I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a First Amendment to the agreement (R2003-1964) with the City of Coral Springs (City), allowing for interoperable communications through the countywide common groups of the County's 800 MHz Radio System.

Summary: The Agreement with the City, which provides the terms and conditions under which the City can program into its radios and utilize the countywide common talk groups for certain types of inter-agency communications will expire on December 2, 2008. The agreement provides for three (3) - five (5) year renewals but renewals require approval by both parties. The City has approved a renewal to extend the term of the agreement until December 2, 2013. The renewal now requires Board approval. The terms of the agreement are standard and have been offered to all municipalities and local branches of federal agencies with 800 MHz trunked radio capabilities. There are no charges associated with this agreement. The City is required to pay all costs associated with subscriber units and to comply with the established operating procedures for the System. The Agreement may be terminated by either party, with or without cause. (FDO/ESS) Countywide (JM)

Background and Justification: The Agreement with the City, which provides the terms and conditions under which the City can program into its radios and utilize the countywide common talk groups for certain types of inter-agency communications, is set to expire on December 2, 2008.
