I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff request Board Direction: On increasing the FY2008 budget allocation for the Financially Assisted Agencies Program above the FY2007 funding level and the method of distribution of additional funding if provided.

Summary: At the July 11, 2007, budget workshop, the Board of County Commissioners reviewed the County Administrator's budget recommendation and agency allocations from staff for the Financially Assisted Agencies Program. The recommended funding amount of \$13,348,836 was unchanged from FY2007. At the workshop, staff was directed to review impacts to County-funded agencies from State budget cuts and return to the Board with options for distribution of additional funds if available. Staff has identified various options including an option for an across-the-board increase of 5% to all currently funded agencies that are performing in accordance with contract terms, and options that consider impacts to agency budgets associated with reduced State funding and staff-identified priority areas. A 5% increase in funding will increase the total FAA allocation by \$667,442. The options are presented in Attachment 1. Countywide (TKF)

Background and Justification: In providing for human services needs, Palm Beach County augments its own services mix by providing financial assistance to communitybased organizations. This program was established in the early 1980's to overcome the adverse impact of reduced federal funding. More recent federal and state funding reductions emphasize the need for continuing county financial assistance to these organizations. Funded organizations are monitored by the Community Services Department to maintain strict fiscal integrity.

Palm Beach County Department of Community Services Financially Assisted Agency Additional Funding Recommendations

Cover Page - Funding Options Descriptions

Staff is providing the following funding options in response to the direction given by the Board of County Commissioners. Pages 2 through 16 describe each option:

Funding Option #1 (pages 2 - 14)

Staff applied a 5% increase across all agencies. Total new allocation is \$667,442

Funding Option #2 (pages 2 - 14, summarized on page 15)

Staff applied 5% additional funds in areas that staff and community partners determined as priorities. Staff collaborated with community partners to determine the areas of highest need. Those areas include services provided to homelessness, developmental disability, self-sufficiency, HIV prevention, substance abuse and mental health. Total new allocation is \$660,660.

Funding Option #3 (pages 2 - 14, summarized on page 16)

Staff applied 5% additional funds to State of Florida reduced areas as well as other staff and community determined priorities. Staff collected information on State reductions in service dollars as well as anticipated reductions to be made in the fall. Currently Development Disabilities will undergo reductions based on a new tier system that will place more of their clients on waiting lists. Those waiting lists are already quite extensive. Due to the size of the reductions and lengths of waiting lists, staff determined this area was most impacted and therefore allocated funds accordingly. Mental Health and Substance Abuse will also undergo similar funding cuts due to the new Med-Waiver program. Services will be reduced and clients will be placed on waiting lists. Funding was also put into the priority areas as determined by staff and community partners. Total new allocation is \$660,660.
