1. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: amendment 001 to grant agreement R2008-1814 with ARC of Palm Beach County to replace the phrase "to install a ramp with handrails" with "to cover a portion of the costs for the conversion of an existing restroom to meet/ADA standards."

Summary: The Board of County Commissioners approved this grant on October 21, 2008 (R2008-1814) with the ARC of Palm Beach County. Due to a scriveners error, the grant, as approved, stated that the funds were to be used to "install a ramp with handrails". This amendment correctly states that the funds are to be used to "cover a portion of the costs for the conversion of an existing restroom to meet ADA standards." The funds for this grant are derived from funds collected from parking violations in designated parking spaces. County Ordinance 92-29 provides that revenue from these fines shall be used to improve accessibility and equal opportunity to qualified physically disabled persons in the County and to provide funds to conduct public awareness programs concerning physically disabled persons. (Countywide) (TKF)

Background and Justification: On October 20, 1992, the Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance 92-29, known as the Palm Beach County Physically Disabled Parking Ordinance. Section 3A-1 of this Ordinance provides that two-thirds of the fines collected for parking in designated disabled parking spaces shall be used to provide accessibility and equal opportunity to qualified physically disabled persons in the County, and to provide funds to conduct public awareness programs concerning physically disabled persons. On November 1, 1988, the BCC adopted Resolution No. R88-1929 which created the Office of Equal Opportunity Handicapped Accessibility and Grant Review Committee. This Committee reviewed proposals submitted by non-profit organizations in conformance with the Ordinance and established program guidelines. The grant Review Committee and the Office of Equal Opportunity concur on the funding recommendations and funding amount.

AMENDMENT 001 TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN PALM BEACH COUNTY AND THE ARC OF PALM BEACH COUNTY

Amendment 001 entered into this <u>22</u> day of <u>January</u> 2008, by and between Palm Beach County and the ARC of Palm Beach County.

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County entered into an Agreement (R2008-1814) with the ARC of Palm Beach County, on the 21st day of October, 2008, to provide funds not to exceed \$5,000 from the fines collected under the disabled parking ordinance to be used to improve accessibility and to conduct public awareness programs concerning physically disabled persons; and

WHEREAS, the agreement of October 21, 2008 erroneously stated that the grant funds were to be used to "install a ramp with handrails", and

WHEREAS, the ARC of Palm Beach County's application was submitted for the purpose of "covering a portion of the costs for the conversion of an existing restroom to meet ADA standards", and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to modify the Agreement to correctly reflect the original intent of both the County and ARC, and

WHEREAS, both parties mutually agree that the original Agreement entered into on October 21, 2008, is hereby amended as follows:

Obligations of the Agency:

Delete the phrase "to install a ramp with handrails" and replace them with the following: "to cover a portion of the costs for the conversion of an existing restroom to meet ADA standards."

NOW THEREFORE, all items in the previous Agreement in conflict with this Amendment shall be and are hereby changed to conform to this Amendment.

All provisions not in conflict with this aforementioned Amendment are still in effect and shall be performed at the same level as specified in the Agreement.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN PALM BEACH COUNTY AND OCT 2 1 2008 THE ARC OF PALM BEACH COUNTY

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into by and between PALM BEACH COUNTY a political sub division of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY" and The Arc hereinafter referred to as "AGENCY" in consideration of the mutual promises contained herein on the 21th day of October, 2008.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County enacted the Physically Disabled Parking Ordinance (Palm Beach County Code Sec.19-71-19-71) in accordance with Florida Statutes 316.1955, 316.1956, 315.1957 and 316.008(4) which specifically authorize counties to legislate in the field of providing parking spaces for certain disabled persons; and

WHEREAS, TWO-THIRDS of the sums collected as fines pursuant to said ordinance, are to be used to improve accessibility and equal opportunity to qualified physically disabled persons in the "County" and to provide funds to conduct public awareness programs in the "County" concerning physically disabled persons; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Palm Beach County's Office of Equal Opportunity is the designated compliance official charged with the responsibility of implementing and monitoring programs to improve accessibility to persons in the "County" and to conduct public awareness programs in the "County" concerning physically disabled persons; and

WHEREAS, The Arc desires to promote accessibility /awareness in accordance with Palm Beach County Code.

NOW THEREFORE in consideration of these promises and covenants herein contained, the parties intending to be legally bound hereby agree that:

 The foregoing recitations are true and correct.

ARTICLE I

DEFINITION AND PURPOSE

- 1.1 DEFINITIONS
 - (1) "County" means Palm Beach County
 - (2) "OEO" means Palm Beach County Office of Equal Opportunity
 - (3) "Agency" means THE ARC
 - (4) "RFP" means the County's request for grant applications
 - (5) "Award Funds" means monies collected as fines pursuant to the Palm Beach County Code.

1.2 PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to state the terms under which the "County" will provide funds, in accordance with the Palm Beach County "Code", to <u>The Arc</u> to improve accessibility and opportunity to qualified physically disabled persons in the "County."

ARTICLE II

OBLIGATIONS OF AGENCY

2.1 "Agency's" responsibility is to install a ramp with handrails as specified in Request for Grant Applications, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit "1" and "Agency's" application to Palm Beach County attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit "2". This agreement and Exhibit "1" shall

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1. The foregoing recitations are true and correct.

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2.1 "Agency's" responsibility is to cover a portion of costs for the conversion of an existing restroom to meet ADA standards as specified in Request for Grant Applications, attached hereto and incorporated by reference as Exhibit "1" and "Agency's" application to Palm Beach County attached hereto and incorporated by

reference as Exhibit "2". This agreement and Exhibit "1" shall control over Exhibit "2" in interpretations in a case of conflict.

- A. Agency acknowledges that the award of funds under this Agreement prohibits Agency from submitting any additional requests for the use of additional award funds during the same fiscal year.

 B. Agency agrees that funds will not be used for administrative or staff salaries, employee benefits or any indirect service costs.
- 2.3 Agency will use the funds only for the project described on the Agency's application.
- 2.4 Agency will allow the County or the County's designated representative to inspect and/or monitor records, receipts and the like for equipment and services provided through the use of award funds.
- 2.5 The Agency shall indemnify and save harmless and defend the County, its agents, servants, and employees from and against any and all claims, liability, loses, and/or cause of action which may rise from any negligent act or omission of the agency, its agents, servants, or employees in the performance of this Agreement. The Agency further agrees to indemnify, save harmless and defend the County, its agents, servants, and employees from and against any claim,

demand or cause of action of whatsoever kind of nature arising out of any conduct or misconduct of the Agency not included in the paragraph above and for which the County, its agents, servants or employees are alleged to be liable. The agency also agrees that funds made available pursuant to this Agreement shall not be used by the Agency for the purpose of initiating or pursuing litigation against the County.

- 2.6 Agency shall be an independent contractor and not an employee of Palm Beach County. The Agency further represents that it has, or will secure at its own expense, all necessary personnel required to perform the services under this Agreement, and that they shall be fully qualified and if required authorized, permitted and/or licensed under State and local law to perform such services. Such personnel shall not be employees of, or have any contractual relations with the County.
- 2.7 The Agency warrants and represents that all of its employees, and participants in the program it serves, are treated equally during employment and/or services without regard to race, color, religion, sex, age, marital status, sexual orientation, national origin, ancestry or disability.
- 2.8 Agency agrees to submit quarterly written reports to OEO in such form and manner as directed by OEO.
- 2.9 Agency agrees that any equipment purchased

with grants funds awarded pursuant to this agreement shall remain in Palm Beach County for a minimum of five years.

ARTICLE III

AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS

3.1 The County grants" to the Agency, an amount not to exceed \$5,000. Payment will be made only on a reimbursement basis for costs actually incurred by the Agency, after submittal of invoice, with copies of canceled checks and such documentation as the County may require to verify that the project has been properly performed. Invoices should be submitted with a cover letter indicating total amount for reimbursement signed by an authorized official.

ARTICLE IV

OBLIGATIONS OF THE COUNTY

Agreement are contingent upon the availability of funds lawfully appropriated for the purposes stated in the Palm Beach County Code. The Agency shall not pledge the "County's" credit or make guarantee or payments or surety for any contact debt, obligation, judgment, lien, or any form of indebtedness.

ARTICLE V

TERMS OF AGREEMENT

5.1 This Agreement shall commence upon execution by the "County" and shall terminate on September 30, 2009. Either party may terminate the contract by giving the other party fifteen (15) days written notice. The "County" has the right to audit financial records and monitor contracted program.

ARTICLE VI

PUBLIC ENTITY CRIMES

by entering into this Agreement or performing any work in furtherance hereof, the Agency certifies that its affiliates, suppliers, subcontractors and consultants who will perform hereunder, have not been placed on the convicted vendor list maintained by the State of Florida Department of Management Services within 36 months immediately preceding the date hereof. This Notice is required by Florida Statue 287.133(3)(a).

ARTICLE VII INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

6.2 GRANTEE shall, on a primary basis and its sole expense, agree to maintain at all times during the life of this Agreement, insurance coverages, limits, Including endorsement, as described herein. The requirements contained herein as well as

COUNTY'S review or acceptance of self insurance maintained by GRANTEE are not intended to and shall not in any manner limit or qualify the liabilities and obligations assumed by GRANTEE under the Agreement.

- A. Commercial General Liability GRANTEE shall agree to maintain Commercial General Liability at a limit of liability not less than \$500,000 per occurrence. Coverage shall not contain any endorsement excluding Contractual Liability or Cross Liability unless granted by County's Risk Management.
- B. Worker's Compensation Insurance & Employers Liability GRANTEE shall agree to maintain Worker's Compensation Insurance & Employers Liability in accordance with Florida Statute Chapter 440.
- C. Additional Insured GRANTEE shall agree to endorse the COUNTY as an Additional Insured with a CG2060 Additional Insured-Designated Person or organization endorsement, or equivalent, to the Commercial General Liability. The Additional Insured shall read Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners.
- D. Certificate(s) of insurance. Immediately following notification of the award of this Agreement, GRANTEE shall agree to

deliver COUNTY a Certificate(s) of insurance evidencing that all types and amounts of insurance coverages required by this Agreement have been obtained and are in full force and effect. The certificates(s) of insurance shall include a minimum thirty (30) day endeavor to notify due to cancellation or non-renewal of coverage. Certificate holder shall be Palm Beach County, Office of Equal Opportunity 215 North Olive Avenue Suite 130 West Palm Beach Florida 33401.

E. Right to Review COUNTY, by and through its Risk Management Department, in cooperation with the Office Of Equal Opportunity, reserves the right to review, modify, reject or accept any required policies of insurance, including limits, coverages or endorsements, herein from time to time throughout the life of this Agreement. COUNTY reserves the right, but not the obligation, to view and reject any insurer providing coverage because of its poor financial condition of failure to operating legally.

Brief Background of The Arc of Palm Beach County

For fifty years, since 1958, The Arc has been a leader in advocacy, education and service to children and adults in Palm Beach County with developmental disabilities and their families. We offer a continuum of care from birth to the end of life that recognizes the importance of helping people to reach their fullest possible potential and of meeting the diverse needs of people with varying disabilities to make our County a Community for All.

The Arc offers 13 programs in 9 locations throughout the County, from Tequesta in the north to Boca Raton in the south and west to 20-Mile Bend. Services for Children & Families include Disability Prevention Services, Out-of-School Time Programs, Outreach and Respite Services for families, and Potentials Charter School offering an integrated therapeutic educational program for children ages 3-10 who can neither walk nor talk. Services for Adults include Residential, Supported Living, and Employment Services.

The Concept, Goals and Objective of the Project

Removing a daily barrier to essential self-care and personal dignity is the goal of our project. It will be achieved by conversion of the restroom facility for the Sipporta Residence in Delray Beach. Conversion will include installing an accessible toilet, replacing the existing tub unit with a handicapped-accessible walk-in shower with ADA regulation grab bars, installing new countertops, sinks and faucets, and replacing wall and floor tiles necessarily damaged in the conversion.

<u>Justification for the Project, Number of People Expected to Be Served, Amount of Grant Requested and Itemized Expenditures, Benefits to be Derived</u>

As is the case with the whole of our population, the residents of The Arc's group homes are aging. One of the greatest challenges to an older person as physical abilities diminish is restroom access and safety. Not only is self-care an essential component of self-esteem, it is also a skill that adults with developmental disabilities have struggled far longer and far harder to achieve than most. Preserving their hard-won ability to care for themselves and to ensure their safety, The Arc respectfully requests \$5,000 toward the approximately \$10,000 cost of converting the existing restroom facilities at our Sipporta. Copies of bids received toward this project, with itemization of expenditures, are included in this proposal packet.

Thirty-two (32) adults who are developmentally disabled live in one of four group homes operated by The Arc. They participate in a variety of social, recreational, educational and employment activities. Residents enjoy a full program delivered by trained staff to develop skills necessary for independent living and self-support while living in these cheerful and comfortable homes. As in any home setting, their friends and family members visit, as do professionals like therapists and support coordinators, co-workers, residents of other Arc group homes, and a variety of other acquaintances.

Monthly overhead and maintenance costs for The Arc's residences pose an ongoing challenge, particularly keen in these times of public funding cutbacks. Mortgage payments, utilities, groceries, insurance premiums, and repairs all are

carefully managed. The State of Florida, as you know, provides some funding for each group home resident, but those payments have never covered the full amount required for operating costs or the expense of needed repairs and upgrades, and state payments now are being reduced at this time even as increases in service levels are being mandated.

The contribution toward this renovation project by the County OEO will ensure a continued safe, accessible, dignified environment where adults with developmental disabilities can continue to benefit from their hard-won self-care skills and have a home with the kind of restroom access essential to maintaining their greatest level of independence. Families, staff and visitors, too, will have the benefit of this accessible restroom facility, ensuring that residents will always be able to include their professional support persons, family and friends in their lives, regardless of disability. Having accessible facilities will also increase the number of persons able to be served by our Residential Program as applicants who present with not only developmental disabilities, but also physical limitations, could now be accepted for services.

The Sipporta Residence is located at 202 Palm Court in Delray Beach. It serves eight men and women with developmental disabilities who are between the ages of 31–84 who function on a mild to moderate level. The residence is inspected annually by the Health Department and Fire Department. It has passed inspections every year. Copies of the latest inspections are attached. Also attached is a copy of the Agency for Persons with Disabilities Certificate of License. Three of the residents have physical limitations requiring the use of a walker or wheelchair, with one resident facing a progressive condition rapidly reducing physical agility.

The resident manager and habilitation coaches working with our residents provide 24-hour awake supervision as well as daily training and reinforcement of self-care as well as group living skills and routines. The residents at Sipporta have lived there, on average, for seventeen years. It is the only home many of them have known for their adult lives. For them to have to find another home as they age would be both more costly to the community and certainly very costly to them in terms of support systems and the ability to remain living independently. Most older adults with developmental disabilities, if they are not homeless, find themselves in assisted living facilities if they are not in an appropriate group home, and those costs to the community are far higher than our residential program.

Families of our residents and local supporters of The Arc do contribute through annual membership gifts and through special events to supplement public funds received. Arc contributors have a history of responding with additional donations when a project like this receives the seed money through County funding to get it launched. Thanks to the assistance of the Office of Equal Opportunity last year, the Sipporta Residence now has the ADA-approved ramp so essential for the residents' safety in case of an emergency. With your support again this year, we will be able to complete modifications essential for their personal safety each and every day.




