I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve a budget transfer of \$56,700 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) (1151) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office for donations to support the safe neighborhood, crime prevention, and drug abuse prevention/education/treatment programs of various non-profit organizations.

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, and safe neighborhood initiatives. The PBSO's FY 2007 estimated donation requirement is \$173,914.93. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$243,240. The Sheriff's Office certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a spreadsheet indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. Countywide

Background and Justification: The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has a long-standing commitment to the reduction of crime and implementation of crime and drug prevention programs within Palm Beach County. Use of LETF requires authorization approval by the Board in accordance with F.S. 932.7055, upon request of the Sheriff. This Statute requires that no less than 15 % of the last fiscal year's revenues be donated or expended for the support or operation of any drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood or school resource officer program. The Sheriff's office certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055.

- 2. Organization/Program Purpose: The West Palm Beach Public Library is a center for information and communication. The needs, interests and aspirations of the 21st century learner(specifically teens) are seeking alternative means to both acquire and use information. According to a 1998 Gallup poll conducted for the American Library Association, "the youngest Americans polled (18-24 years of age) were least enthusiastic of any age group about the importance of libraries in digital future." One of the greatest challenges of libraries today is to create new services and products that address the needs of the 21st century learner. We know that visual context is overtaking straight word content, and that users are becoming more dependent and reliant on visual representations to support pure text and by acquiring the appropriate skills, will lead to higher levels of literacy and provide more effective means of communication. We are intent on providing an increase of product and service to our teens. The return on community investment will be visible through increased knowledge, skills, attitudes, and behaviors on the part of the teens. By creating a unique learning environment for them, we will pave a pathway for more broadbased use of our library. Our gaming program intends to seize upon teens craving to engage in projects and activities that allow for maximum participation. Through this program we also hope that with appropriate training, teens will develop leadership potential and help us develop new ways to utilize the media and technology that is driving consumers. The long tradition of making decisions for youths without youths has failed. Collaborating with teens will offer to us an array of perspectives and first hand experiences that will lend credibility to our gaming program. Video games can be an activity that bridges gaps between age, gender, and ethnicity. By 2008 there will be 126 million gamers in the United



	States, and new forms of technology, that parents may not know about, has been embraced by teens. Gamers learn differently, and have a new way of thinking about the world. Since libraries strive to be a place of equal access, and meet all group needs, gaming for teens, fits into this standard. Get Your Game On will also introduce the library to reluctant teenagers who might otherwise never visit. The gaming program will allow teens to have a safe, clean, free space to meet, talk and engage in an activity they love.
3.	Mission Statement: To enhance the quality of life by connecting the West Palm Beach community to the world of information, education, culture and recreation.
4.	Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded: Get Your Game On will be open to teens ages 12 and up. The program will include three stations, all interactive and fun. The first station will feature a Playstation 2 connected to a large screen TV. The teens will be issued tickets that will allow for 5 or 10 minute play. (Dependent on how many teens participate.) They will compete against time and each other, fostering a healthy competitiveness. While waiting for their Playstation time, attendees can visit the GameBoy station, where 8 GameBoys will be available for play, and here teens will have the opportunity to interact with each other. They can also visit station three, which features an array of colored pencils, drawing paper, and books about creating game characters, video games and drawing. Station three will also feature books on game strategies and cheat codes. The Teen Librarian will be available to introduce new teens to the resources (books, dvd's, music, magazines, computers, databases) the library has to offer them.
