I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:

- (A) A contract with Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. in the amount of \$1,753,915.10 for the Air Cargo Ramp Expansion Project at Palm Beach International Airport (PBIA); and
- (B) A Budget Amendment of \$1,567,297 in the Airports Improvement and Development Fund to establish \$2,185,814 in funding for project expenditures, including design costs and contingency funding; to recognize \$1,567,297 of Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) grant funding, and a transfer of \$282,703 from Airport Reserves, and \$335,814 from P-Design and Engineering Services.

Summary: This project was advertised utilizing the County's competitive bid process. On February 5, 2009 seven (7) bids were received for the Air Cargo Ramp Expansion Project at PBIA. Of the seven (7) bids, Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. has been identified as a responsible/responsive bidder in the amount of \$1,753,915.10. In addition to the construction contract, project expenditures also include design costs, permitting fees and contingency funding. The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Goal for this project was established at 15.00%. Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. bid contained 15.18% DBE participation. Matching funds of \$522,432 (25%) are required from Airport Revenues. **Countywide (JCM)**

Background and Justification: This project will provide for the construction of additional ramp for air cargo operations at PBIA. The expansion of the existing ramp is necessary due to the impending initiation of cargo operations by FedEx in December 2009. At the present time, United Parcel Service occupies approximately 15 percent of the air cargo facility along with the majority of the ramp space associated with the building. Due to the way the two carriers conduct their cargo handling operations, the existing ramp will not accommodate simultaneous operations by more than two (2) aircraft on the ground; the construction of this additional ramp will offer a third aircraft parking position for cargo operations. Builder's Risk Insurance is not required for this project.

Time is of the essence. The Contractor shall commence the work to be performed under this Contract on the date set by the Owner in the written notice to proceed, continue the work with due diligence and shall complete the entire work per Attachment No. 2 to the Bid Form. Further, in the event interim milestone completion dates are established in Attachment No. 2 of the Bid Form for separable portions of the work, the Contractor agrees to complete said separable portions of the work in accordance with said milestone dates.

In case of failure on the part of the Contractor to complete the work within the time(s) specified in the Contract, or within such additional time(s) as may be granted by formal action of the Board of County Commissioners or fails to prosecute the work, or any separable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure its completion within the time(s) specified in the Contract or any extensions thereof, Owner will suffer damage, the amount of which is difficult, if not impossible to ascertain. Therefore, the Contractor shall pay to the Owner, as liquidated damages, the amounts indicated in the Milestone and Damages Data (Attachment #2 of the Bid Form) for each calendar day of delay that actual completion extends beyond the time limits specified in said Attachment until such reasonable time as may be required for final completion of work. In no way shall costs for liquidated damages be construed as a penalty on the Contractor.

Liquidated damages due to the Owner may be deducted from payments due to the Contractor, or may be collected from the Contractor or its surety or sureties. These provisions for liquidated damages shall not prevent the Owner, in case of the Contractor's default, from terminating the Contractor's right to proceed as provided in General Provision section 80-09 "Default and Termination of Contract".

Utilization of Disadvantaged Business Enterprises

It is the Policy of Palm Beach County Department of Airports and Department of Transportation that Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) as defined in 49 CFR Part 26 shall have the maximum practicable opportunity in the performance of contract financed in whole or in part with Federal Funds. DBE participation is strongly encouraged and expected for this prime contract. The County has committed to meeting an annual DBE Race Neutral Goal. DBEs must be certified with the Palm Beach County Department of Airports or Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). List Proposed DBE Subcontractors on Schedule 1 and complete one Schedule 2 form for each DBE listed on Schedule 1.

Based on this, their bid proposal is considered to be non-responsive and is not recommended for award.

The next lowest bidder is Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. Listed below are some details of their bid:

- o Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. operates out of West Palm Beach, Florida and has been in business for 28 years. They have a \$200 M bonding capacity. They have completed multiple transportation projects in Palm Beach County, including jobs with the PBCDOA.

- o They have committed to a DBE Goal of 15.18%
