Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve a budget transfer in the amount of \$126,000 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO) for community program donations.

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2009 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The current State LETF balance is \$1,276,415. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$1,150,415. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. No new positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. <u>Countywide</u> (DW)

Background and Justification: The Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office has a long-standing commitment to the reduction of crime and implementation of crime and drug prevention programs within Palm Beach County. Use of LETF requires approval by the Board in accordance with F.S. 932.7055, upon request of the Sheriff. This Statute requires that no less than 15 % of the last fiscal year's revenues be donated or expended for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood or school resource officer programs. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055.

As a member of the Substance Abuse Coalition of Palm Beach County, the Homeless Coalition of Palm Beach County, the Palm Beach County Continuum of Care, as well as a Palm Beach County HOT Team Provider, and affiliate of the Palm Beach Treasure Coast 211, PBRC is constantly striving to help individuals suffering from substance abuse related disorders and homelessness to become productive members of society once again. With a 30-day-program, PBRC takes individuals at rock-bottom and provides a path to mental and physical health, permanent housing, sobriety and employment. Based upon the Dade County Homeless modality, a successful completion of a program such as PBRC's would entail individuals remaining sober and moving on to a better situation. With this in mind, PBRC is committed to achieving at least an 80% success rate at the GW House. With a potential for 18 people a month, at full capacity PBRC could provide services for 216 people a year. With an 80% success rate, this means the GW House would assist 173 Palm Beach County residents each year to become healthy, happy, productive, employed, lawabiding, high-functioning individuals in our community once again.

- 3. **Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded**: Take Stock in Children provides a comprehensive service array that helps children at or near the poverty level to stay in school, stay out of trouble and succeed in life. Services provided through the program include:

Case Management: Case managers visit with the student at least twice per semester helping to support success, suggest aids for challenges, discuss academic issues, and verify mentor involvement. They also monitor attendance and behavior on a regular basis and review grades each marking period through the school districts computer system. 

The local Homeless Coalition accomplishes its purpose through advocacy, education, collaboration, and leadership.
- 3. Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded: Project Launch will build capacity and leverage existing resources within the community to implement a vital plan, that being the Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness in Palm Beach County. AmeriCorps VISTA members will assist through the creation of new programming and expansion of existing programming to address the growing needs within the community of the rising numbers of homeless. The VISTA members will assist the Homeless Coalition's efforts to mobilize resources to permanently expand the capacity of our community to solve its homeless problem. Each VISTA member will be provided with an "assignment" description that describes the capacity building activities the member is responsible for completing. There will be strong links between the Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness in Palm Beach County's action steps and the VISTA members' assignments. VISTA members will engage in activities to raise public awareness, develop initiatives to create databases of affordable housing, create assertive street outreach to target the "hard to

reach" street homeless, identify employers who are willing to hire and train this population, and identify best practice/evidence-based solutions for preventing homelessness. Project activities will also include collaboration with the newly formed Speaker's Bureau, known as Story Tellers.

4. What results are you committed to achieving? <u>One of the primary outcomes for Project</u> <u>Launch is to create a local response to homelessness that encourages and supports collaboration</u> for the identification of solutions; thus building capacity and leveraging existing resources. Palm <u>Beach County has a high incidence of senseless acts of violence targeted at homeless individuals,</u> as Florida continues to be recognized as the "meanest" state towards homeless people now for three consecutive years. In Palm Beach County, we have realized an increase in violent crime, including murder of the homeless in our community over the last few years. Communities with high incidences of violence towards the homeless will be an initial target area for increased outreach and services.

Project Launch will prioritize action steps outlined in the Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness in Palm Beach County. We will develop an inventory of all local resources for the homeless, including, but not limited to, food assistance, clothing, emergency shelter, extremely low cost housing, emergency medical care, counseling, training, and employment. Project Launch will provide VISTA members to collectively survey problems areas of the community and inform The Homeless Coalition and law enforcement agencies about improvements that can be made to improve public safety through additional homeless outreach. These outreach efforts will identify homeless people in the area; with the intent to assist homeless people to accept assistance by taking services to the homeless; thus decreasing arrests of the homeless.

The Homeless Coalition of Palm Beach County, Inc. will ultimately supervise the VISTA members, providing training and ongoing support through the expertise of a Project Manager. The Project Manager will also serve as a liaison with service providers and law enforcement agencies. The Homeless Coalition of Palm Beach County, Inc. will develop and maintain memorandums of understanding with participating service providers and the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office for this Project. Both the National Coalition for the Homeless and the State of Florida Office on Homelessness are in support of The Homeless Coalition's Project Launch to assist in the implementation of the Ten Year Plan to End Homelessness in Palm Beach County. Project Launch is positioned for success, with the involvement of The Homeless Coalition's newly formed Speaker's Bureau, known as Story Tellers. Story Tellers represent the formerly homeless population and can serve as peers in outreach efforts. This approach is a unique and necessary method for engaging


