I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Agreement with Museum of Lifestyle and Fashion History, Inc. for the period February 5, 2008, through November 1, 2008, in an amount not-to-exceed \$5,000 for funding of narrated bus tours of historic Delray Beach.

Summary: This funding is to help offset costs for narrated bus tours, including a children's mathematics infused bus tour of historic Delray Beach for the Museum of Lifestyle and Fashion History, Inc. Approximately 500 people participate in these bus tours and children's tours/programs annually. The Agreement allows for the reimbursement of eligible pre-Agreement expenses incurred subsequent to October 1, 2007. Funding is from the Recreation Assistance Program (RAP) District 4 Funds. <u>District 4</u> (AH)

Background and Justification: Museum of Lifestyle and Fashion History, Inc. (MLFH) is a not-forprofit history museum that offers retrospective and anthropology exhibits showcasing lifestyle, history, cultures, people, places, fashion trends, architecture, furnishings, locomotives and toys, and information about popular uses of artifacts by people/events over periods of time. MLFH provides narrated bus tours of historic Delray Beach on a regular basis. The tours include visits to historic districts and buildings, and information about the Seminole Native American, African American, Bahamian, German, and other white European settlers of Delray Beach. MLFH has also developed a narrated children's mathematics bus tour program, which combines a historic tour with a mathematics component to help children improve basic math comprehension and performance on the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT).

The total annual budget for the narrated bus tours is approximately \$34,000 for bus rental fees, activity workbook costs admission fees, volunteer and tour guide uniforms, regular narrated bus tour brochures, tickets, badges, flyer design and printing costs, supplies for children's tours, and other miscellaneous expenses. The \$5,000 provided from District 4 RAP funding will help offset a portion of the tour and program expenses. The Agreement has been executed on behalf of Museum of Lifestyle and Fashion History, Inc., and now needs to be approved by the Board of County Commissioners.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN PALM BEACH COUNTY AND MUSEUM OF LIFESTYLE AND FASHION HISTORY, INC. FOR DELRAY BEACH NARRATED BUS TOURS AND THE CHILDREN'S MATHEMATICS NARRATED BUS TOURS PROGRAM

THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into on _____, by and between Palm Beach County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "County", and Museum of Lifestyle and Fashion History, Inc., a Florida not-for-profit corporation authorized to do business in the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "MLFH".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, MLFH is a history museum that offers retrospective and anthropology exhibits showcasing lifestyle, history, cultures, people, places, fashion trends, architecture, furnishings, locomotives and toys, and information about popular uses of artifacts by people/events over periods of time; and

WHEREAS, MLFH provides narrated bus tours of historic Delray Beach, Florida, that include visits to historic districts and buildings and share information about the Seminole Native American, African American, Bahamian, German, and other white European settlers of Delray Beach (the "Tours"); and

WHEREAS, MLFH has also developed narrated a children's mathematics bus tours program ("Children's Tours"), which consists of historic bus tours with mathematics infused to help children improve basic math comprehension and performance on the FCAT; and

WHEREAS, the Tours and the Children's Tours cost approximately \$34,000 for bus rental fees, activity workbook costs, admission fees, volunteer and tour guide uniforms, regular narrated bus tour brochures, tickets, badges, flyer design, printing costs, supplies for Children's Tours, and other miscellaneous expenses; and

WHEREAS, approximately five hundred (500) children, youth, and students participate in the Tours and Children's Tours annually; and

WHEREAS, MLFH has requested that County provide \$5,000 to help offset costs for the Tours and Children's Tours and

WHEREAS, funding for MLFH for the Tours and Children's tours in an amount notto-exceed \$5,000 is available from The Recreation Assistance Program (RAP) – District 4; and

WHEREAS, historical, cultural, and educational programs serve a public benefit; and

WHEREAS, both parties desire to enter into this Agreement.

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the covenants and promises contained herein, the parties hereby agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. County agrees to fund an amount not-to-exceed \$5,000 to MLFH for the Tours and Children's Tours to help offset costs for bus rental fees, activity workbook costs, admission fees, volunteer and tour guide uniforms, regular narrated bus tour brochure, ticket, badges, and flyer design and printing costs, supplies for Children's Tours, and other miscellaneous expenses, as set forth in Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein, hereinafter referred to as the "Project".

2. County will use its best efforts to provide said funds to MLFH on a reimbursement basis within forty-five (45) days of receipt of the following information:

a. A written statement that the Project, as specified herein, was carried out in accordance with this Agreement; and

b. A Contract Payment Request Form and a Contractual Services Purchases Schedule Form attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit "B", which are required for each and every reimbursement requested by MLFH. Said information shall list each invoice paid by MLFH and shall include the vendor invoice number; invoice date; and the amount paid by MLFH along with the number and date of the respective check or proof of payment for said payment. MLFH shall attach a copy of each vendor invoice paid by MLFH along with a copy of the respective check or proof of payment and shall make reference thereof to the applicable item listed on the Contractual Services Purchases Schedule. Further, MLFH's Program Administrator and Project Financial Officer shall certify the total funds spent by MLFH on the Project and shall also certify that each vendor invoice, as listed on the Contractual Services Purchases Schedule was paid by MLFH and approved by MLFH as indicated.

3. MLFH incurred expenses for the Project beginning on October 1, 2007. Those costs incurred by MLFH for the Project, approved and submitted accordingly by MLFH subsequent to October 1, 2007, are eligible for reimbursement by County pursuant to the terms and conditions hereof.

4. RAP funds may be used as a match for other local, state, or federal grant programs, but MLFH may not submit reimbursement requests for the same expenses to the County as other fund sources to receive duplicate reimbursement for the same expenses.

5. MLFH warrants that it is an active not-for-profit corporation, duly chartered and registered with the Florida Department of State, Division of Corporations.

6. MLFH agrees, warrants, and represents that all of the employees and participants in the Project will be treated equally during employment, and for the provision of services without regard to residency, race, color, religion, disability, sex, age, national origin, ancestry, marital status, or sexual orientation.

7. MLFH shall be responsible for the cost of operation and maintenance of the Project, including all associated costs.

8. The term of this Agreement shall be until November1, 2008, commencing upon the date of execution by the parties hereto.

9. The parties agree that, in the event MLFH is in default of its obligations under this Agreement, the County shall provide MLFH thirty (30) days written notice to cure the default. In the event MLFH fails to cure the default within the thirty (30) day cure period, the County shall have no further obligation to honor reimbursement requests submitted by MLFH for the Project deemed to be in default and MLFH shall return any County RAP funds already collected by MLFH for that Project.

10. Notwithstanding any provision of this Agreement to the contrary, this Agreement may be terminated by the County, without cause, upon thirty (30) days prior written notice to the other party. This Agreement may be terminated by the County with cause, upon expiration of the thirty (30) day cure period provided for in Section 9 above.

11. MLFH shall complete the Project by August 1, 2008, and invoices and checks submitted for reimbursement must be dated within the project time frame of October 1, 2007, through August 1, 2008. MLFH shall provide its final reimbursement request(s), including a project completion statement and reimbursement documentation as indicated in Section 2 above on or before November 1, 2008. Upon written notification to County at least ninety (90) days prior to that date MLFH may request an extension beyond this period for the purpose of completing the Project. County shall not unreasonably deny MLFH's request for said extension.

12. In the event MLFH ceases to exist, or ceases or suspends the Project for any reason, any remaining unpaid portion of this Agreement shall be retained by County, and County shall have no further obligation to honor reimbursement requests submitted by MLFH. The determination that MLFH has ceased or suspended the Project shall be made by County and MLFH agrees to be bound by County's determination.

13. MLFH agrees to abide by, and be governed by, all applicable federal, state, county, and municipal laws, including but not limited to, Palm Beach County's ordinances, as said laws and ordinances exist and are amended from time to time. In entering into this Agreement, Palm Beach County does not waive the requirements of any County or local ordinance or the requirements of obtaining any permits or licenses normally required to conduct business or activity conducted by MLFH. Failure to comply may result in County's refusal to honor reimbursement requests for the Project.

14. County reserves the right to withhold reimbursement if the Project is not completed as specified in Exhibit "A".

15. It is understood and agreed that MLFH is merely a recipient of County funding and is an independent contractor and is not an agent, servant or employee of County or its Board of County Commissioners. It is further acknowledged that the County only contributes funding under this Agreement and operates no control over the Project. In the event a claim or lawsuit is brought against County or any of its officers, agents or employees, MLFH shall indemnify, save and hold harmless and defend the County, its officers, agents, and/or employees from and against any and all claims, liabilities, losses, judgments, and/or causes of action of any type arising out of or relating to any act or omission of MLFH, its agents, servants and/or employees in the performance of this Agreement. The foregoing indemnification shall survive termination of this Agreement.

In consideration for reimbursement of costs incurred prior to the term of this Agreement, the foregoing indemnification shall apply not only during the term of this Agreement but also for the period prior to this Agreement for which MLFH is eligible to receive reimbursement from the County.

16. MLFH shall, at its sole expense, agree to maintain in full force and effect at all times during the life of this Agreement, insurance coverages and limits (including endorsements), as described herein. MLFH shall agree to provide the County with at least ten (10) day prior notice of any cancellation, non-renewal or material change to the insurance coverages. The requirements contained herein, as well as County's review and acceptance of insurance maintained by MLFH are not intended to and shall not in any manner limit or qualify the liabilities and obligations assumed by MLFH under this Agreement.

Commercial General Liability. MLFH shall maintain Commercial General Liability at a limit of liability not less than \$500,000 Each Occurrence. Coverage shall not

contain any endorsement excluding Contractual Liability or Cross Liability unless granted in writing by County's Risk Management Department. MLFH shall provide this coverage on a primary basis.

Automobile. Should MLFH uses independent bus companies for transportation, it shall require such company or companies to provide automobile liability on such buses in the minimum amount of \$1,000,000 combined single limit bodily injury and property damage liability and shall include MLFH and Palm Beach County as Additional Insured.

Worker's Compensation Insurance & Employer's Liability. MLFH shall maintain Worker's Compensation & Employers Liability in accordance with Florida Statutes Chapter 440. MLFH shall provide this coverage on a primary basis.

Additional Insured. MLFH shall endorse the County as an Additional Insured with a CG 2026 Additional Insured - Designated Person or Organization endorsement, or its equivalent, to the Commercial General Liability. The Additional Insured endorsement shall read "Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners, a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida, its Officers, Employees and Agents." MLFH shall provide the Additional Insured endorsements coverage on a primary basis.

Waiver of Subrogation. MLFH hereby waives any and all rights of Subrogation against the County, its officers, employees and agents for each required policy.

When required by the insurer, or should a policy condition not permit an insured to enter into a pre-loss agreement to waive subrogation without an endorsement, then MLFH shall agree to notify the insurer and request the policy be endorsed with a Waiver of Transfer of Rights of Recovery Against Others, or its equivalent. This Waiver of Subrogation requirement shall not apply to any policy when a condition to the policy specifically prohibits such an endorsement, or voids coverage should MLFH enter into such an agreement on a pre-loss basis.

Certificate(s) of Insurance. Prior to execution of this Agreement by the County, MLFH shall deliver to the County a Certificate(s) of coverage evidencing that all types and amounts of insurance coverages required by this Agreement have been obtained and are in full force and effect. Such Certificate(s) of Insurance shall include a minimum ten (10) day endeavor to notify due to cancellation or nonrenewal of coverage. Certificate holder's address shall read Palm Beach County,

c/o Parks and Recreation Department, 2700 Sixth Avenue South, Lake Worth, FL 33461, Attention: Administrative Support Manager.

Right to Review. County, by and through its Risk Management Department, in cooperation with the contracting/monitoring department, reserves the right to review, modify, reject or accept any required policies of insurance, including limits, coverages, or endorsements, herein from time to time throughout the term of this Agreement. County reserves the right, but not the obligation, to review and reject any insurer providing coverage because of its poor financial condition or failure to operate legally.

17. Upon request by County, MLFH shall demonstrate financial accountability through the submission of acceptable financial audits performed by an independent auditor.

18. MLFH shall maintain books, records, documents and other evidence that sufficiently and properly reflect all costs of any nature expended in the performance of this Agreement for a period of not less than five (5) years. Upon advance notice to MLFH, County shall have the right to inspect and audit said books, records, documents and other evidence during normal business hours.

19. The County and MLFH may pursue any and all actions available under law to enforce this Agreement including, but not limited to, actions arising from the breach of any provision set forth herein.

20. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Florida and any and all legal action necessary to enforce this Agreement shall be held in Palm Beach County.

21. As provided in Section 287.132-133, Florida Statutes, by entering into this Agreement or performing any work in furtherance hereof, MLFH certifies that it, its affiliates, suppliers, subcontractors and consultants who will perform hereunder, have not been placed on the convicted vendor list maintained by the State of Florida Department of Management Services within the thirty six (36) months immediately preceding the date hereof. This notice is required by Section 287.133 (3) (a), Florida Statutes.

22. This Agreement represents the entire agreement between the parties and supersedes all other negotiations, representations, or agreement, written or oral, relating to this Agreement. This Agreement may be modified and amended only by written instrument executed by the parties hereto.

23. Any notice given pursuant to the terms of this Agreement shall be in writing and hand delivered or sent by U.S. mail. All notices shall be addressed to the following:

24. This Agreement is made solely and specifically among and for the benefit of the parties hereto, and no other person shall have any rights, interest, or claims hereunder or be entitled to any benefits under or on account of this Agreement as a third-party beneficiary or otherwise.

PROJECT INFORMATION

1. Name of Project: Delray Beach Narrated Bus Tours and the Children's Mathematics 2. Project Description Narrated Bus Tours Program

General (Project Scope), Public Purpose

The Narrated Bus Tours of Historic Delray Beach, Florida were created by the Museum of Lifestyle & Fashion History and are currently conducted by the Museum on the 4th Saturday of each month, year-round (3rd Saturday in November & December due to the holidays). The tours are a 1 hour & 45 minutes excursion and include visits to historic districts, historic buildings and include information about the Seminole Native American, African American, Bahamian, German and other White European settlers to Delray Beach, FL. In addition to local history and the origin of Palm Beach County, the history of the State of Florida is also included in the narration during the tour with information about the arrival of Spaniards in the 1500s as well as the migration of runaway African slaves and Creek Native American slaves who came to Florida together from the late 1600s to 1800s.

These bus tours provide a public purpose and fulfill the Museum's mission of presenting programs about historic architecture. This program promotes historic preservation; and ensures the publics engagement and awareness of historic landmarks in the City of Delray Beach. The reason these tours are historic preservation tours is because the travel route of the bus tour is complimented with a guided narration to more than 5 historic areas and neighborhoods in Delray Beach such as Baker's Row, Downtown Delray Beach and Pineapple Grove Art Work and also historic Bahamian and African American areas like Frog Alley and the West Settlers Neighborhood. Within these historic districts and neighborhoods, the tours visit, on an alternating schedule, 10 historic sites.

The Narrated Bus Tours have allowed the public to access landmark neighborhoods and buildings of which they may not have been aware if it were not for these public tours. Because of the public awareness, there is increased support for the historic preservation of certain neighborhoods and buildings. One such example is the former Pricilla Hotel located in the Frog Alley Neighborhood. The Pricilla Hotel was the 2nd black owned hotel built in Delray Beach that opened in 1951. It is located in the

historically African American neighborhood of Frog Alley. This hotel was built by Bahamian settlers to Delray Beach who were the late Chris and Pearl Pricilla Johnson. Mr. Johnson was a builder from the Bahamas. The architecture of the Pricilla is a reflection of building designs found in his native home of Andros Island in the Bahamas. During the era of legal segregation and Jim Crow, the Pricilla provided hotel lodging in Delray Beach for Black travelers who were usually employed as maids, butlers, chauffeurs by the White tourists who would spend the Winter season in Delray Beach. Prior the start of the Museum's tours in 2004, the building had sat old and dilapidated for many years. When the Museum organized the tours in 2004, we partnered with the new owners of the hotel building which is a Bahamian church, located adjacent the hotel, called the Church of God Resurrection Life Fellowship. The partnership was a relationship where the church was encouraged to begin efforts to preserve the building because that hotel would be featured on the tour. As a result of these tours, there is renewed interest and enthusiasm for the preservation of the building and for it to not be demolished. And, since 2004, parishioners of the church make on-going efforts to rehab and preserve the hotel which they use a community room and for exhibits about their Bahamian heritage. Plus, prior to the tours, passengers on the bus tour were not familiar with Delray's vibrant Caribbean heritage and the economic prowess and enterprise of Blacks during segregation. The Museum of Lifestyle & Fashion History is trying to secure funding for the purpose having a historic marker designed for the site of the hotel as well as help with the continuous preservation of the building and its access to the public.

Delray also has German history too because many of the pioneer farmers who came to Delray Beach in the 1890s were Germans from Michigan. The 1904 Trinity Lutheran Church in Delray Beach was built by those German settlers and that building is visited as a part of the tour. The 1904 Trinity Lutheran Church building is another example of historic preservation because it was recently rehabbed to its original style. All of the 10 historic sites of the tour are proper examples of cultural heritage preservation and promotion. The following are the historic sites of the tour:

1926 Colony Hotel

1936 Sandoway House

1951 Pricilla Hotel (established by Bahamians)

1896 Greater Mt. Olive Baptist Church

1897 St. Paul AME Church

1903 Cason Methodist Church

1904 (July) Trinity Lutheran Church (established by Germans)

1904 (August) St. Paul 's Episcopal Church

1911 St. Matthew's Episcopal Church (established by Bahamians)

1924 First Presbyterian Church

The historic churches that are featured as a part of the tour served as important community centers during the settlement of Delray Beach. As a result, 2 Jewish synagogues were started in 2 of the historic churches featured on the tour. Many years ago Jews used church buildings in Delray Beach for their Jewish religious services.

As a part of the bus tour program and efforts to teach to children Historic Preservation, the Museum of Lifestyle & Fashion History has created a **Children's Mathematics Narrated Bus Tours of Historic Delray Beach** which is a historic Preservation tour with mathematics infused. The program is very entertaining, yet educational and a cultural experience in historic landmarks and social studies which creatively incorporate mathematical concepts such as symbols, shapes, angles, quantities and

interrelationships of quantities. This program creates a unique and interactive experience for students which allow them to discover historic landmarks and understand the importance of historic preservation by connecting it to mathematics. It is important to offer field trips for students that are interactive and hands-on. The mathematics component provides students with a challenging experience that is connected to their awareness of historic landmarks and why they should be preserved. There are numerous Mathematics teaching opportunities in the architectural designs of various historic buildings, streets, sidewalks and neighborhood areas that are along the route as well as in the history narrative of the Museum's hugely popular bus tours of Historic Delray Beach. The Mathematics component of the tours was developed using guidelines of the FCAT (Florida Comprehensive Assessment Test) with the goal of helping students improve their basic math comprehension and performance on the FCAT. These tours have been designed especially for grades Pre-K thru 6th grade. Each tour's narrative and mathematics components are adjusted to the particular grade level of the students. These tours are currently offered and available year-round as a field trip program for school groups. The children's tour is 1-hour and consists of visits to historic sites and districts such as the 1926 Colony Hotel, Downtown Delray Beach, and the Pricilla Hotel that is located in the historic Frog Alley Neighborhood. The Pricilla hotel is a featured building on the math tour because of its history. Also, its unique architectural design has created many opportunities for exciting mathematical activities that relate to the geometric shapes found on the building. Also Highlighted in the Frog Alley district is the newly designed sidewalk/streetscape by Miami artist Gary Moore. Many early settlers to Delray Beach were Bahamian and many lived in the Frog Alley section of town.

This innovative history bus tour program was introduced last year in September 2006 with a Workshop hosted by the Museum for Math teachers from Palm Beach County public schools that have been designated AAA schools. These Math professors are designated as "Math Coaches" by the Palm Beach County School District. The math teachers provided invaluable feedback regarding the development of the math curriculum component for these Museum tours. The Museum hosted a 2nd workshop in September 2007 as a follow-up and review of the progress of the program. Again, the math teachers provided important recommendations for the continuous development of this unique curriculum.
