EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF WORK FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE CONTRACT Agency Name: Ruth Rales Jewish Family Service of South Palm Beach County

Case Management Unit: An hour of time spend providing a consumer-centered service by Ruth Rales Jewish Family Service's case management staff to include assessment, intake, information and referral, follow-up/linkage and monitoring for quality of ongoing home care services (e.g. home health aid, home delivered meals, companion, medical supplies/equipment, chores, bathing), communication with caregiver/family members regarding status of activities of daily living and functioning

Case Management is a consumer-centered service that assists individuals in identifying physical and emotional needs as well as problems that arise. Case management provides continuing support and addresses the changing needs of consumers over time. Coverage is maintained on a 24 hour, 7 day a week basis throughout the year.

Case Managers provide advocacy on an individual case basis, by ensuring that consumers receive the benefits and services to which they are entitled. They monitor the consumer's progression and/or regression at regular intervals (a minimum of every 6 months, face to face) and update the existing plan of care to reflect changes in the consumer's functioning and level of need, and assign new services as appropriate, giving the consumer the ability to choose between more than one provider if at all possible.

The main tasks of the Case Manager are the following:

- To assess strengths, frailties and financial status;
- To develop a comprehensive plan of action, or a "care plan," which will ensure the highest level of independence be maintained;
- To respect the ability of the consumer to make choices from the array of services available;
- To engage existing caregivers and family members in this care plan and maintain communication that further ensures its success and.
- To advocate on behalf of both the elderly consumer and their caregivers

In Home Services Unit: An hour of time spent providing in-home direct care through qualified vendors for elder care services as follows: homemaking, personal care, chore, respite, and companionship. Ruth Rales Jewish Family Service maintains a menu of service providers for clients to choose from. Vendor monitorings are scheduled yearly.
