# I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

**Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:** Payment for services in a total amount not to exceed \$55,000 to the following providers:

- A. Easter Seals Florida, Inc. in an amount of \$45,000, for early intervention occupational, physical, and speech therapy services for fragile and disabled children ages 0 3.
- B. Quantum Foundation in an amount of \$10,000, for the Senior Flu Immunization Project administered through the Area Agency on Aging to approximately 2,000 seniors.

**Summary:** On July 13, 2006, and September 19, 2006, the Board of County Commissioners approved the list of agencies and funding allocations under the Financially Assisted Agency (FAA) Program and Other County Sponsored, including the above listed agencies. Both agencies provide services and bill the County for the agreed upon amount. <u>Districts 2 and 3</u> (TKF)

**Background and Justification:** In providing for human services needs, Palm Beach County augments its own services mix by providing financial assistance to community-based organizations. Agencies are funded under either the Other County Sponsored program or the Financially Assisted Agencies program. By funding these additional services, the County is assuring the community that it is addressing the many and varied needs of the residents of Palm Beach County.
