made by the Board of County Commissioners uponrecommendation by the Grant Program Administrator or the County Administrator.
- Monies that have not been disbursed at the end of each fiscal year shall be retained for disbursement in the following fiscal year.

Section 2. REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT:

All local laws and ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Dear Mr. Bonvento,

Drivers Education summer school is in full swing right now at six area High Schools. Public and private school students who cannot otherwise take this course during their school year take it during the summer. Parents are very appreciative, and count on us to provide the driving component of the classroom curriculum.

The popularity of Drivers Education is growing everyday not only during summer school but also throughout the entire year.

Palm Beach County has taken a leadership role in adopting this essential program and should applaud its success thus far. Our County Commissioners have set the precedent for other counties around the state to follow. We have the largest program and others contact us to see how to implement a similar program in their counties.

The three-dollar assessment money has enabled us to train many students; however, the demand is greater than the dollars available. We urgently need to increase the assessment to \$5.00 on each moving violation.

We have 21 training vehicles and gas and maintenance prices have skyrocketed in the last year alone. We appeal to the County Commissioners to increase the assessment to \$5.00 so that we may continue this worthwhile program.

This grass roots program that started back in 1999 had many community partners but it is the assessment dollars that has taken this program to the level it is at now. Many students have been trained and we are now into our eighth year of providing Behind the Wheel driving.

I am happy to report that we have trained 13,547 students since its inception. The program has grown each and every year; in fact, since January of this year through today's date we have trained 1,737 students.



We look forward to continued success and a special thank you to the Commissioners in supporting our children.

(b) A person who is either the owner or a lessee required to maintain insurance under s. 324.021(9)(b) and who operates limousines, jitneys, or any other for-hire passenger vehicles, other than taxicabs, may prove financial responsibility by furnishing satisfactory evidence of holding a motor vehicle liability policy as defined in s. 324.031.

Upon request by the department, the applicant must provide the department at the applicant's principal place of business in this state access to the applicant's underlying financial information and financial statements that provide the basis of the certified public accountant's certification. The applicant shall reimburse the requesting department for all reasonable costs incurred by it in reviewing the supporting information. The maximum amount of self-insurance permissible under this subsection is \$300,000 and must be stated on a per-occurrence basis, and the applicant shall maintain adequate excess insurance issued by an authorized or eligible insurer licensed or approved by the Office of Insurance Regulation. All risks self-insured shall remain with the owner or lessee providing it, and the risks are not transferable to any other person, unless a policy complying with subsection (1) is obtained.

Section 49. Section 318.1215, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

318.1215 Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act.--Effective October 1, 2002, Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 318.121, a board of county commissioners may require, by

ordinance, that the clerk of the court collect an additional \$5 \$3 with each civil traffic penalty, which shall be used to fund driver education programs in public and nonpublic schools. The ordinance shall provide for the board of county commissioners to administer the funds, which shall be used for enhancement, and not replacement, of driver education program funds. The funds shall be used for direct educational expenses and shall not be used for administration. Each driver education program receiving funds pursuant to this section shall require that a minimum of 30 percent of a student's time in the program be behind-thewheel training. This section may be cited as the "Dori Slosberg Driver Education Safety Act."

Section 50. Subsection (1) of section 316.083, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

316.083 Overtaking and passing a vehicle.--The following rules shall govern the overtaking and passing of vehicles proceeding in the same direction, subject to those limitations, exceptions, and special rules hereinafter stated:

(1) The driver of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall give an appropriate signal as provided for in s. 316.156, shall pass to the left thereof at a safe distance, and shall not again drive to the right side of the roadway until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle. The driver of a vehicle overtaking a bicycle or other nonmotorized vehicle must pass the bicycle or other nonmotorized vehicle at a safe distance of not less than 3 feet between the vehicle and the bicycle or other nonmotorized vehicle.
