RESOLUTION NO. R-2008-

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, EXPRESSING **CONCERNS OVER** THE LARGE POPULATION OF GREEN IGUANAS IN THE COUNTY AND REQUESTING THAT THE **FISH** AND WILDLIFE CONSERVATION COMMISSION ENACT REGULATIONS **GOVERNING** POSSESSION, **DISTRUBUTION** AND RELEASE OF GREEN IGUANAS WITHIN STATE; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County has become home to a large population of green iguanas, as have other counties in the region, with said population rapidly expanding; and

WHEREAS, green iguanas are an invasive species in Florida; and

WHEREAS, the large population of free roaming green iguanas in South Florida is largely the result of the pet trade and owners who have released or allowed the green iguanas to escape; and

WHEREAS, free roaming green iguanas often destroy gardens and landscaping and sometimes eat native endangered plants and plants that are the primary food source for endangered animals; and

WHEREAS, free roaming green iguanas pose a danger to the Florida Burrowing Owl, a species of special concern found in Palm Beach County, by overtaking the owls' burrows; and

WHEREAS, free roaming green iguanas dig burrows that undermine sidewalks, foundations, and seawalls, which may lead to the erosion and eventual collapse of seawalls; and

WHEREAS, green iguanas are large powerful animals with sharp teeth and claws that may pose a danger to people and pets; and

WHEREAS, the large numbers of free roaming green iguanas in Palm Beach County have caused damage to property and created sanitary nuisances within the County; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Constitution vests the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission with the authority and responsibility to regulate wild animal life such as the green iguana; and

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County, therefore, has limited authority to control the possession, distribution, release and propagation of green iguanas within its borders.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, THAT:

1. The Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County wishes to express their concerns to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission regarding the widespread population of green iguanas within the county and the region and requests that the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission designate iguanas as "Reptiles of Concern" under the Florida Administrative Code or enact appropriate rules and regulations designed to control the possession, distribution, release and propagation of iguanas throughout the state.
