

### RESOLUTION

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A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BOCA RATON OPPOSING FLORIDA HOUSE BILL 529, KNOWN AS THE "CONSUMER CHOICE ACT OF 2007"; URGING MEMBERS OF THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO REFRAIN FROM ANY FORM OF SUPPORT OR CO-SPONSORSHIP OF HB529 AND TO VOTE IN OPPOSITION TO HB529; REQUESTING GOVERNOR CRIST TO ADVISE THE HOUSE AND SENATE LEADERSHIP THAT HE DOES NOT SUPPORT HB529 IN ADVANCE OF THE OPENING OF THE 2007 REGULAR SESSION; AND DIRECTING THAT THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO GOVERNOR CRIST, THE PALM BEACH COUNTY LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION, THE PALM BEACH COUNTY LEAGUE OF CITIES, THE FLORIDA LEAGUE OF CITIES, AND THE PALM BEACH COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; PROVIDING **FOR** SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR REPEALER; PROVIDING AN **EFFECTIVE DATE** 

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2007, Florida House Representative Anthony Traviesa introduced the Consumer Choice Act of 2007 (HB529); and

WHEREAS, the bill prohibits municipalities and counties from negotiating terms and conditions from cable and video service providers wishing to do business within the local governments' jurisdiction in the future; and

WHEREAS, the bill deletes authorization for municipalities and counties to award cable service franchises and restrictions that require cable service companies not to operate without such franchise; and

WHEREAS, the bill designates the Florida Department of State as the authorizing authority for state-wide franchising of cable and video service providers, but prohibits the Department from imposing build out, construction, and deployment requirements on cable and video certificate holders; and

WHEREAS, the bill requires the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to receive all customer service complaints thereby eliminating citizen ability to seek remedy of complaints via their local government; and

WHEREAS, the bill establishes requirements and limitations on municipalities and counties relating to access to public right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the bill prohibits municipalities and counties from imposing any additional requirements on cable and video certificate holders; and

WHEREAS, the bill would deprive municipalities and counties of the authority to establish and maintain government owned and operated networks, known as institutional networks, that may be utilized by first responders and other government officials in the day-to-day management of local government business; and

WHEREAS, the bill would potentially reduce the amount of capacity which may be required by local governments to meet their public, educational, and government ("PEG") access needs, while stripping local government of the ability to obtain capital support for the use

of PEG capacity with the result that the communities' cable-related needs and interests may not be met; and

WHEREAS, the bill would deprive local citizens of the ability to address local issues locally, by removing to the state all customer service issues; and

WHEREAS, the bill would ultimately preempt all local authority over the provision of cable and video services within the community, including the ability of the local government to provide appropriate oversight to entities conducting business within their jurisdiction and in the local public rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, for these reasons, the City Council of the City of Boca Raton finds that it should oppose HB529; now therefore,

#### BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BOCA RATON

Section 1: That the foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby made a specific part of this Resolution upon adoption hereof.

Section 2: For the reasons stated herein above, the City Council of the City of Boca Raton declares its opposition to HB529 and urges Florida Governor Crist, the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation, the Palm Beach County League of Cities, the Leadership of the Florida League of Cities, and the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners to oppose HB529.

Section 3: The City Council urges Governor Crist to strongly consider advising the leadership of the House and Senate prior to the opening of the 2007 Regular Session that he does not support HB529.

Section 4: The City Clerk is hereby directed to distribute this resolution to Florida Governor Crist, the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation, the Palm Beach County League

WHEREAS, the Town determines that adoption of this resolution opposing HB 529 is in the best interests of the citizens and residents of the Town of Juno Beach.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF JUNO BEACH, FLORIDA, as follows:

Re: Town of Palm Beach Resolution Opposing H529

Dear Commissioner Greene:

Enclosed herewith, please find Palm Beach Resolution No. 10-07 opposing H529. Please do all things necessary to thwart the adoption of this proposed legislation. This bill is not favorable to the interests of the citizens of Palm Beach County.

#### H529 will:

- Prohibit local government from negotiating terms and conditions from cable and video service providers wishing to do business in their jurisdiction.
- Eliminate the ability of local governments to award cable service franchises and eliminates all local government requirements for the provision of a franchise prior to service provision.
- Require all customer service complaints to be directed to the Florida Department
  of Agriculture and Consumer Services eliminating citizen ability to seek remedy
  of complaints through their local government.
- Place restrictions on local government and their ability to control the activities of cable television and video service providers within right-of-way and on private property within their communities.

Every local government in Florida desires competition in cable TV and video programming services. Nothing precludes any service provider from securing a franchise and providing the services throughout all Florida communities. Existing franchises must be non-exclusive and state law requires that local government treat service providers in a competitively neutral manner. Competition already exists in the form of digital satellite television services, which are available statewide, and more is welcome to maximize services and put downward pressure on upward trends in pricing, but not at the expense of removing local oversight of right-of-way and service standards required by franchise agreements.

Please use the power of your office to thwart the adoption of H529 and, specifically, let the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation know in advance of the opening of the 2007 regular legislative session that you are opposed to the adoption of H529 and any companion bill that may emanate from the Senate.

Your time and efforts in regard to this important matter are greatly appreciated.

#### **RESOLUTION NO. 10-07**

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF PALM BEACH, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, **EXPRESSING OPPOSITION TO HOUSE BILL 529 KNOWN** AS THE "CONSUMER CHOICE ACT OF 2007" (H529), URGING FLORIDA LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVES TO REFRAIN FROM ANY FORM OF SUPPORT OR CO-SPONSORSHIP OF H529 AND TO VOTE IN OPPOSITION TO H529, REQUESTING GOVERNOR CRIST TO ADVISE THE HOUSE AND SENATE LEADERSHIP THAT HE DOES NOT SUPPORT H529 IN ADVANCE OF THE OPENING OF THE 2007 REGULAR SESSION, AND DIRECTING THAT THIS RESOLUTION BE FORWARDED TO FLORIDA GOVERNOR CRIST, THE PALM BEACH COUNTY LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION, THE MAYOR OF EACH MUNICIPALITY IN PALM BEACH COUNTY, THE LEADERSHIP OF THE PALM BEACH COUNTY LEAGUE OF CITIES, THE LEADERSHIP OF THE FLORIDA LEAGUE OF CITIES, AND EACH MEMBER OF THE PALM BEACH COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on January 23, 2007, Florida House Representative Anthony Traviesa introduced the Consumer Choice Act of 2007 (H529); and

WHEREAS, the bill prohibits municipalities and counties from negotiating terms and conditions from cable and video service providers wishing to do business within the local governments' jurisdiction in the future; and

WHEREAS, the bill deletes authorization for municipalities and counties to award cable service franchises and restrictions that require cable service companies not to operate without such franchise; and

WHEREAS, the bill designates the Florida Department of State as the authorizing authority for state-wide franchising of cable and video service providers, but prohibits the Department from imposing build out, construction, and deployment requirements on cable and video certificate holders; and

WHEREAS, the bill requires the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to receive all customer service complaints thereby eliminating citizen ability to seek remedy of complaints via their local government; and

WHEREAS, the bill establishes requirements and limitations on municipalities and counties relating to access to public right-of-way; and

WHEREAS, the bill prohibits municipalities and counties from imposing any additional requirements on cable and video certificate holders; and

WHEREAS, the bill would deprive municipalities and counties of the authority to establish and maintain government owned and operated networks, known as institutional networks, that may be utilized by first responders and other government officials in the day-to-day management of local government business; and

WHEREAS, the bill would potentially reduce the amount of capacity which may be required by local governments to meet their public, educational, and government "PEG" access needs, while stripping local government of the ability to obtain capital support for the use of PEG capacity with the result that the communities' cable-related needs and interests may not be met; and

WHEREAS, the bill would deprive local citizens of the ability to address local issues locally, by removing to the state all customer service issues; and

WHEREAS, the bill would ultimately preempt all local authority over the provision of cable and video services within the community, including the ability of the local government to provide appropriate oversight to entities conducting business within their jurisdiction and in the local public rights-of-way; and

WHEREAS, for these reasons, the Town Council finds that it should oppose H529 and urges Florida Governor Crist, the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation, the mayor of each municipality in Palm Beach County, the leadership of the Palm Beach County League of Cities, the Leadership of the Florida League of Cities, and each member of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners to oppose H529; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that this resolution should be forwarded to Florida Governor Crist, the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation, the mayor of each municipality in Palm Beach County, the leadership of the Palm Beach County League of Cities, the Leadership of the Florida League of Cities, and each member of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Palm Beach, Palm Beach County, Florida, as follows:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are hereby ratified and confirmed.

Section 2:

For the reasons stated herein above, the Town Council of the Town of Palm Beach, Palm Beach County, Florida, declares its opposition to H529 and urges Florida Governor Crist, the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation, the mayor of each municipality in Palm Beach County, the leadership of the Palm Beach County League of Cities, the Leadership of the Florida League of Cities, and each member of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners to oppose H529.

Section 3:

The Town Council requests Governor Crist to strongly consider advising the leadership of the House and Senate prior to the opening of the 2007 Regular Session that he does not support H529.

Section 4:

The Town Council hereby directs that this resolution be forwarded immediately to Florida Governor Crist, the Palm Beach County Legislative Delegation, the mayor of each municipality in Palm Beach County, the leadership of the Palm Beach County League of Cities, the Leadership of the Florida League of Cities, and each member of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners.

Section 5: This resolution shall become effective immediately upon its passage.
