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ORDINANCE NO. 08-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING SCHEDULE "A" AND SCHEDULE "A-1" OF CHAPTER 8.5, ARTICLE II, PALM BEACH COUNTY CODE (KNOWN AS THE "CODE ENFORCEMENT CITATION ORDINANCE OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA"); TO UPDATE CERTAIN CODE REFERENCES; PROVIDING FOR AN INCREASE IN FINES; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL **LAWS** IN CONFLICT; **PROVIDING** SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR A SAVINGS CLAUSE: AND PROVIDING EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Section 162.21, Florida Statutes, authorizes local governments to establish a civil citation system for the enforcement of codes and ordinances; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 8.5, Article II, of the Palm Beach County Code (known as the "Code Enforcement Citation Ordinance of Palm Beach County, Florida") establishes a civil citation system for the enforcement of codes and ordinances and authorizes the assessment of civil penalties as specified in Schedule "A" thereof; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to amend said Schedule "A" to update certain code references, as set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desires to amend Schedule "A
1" to provide for a Class V fine; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined that the revisions to Schedule "A" and Schedule "A-1" set forth herein will promote, protect and improve the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Palm Beach County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1. AMENDMENTS TO SCHEDULE "A":

Schedule "A" of Chapter 8.5, Article II, Palm Beach County Code, is hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit 1.

Section 2. AMENDMENTS TO SCHEDULE A-1

Schedule "A-1" of Chapter 8.5, Article II, Palm Beach County Code, is hereby amended as set forth in Exhibit 2.

Section 3. REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT:

All local laws and ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. SEVERABILITY:

If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any reason held by the Court to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

Section 5. INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES:

The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Code of Laws and Ordinances of Palm Beach County, Florida. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section", "article", or other appropriate word.

Section 6. Savings Clause

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, all provisions of Chapter 8.5, Article II of the Palm Beach County Code, codifying Ordinance No. 06-011, as amended, are specifically preserved and remain in full force and effect for the limited purpose of enforcing any alleged violations of said Code which occurred prior to enactment of this Ordinance.

Section 7. EFFECTIVE DATE:

The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective upon filing with the Department of State.
