RESOLUTION NO. 11-09

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF TEQUESTA, FLORIDA, TO SUPPORT A DEDICATED FUNDING SOURCE 'FOR COMMUTER RAIL SERVICES PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the South Florida Regional Transportation Authority (SFRTA) provides commuter rail services in South Florida; and

WHEREAS, commuter rail provides an alternative mode of travel which has experienced increased use in recent years with increased service and improved schedules; and

WHEREAS, SFRTA could access additional federal funds with a dedicated funding source, and

WHEREAS, a dedicated funding source would relieve Palm Beach County of contributions to SFRTA to meet operating costs shortfalls; and

WHEREAS, reallocation of an existing \$2.00 rental car surcharge has been considered and would have an estimated impact of approximately \$63 million on the FDOT program for Palm Beach County over five years; and

WHEREAS, The Palm Beach Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) supports continued operation and expansion of the commuter rail service and the need for a dedicated funding source.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF TEQUESTA, PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1 The Council supports an additional local option rental car surcharge or one or more additional funding sources to support needed funding levels.

Section 2 The Council requests the Florida Legislature provide a dedicated funding source to support commuter rail service.

RESOLUTION NO. R2009-27

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WELLINGTON, FLORIDA, ENDORSING SENATE BILL 1000/HOUSE BILL 365 ENTITLED AN ACT RELATING TO DISCRETIONARY SALES SURTAXES AND OFFSETTING THE AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Fire Rescue Service and Emergency Medical Services is provided to the citizens of the Village of Wellington by virtue of a municipal services taxing unit, operated and administered by Palm Beach County (Fire Rescue MSTU); and

WHEREAS, the services provided by Palm Beach County Fire Rescue for the Village of Wellington have always been viewed as exceptional for fire fighting and emergency medical services; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes that the Fire Rescue MSTU imposes more ad valorem taxes on property owners in Wellington and the Village does; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes that property owners are demanding alternatives to ad valorem (property) taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes that they would like to assist citizens by reducing ad valorem property taxes for its property owners while maintaining a high level of service the citizens have come to expect; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes that the current economy demands that funding for fire rescue and emergency medical services be diversified and this diversification is essential to maintain a safe level of service for the residents and visitors of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes the proposed Senate Bill 1000/House Bill 365 provides for mandatory inter-local agreements with condition precedent to an election with departments covering fifty percent (50%) of municipal population; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes that proposed Senate Bill 1000/House Bill 365 allow for a surtax not to exceed one percent (1%) and includes a corresponding reduction in ad valorem taxes that will assist property owners with lower property taxes; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes the proposed Senate Bill 1000/House Bill 365 provides for a referendum of the public on a county by county basis; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Wellington recognizes the proposed Senate Bill 1000/House Bill 365 provides for a the regional service coordinator shall be responsible for the development and administration of the inter-local agreement(s) authorized by this act; and

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WELLINGTON, that:

SECTION 1. The foregoing "WHEREAS" 10 clauses are confirmed and ratified as being true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. The Village Council of the Village of Wellington, Florida hereby goes on record endorsing Senate Bill 1000/House Bill 365 and urges all members of the Legislature of the State of Florida to vote in favor of this legislation.

SECTION 3. That the Village Clerk is hereby directed to provide copies of this resolution to the Governor of the State of Florida, all members of the Florida Legislature, and the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners.

SECTION 4. If any clause, section, other part of application of the resolution is held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this resolution.

SECTION 5. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.
