I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF						
Motion and Title: Staff requests Board Direction: regarding a recent request by the Le Us Vote Committee to place a proposed amendment to the Palm Beach County Charter or the January, 2008 ballot.						
Summary: A political action committee, Let Us Vote, is gathering signatures to propose an amendment to Section 6.3 Home Rule of the Palm Beach County Charter, which would require both county and municipal voter approval for County Charter amendments that affect municipal powers or functions. Amendments to the Home Rule Charter may be initiated by citizen's petition, or proposed by the Board of County Commissioners by an affirmative vote of at least four (4) members, subject to approval by the voters of Palm Beach County in a referendum. Countywide (LB)						
Background and Policy Issues: Let Us Vote Political Committee requested the BCC to consider placing the County Charter Amendment on the ballot for the presidential primary election on January 29, 2008. The Let Us Vote Political Committee is gathering signatures to vote on amending the Palm Beach County Charter. The Amendment to Article 6, Section 3 of the Charter would require that a majority of voters of Palm Beach County and a majority of voters in each municipality voting in a referendum must approve any amendment to the Charter which transfers or limits a function, service, power or authority of any municipality in the County. At least twenty-seven Palm Beach County cities have passed resolutions endorsing this change. Amendments to the Home Rule Charter may be proposed by the Board of County Commissioners by an affirmative vote of at least four (4) members, subject to approval by the voters of Palm Beach County in a referendum. The Home Rule Charter amendment may also be initiated by seven (7) percent of the number of voters qualified to vote in the last general election.
