The National Institute of Justice (NLJ) awarded the PBSO an additional \$182,330 (R2006-1503) for the "Solving Cold Cases with DNA Program", increasing the total award for the program to \$374,761. The objective of this grant is to combine the efforts of the PBSO Special Investigations Bureau, Crimes Against Children/Sexual Assault Unit and the Violent Crimes Bureau with the experience of the Serology/DNA Section of the Crime Laboratory to solve Cold Cases. The goal of this proposal is to screen all of the Cold Cases for potential biological evidence for the purpose of conducting DNA analysis such that the laboratory CODIS (Combined DNA Index System) administrator will enter any qualifying DNA profile into CODIS. It is estimated that there are approximately 250 Cold Cases from the Crimes Against Children/Sexual Assault Unit and Violent Crimes Bureaus, of which 85 may meet the criteria set forth by this grant. The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has been permitted to spend \$192,431 for the specified activities which are separate and distinct from the activities that require review pursuant to the National Environmental Protection Agency (NEPA). The additional NEPA restricted funds in the amount of \$182,330, which were under review, have been made available for spending. However, due to the delay in approval of our required FONSI EA (Finding of No Significant Impact, Environmental Assessments), we are requesting a no-cost 6 month extension. There is no grant match required, nor are any County funds required in FY 2007. Countywide (DW)
