I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Consultant Services Authorization (CSA) No. 1 to the contract with BRPH Architects-Engineers, Inc. (R2008-1305) in the amount of \$132,000 for Government Center Chiller Replacement design services.

Summary: CSA No. 1 acts to significantly reduce the scope of a previously approved capital project to include only the work necessary to replace the roof top cooling towers and chillers at the Government Center in lieu of the previously approved project to: 1) replace chillers at the Judicial Central Energy Plant, 2) provide new underground piping to Government Center and 1916 Courthouse, and 3) provide for a new Thermal Energy Storage Tank and equipment. The change in scope was made necessary primarily for operational reasons which were not known until a preliminary design was developed and the required approach to construction was determined by the Construction Manager. The change of scope is also necessary to not require a request for additional funding to complete the project as initially planned. CSA No. 1 is to provide design services and construction administration for the replacement of the chillers at the Government Center. The source of funding for this work is ad valorem. BRPH Architects-Engineers, Inc. has an annual contract for professional service for engineering which provides for an SBE participation goal of 20%. The participation in this CSA is 16.67%. BRPH's only SBE subconsultant performs construction administration services which are limited under this project. (Capital Improvements Division) Countywide/District 7(JM)

Background and Justification: In June 2007, the Board authorized proceeding with the expansion of the Judicial Center Central Energy Plant (R2007-0871) to serve the Government center and the 1916 Courthouse as well as ultimately the build-out of Block D at a projected project cost of \$15 Million. The purpose of the initial phase of the project was to replace the Government Center roof mounted chiller plant which has exceeded its operational life expectancy by replacing and expanding the existing Judicial Center CEP chillers to accommodate the additional load. In September 2007, the Board approved additional scope to evaluate and design into the project a Thermal Energy Storage system to reduce on-going energy costs. The budget for the project was increased to \$17.3 Million to include the Thermal Energy Storage (TES) system.

Background and Justification (continued):

The preliminary design work was completed and the drawings developed to a point at which updated costs estimates and a plan for construction could be developed by the County's construction manager. That evaluation resulted in the following:


- 1. A minimum of 2-8 HVAC shut downs at the Judicial Center, 2 chillers at a time.
- 2. A minimum of 2+ electrical shutdowns at the Judicial Center.
- 3. A possible completion date for the new equipment serving the Government Center of summer 2011 barring any unforeseen delays, the biggest of which is still unknown and that is securing approval from the City for the TES tank.
- 4. A budget shortfall of \$3M \$7M not including any costs attached to the approval from the City for the TES tank.

The first two discoveries are operationally problematic as the number of HVAC and electrical shut downs at the Judicial Center and the risks associated with short and long term impacts to Judicial Center building operations are considered to be significant (it was initially thought that the number of shut downs could be limited in number and timed so as to not occur during summer). Number 3 is problematic as the existing Government Center equipment has significantly exceeded its life span and the last two summers have resulted in extraordinary maintenance and repair costs to maintain minimum building operations at the Government Center. The yet unquantified risk associated with the City's approval of the TES tank which could likely cause the delivery of the new system to slip past the summer of 2011. Regarding number 4, there is no capital funding available to fund the capital funding shortfall.

As a result, Staff is recommending that the scope of the project be reduced to only the minimum scope necessary to replace the cooling tower and chillers at the Government Center. This will result in delivery of the new HVAC system for the Government Center by the summer of 2010 and eliminate the known risk associated with the shutdowns at the Judicial Center and the unknown financial and timing risk associated with the City's approval of the TES tank. The reduced scope is also consistent with the County's approach to funding only renewal /replacement projects and deferring new or expanded capital facilities.

The energy cost savings of approximately \$389,000 annually will be foregone until the Judicial Center CEP renewal/replacement project is warranted on its own between 2013-2015 but will result in the immediate turn back of approximately \$8.3M in currently budgeted capital dollars. Most importantly, it is the only way at this point to ensure the timely replacement of the Government Center HVAC equipment with the minimal impact on operations within the existing budget.

Proceeding in this manner; 1) does not impact the ability of the County to implement TES in the future as part of the Judicial Center renewal replacement project, 2) allows the County to realize the full life of the Judicial Center CEP equipment, 3) is consistent with the County's approach to limit capital development during these times of budget constraints, and 4) most importantly, allows for the most expedited replacement of the failing Government Center equipment.

Dear Ms. Arndt,

Our office would like to respectfully submit a proposal for design professional consultant services for the design and construction of the aforementioned project. The proposal herein is for the following activities:

SCOPE OF SERVICES:

The project includes professional services required to design and administer the replacement of the main chilled water system. The project will include the following activities:

- 1. Brief HVAC Load analysis of the existing building
- 2. Structural study of selective existing conditions3. Electrical service design upgrade to support the new equipment
- 4. Replacement of the cooling tower
- 5. Sequential replacement of the existing chillers and pumps
- 6. Design of new pump enclosure on the roof
- 7. Selective demolition and design of new access openings for existing penthouse
- 8. Structural design to support aforementioned items

BRPH offers to provide architectural, structural, mechanical, plumbing and electrical engineering services required to replace the existing Chiller system at the Government Center.

The project's design intent will be to provide new facilities and sufficient redundant capacity for the chilled water system and is not to include the replacement of the existing chilled water piping systems.








