**Summary:** This fully executed Request for Funding Form is for School Board RAP allocations made in accordance with the Interlocal Agreement for the funding of RAP Projects (R2003-1747), as amended. Funding is from the Recreation Assistance Program (RAP) District 6 Funds. <u>District 6</u> (AH)

Background and Justification: The Interlocal Agreement for the Funding of RAP Projects (R2003-1747), as amended, was adopted by the Board to streamline the RAP process. Objective 1 - Students will enhance their knowledge of reading, math and science concepts.

Activity #1 - Students will enroll in small group tutorials

Activity #2 - Students will extend their critical thinking and vocabulary through participation in Sunshine Reader and Accelerated Reader programs.

Objective 2 - Students in grades 6-8 will increase their physical fitness by 10%.

Activity #1 - Students will enroll in weekly after school and weekend activities such as walking, clubs, marathons and intramurals.

Objective 3 - Students will engage in cultural activities to build knowledge, self-esteem and understanding of the contributions of diversity.
