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I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Title: Overview of PBC Library System Expansion Program II

Summary: Library staff will present updated information on the status of Library Expansion Program II (LEP II) projects, a strategy for dealing with construction cost increases and potential shortfall of revenue, and provide information about additional facility needs.

Background and Policy Issues: The Palm Beach County Library System provides a wide range of library services throughout the County through a system of regional and branch libraries. Through its fourteen existing locations the Library System received over 3.8 million visitors in 2006. Staff circulated 5.76 million items to 485,834 library cardholders. On November 5, 2002, voters approved a referendum financing the costs of library expansion in the Palm Beach County Library District by the issuance of General Obligation Bonds in an amount not to exceed \$55 million. The bond issue combined with Impact Fees and carryover ad valorem revenue anticipated by 2010 was expected to add 187,705 square feet at a cost of \$102 million and raise the facilities level of service (LOS) to 0.46 square feet per capita. Given the current cost of construction and the available revenue, completion of all projects will not be achievable without additional funds.

Currently, LEP II consists of work on sixteen (16) new or existing libraries:

Four (4) new sites & buildings One (1) new main library and annex replacement Three (3) expansions

Eight (8) renovations

Construction of the first project began in the fourth quarter of 2005 with all work to be completed by December 2010. This LOS increase, although responsive, does not reach the Department's goal of providing library facilities which comply with the nationally accepted level of service of 0.6 square feet per capita as described in the County Comprehensive Plan, Library Services Element.

Construction cost estimates for LEP II projects have significantly exceeded construction budgets. Shortfalls in capital funding have been covered in part by transfers from higher than projected ad valorem revenues accruing to the operating budget. Background and Policy Issues (continued from page 1): The projects to be completed are those included in the original bond proposal with no additions to square footage other than those originally considered. The only project within the original LEP2 program that will be unable to be accommodated with available funds is a new Main Library. Projects that staff contemplated for addition to the LEP2 (an expanded Acreage Branch, and replacement of Belle Glade Library in lieu of renovation) will not be able to be added to the LEP2 with available funding. In addition, a community initiated request for a new branch library for the Canyons area of west Boynton Beach cannot be accommodated within LEP2 with available funds. Revenue assumptions are based on the expected action of the State Legislature (Senate version) with regard to property tax roll –back as of the date of this memo. Various scenarios are proposed for Board consideration.

Project Options:

Option 1 – no change to LEP II

Details: Library proceeds as originally planned. Requires additional funding for shortfall of \$44,117,062.

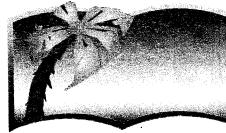
Option 2 – Deferral of Projects

Details: Defer construction of a new Main Library and limit renovation of the existing Main Library until funds are available. All other original projects will be completed with available funds.

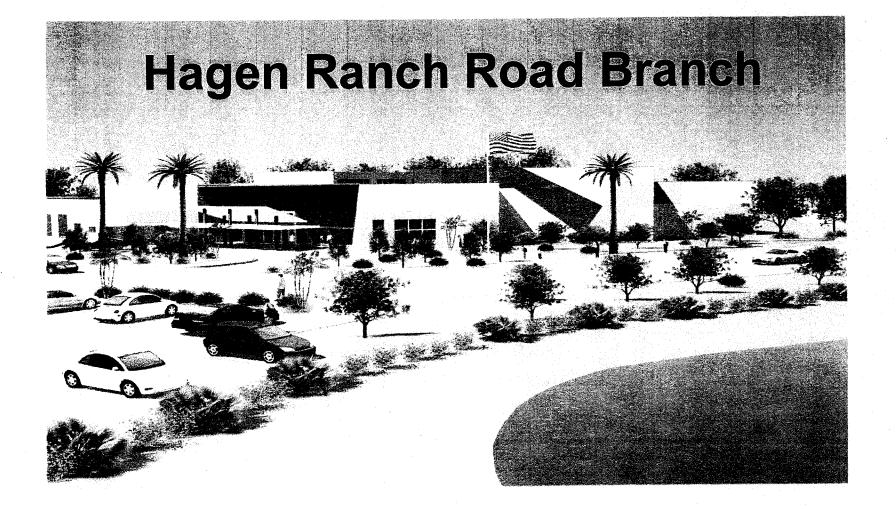


Palm Beach County Library System

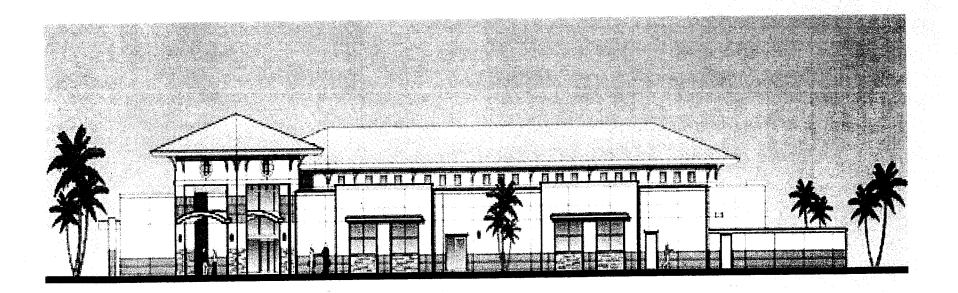
10 Year Capital Improvement Plan Library Expansion Program II

- Conform to the Standards of Florida Public Libraries by providing information technology equal to a minimum of \$1.00 per capita.



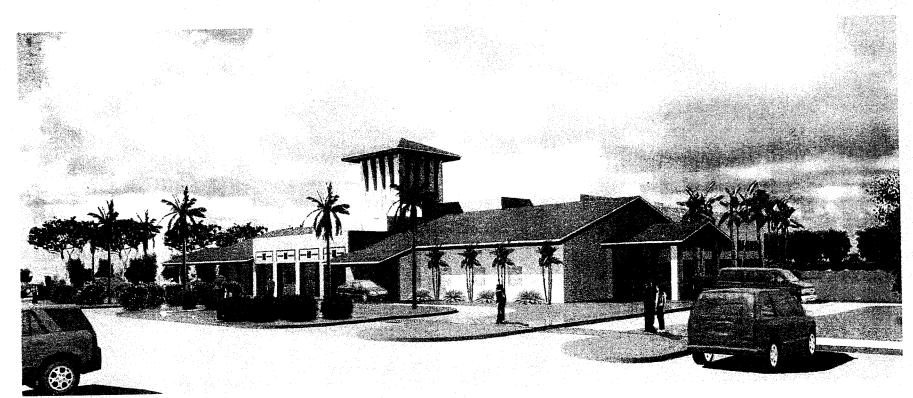

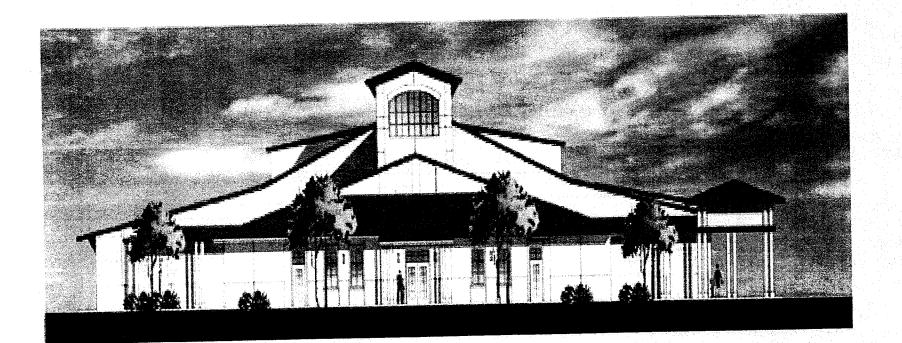

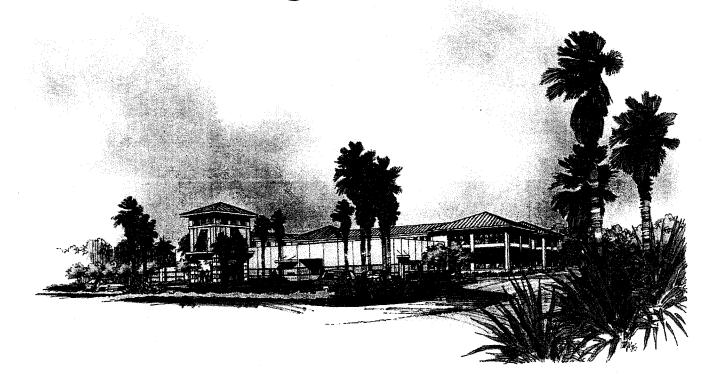

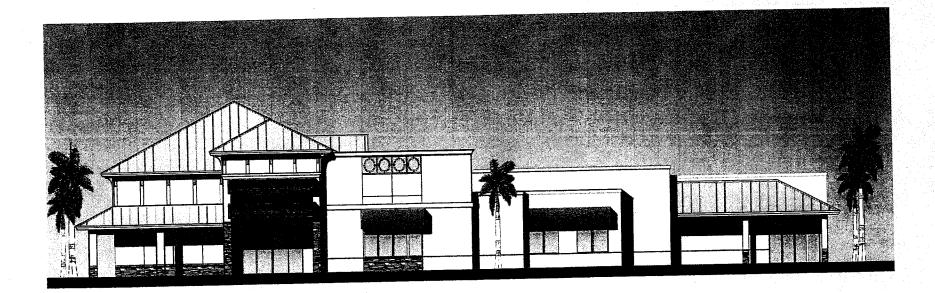

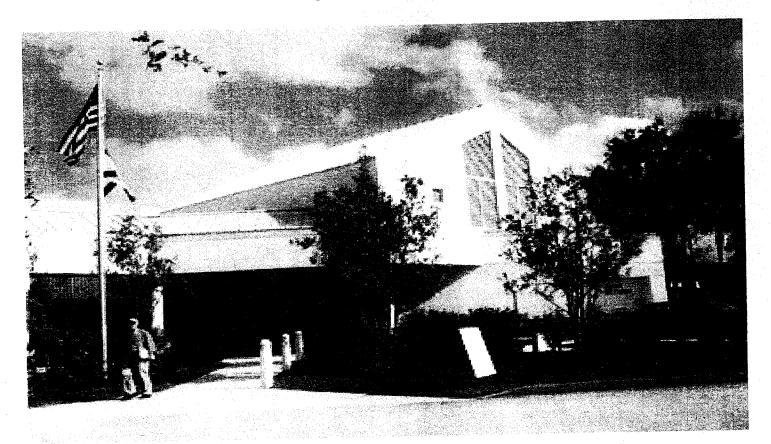
