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I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

- (A) Approve the filing of the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Grant Application Amendment for Public Transportation Capital and Operating Assistance (FL-96-X026-01) funds allocated to Palm Beach County under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009; and
- **(B)** Authorize the Palm Tran Director or Assistant Executive Director through the County Administrator to execute, on behalf of the Board, and to transmit electronically the Board's approval of the ARRA grant award; and
- (C) Approve upward budget amendment of \$2,098,050 in the Palm Tran Grants Fund for FY2009; and
- (D) Approve downward budget amendment of \$2,098,050 in the Public Building Improvement Fund for FY 2009; and
- (E) Approve one (1) new full-time Bus Operator position.

Summary: Palm Beach County was allocated \$21,235,245 under ARRA for Capital expenditures only. On April 21, 2009 (R-2009-0692), Palm Tran presented to the Board the breakdown of capital projects to be funded with ARRA funds and submitted a grant application to FTA for the projects that met all federal conditions to obligate the funds, in order to fulfill FTA's requirement to obligate at least 50% of the funds by May 29, 2009. Palm Tran indicated that when all other projects met the federal conditions, the ARRA grant would be amended to include the remaining projects. On June 24, 2009, President Obama signed the Supplemental Appropriations Act for 2009. This new law included a provision allowing up to ten percent of the amount apportioned in the Recovery Act for the urbanized (Section 5307) formula programs to be used for operating assistance. Palm Tran is allocating \$2,123,500 to operating assistance in FY 2010 for the cost of salaries (salaries require Department of Labor approval). ARRA funding is budgeted in salaries for FY 2010. The ARRA funds have provided the opportunity to allow ad valorem dollars to be placed into a reserve for Palm Tran's 2011 budget. This includes funding for the creation of one additional Bus Operator position for additional peak service on Route 44. This position is approved for the length of the grant and will be eliminated when grant funding is discontinued. ARRA operating assistance funding must be spent within a two (2) year timeframe, by the end of County FY 2010.

Palm Tran, following approval of this item, will submit an amendment to the FTA that includes the Operating Assistance; increases the number of hybrid buses from 10 to 16, reduces the amount of diesel buses from 15 to 9 and increases the number of Motor Fans from 25 to 35. The funding for the City of West Palm Beach Trolleys has been deleted, as the City secured other funding for that project. The funding for Park and Ride facilities has been deleted and used for operating assistance. Palm Tran received allocations for Park and Ride lots under Section 5309 and is pursuing additional funding with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). (Continued on page 3)

Summary (Continued):

ARRA capital projects are funded at 100% cost for the federal share, no county funds are required. Countywide (DR)

Background and Policy Issues: Application FL-96-X026-01, amends the current ARRA Grant FL-96-X026-00 obligated last August 13, 2009. The amendment includes a new line item for operating assistance (10% of the total allocation). The original application funds the replacement of 25 buses, the amendment includes the up-charges to make 6 of the diesel buses hybrid, the total amount of buses remains at 25. The line item for Motor Fans was increased from 25 to 35, Palm Tran plans to purchase 50 of these fans in the upcoming year, the remaining 15 will be purchased with another ARRA grant for Transit Investments For Greenhouse Gas And Energy Reduction Grants Program (TIGGER), which Palm Tran applied for on behalf of the County and was notified of an award of \$320,000 for this purchase. The line item for Park and Ride has been deleted. Palm Tran continues to be committed to this project, and funding has been secured with the allocation of Section 5309 funds for the engineering and design of Park and Ride lots, and Palm Tran is also applying for additional funds with FDOT. The line item for Hybrid Trolleys for the City of West Palm Beach DDA, has been deleted.


changes totaling approximately \$787 billion to support multi-pronged efforts to stimulate the economy. Goals of the statute include the preservation or creation of jobs and promotion of an economic recovery, as well as the investment in transportation, environmental protection and other infrastructure providing long-term economic benefits. Of the \$787 billion of spending and tax law changes in ARRA, over \$48 billion will be invested in transportation infrastructure, facilities, and equipment. Transit Capital Assistance funds may be used to fund eligible capital projects. accordance with 49 U.S.C. section 5302(a)(1), eligible capital projects include: preventive maintenance; acquiring, constructing, supervising, or inspecting equipment or a facility for use in public transportation (including engineering, designing, location surveying, mapping, and acquiring right-of-way); transit-related ITS; rehabilitating buses; remanufacturing a bus; overhauling rail rolling stock; leasing a facility or equipment for use in public transportation where more cost-effective than purchase or construction; public transportation improvement that enhances economic development or incorporates private investment, including commercial and residential development, pedestrian and bicycle access to public transportation facilities, construction or renovation of intercity rail stations and terminals, renovation and improvements of historic transportation facilities, where the improvement enhances the effectiveness of a public transportation project and is physically or functionally related to that public transportation project, or creates a new or enhanced coordination between public transportation and other transportation and provides a fair share of revenue to be used in public transportation.

Special Conditions of Grant Award—In the interest of time, FTA is not issuing a separate grant contract for ARRA funds. However, because different requirements flow with the ARRA funds, these additional requirements will be added by FTA regional staff as conditions of grant approval in each TEAM application. Recipients applying for grants that contain ARRA funds must agree to the following grant conditions that will be included in the grant application. 1. Recipient of ARRA funds agrees to comply with reporting requirements and deadlines set out in section 1201(c) of Public Law 111-5. 2. Recipient of ARRA funds agrees to comply with reporting requirements and deadlines set out in section 1512 of Public Law 111-5. 3. Recipient of ARRA funds agrees that all data submitted to FTA in compliance with the requirements of Public Law 111-5 is accurate, objective, and of the highest integrity. 4. Recipient of ARRA funds acknowledges that receipt of ARRA funds is a "onetime" disbursement that does not create any future obligation by the FTA to advance similar funding amounts. 5. Recipient of ARRA funds agrees that it or its sub-recipients will report any credible evidence that a principal, employee, agent, contractor, subrecipient, subcontractor, or other person has submitted a false claim under the False Claims Act or has committed a criminal or civil violation of law pertaining to fraud, conflict of interest, bribery, gratuity, or similar misconduct involving ARRA funds.

In addition to the Special Conditions noted above, the County, by accepting and approving a grant awarded by FTA under the ARRA, will be subject to the terms and conditions of the Federal Transit Administration Master Agreement, FTA MA(15), October 1, 2008, and the Federal Fiscal Year 2008 Certifications and Assurances approved by the Board on December 16, 2008. The Board also authorized the Director and Assistant Director of Palm Tran to electronically execute the Master Agreement and the 2008 Certifications and Assurances, on its behalf, and transmit the Board's approval to the FTA. The terms and conditions of the Master Agreement can be found at ttp://www.fta.dot.gov/documents/15-Master.pdf, and the terms and conditions of the Certifications and Assurances can be found in the Federal Register Notice published in Vol. 73 beginning on page 65010 (No 212/Friday, October 31, 2008).

The authority delegated to the Director and Assistant Director of Palm Tran to execute grant(s) awarded under the ARRA, on behalf of the Board, as set forth in the Motion and Title above, will also bind the Board to the terms and conditions made applicable to grants awarded under the ARRA as described in the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 Public Transportation Apportionments, Allocations and Grant Program Information Notice published by the Department of Transportation, Federal Transit Administration, in Vol. 74, beginning on page 9656, of the Federal Register (No 42/Thursday, March 5, 2009).

Grant Application for Public Transportation Capital Assistance funds allocated to Palm Beach County under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) of 2009 in the amount of \$21,235,245.

May 2009 Application is for \$17,145,000 (81% of allocation)

Palm Tran on behalf of Palm Beach County will submit a grant application for the projects that currently meet all federal conditions to obligate the funds, and when all other projects meet the federal conditions the ARRA grant will be amended to include the remaining projects.

1) Belle Glade Facility; 2) Park and Ride Facilities (To be included in amendment); 3) Palm Tran Replacement Buses; 4) Capital Maintenance Items; 5) Security; 6) Transit Enhancements – City of Delray Beach Shelters (To be included in amendment - project needs proof of right of way acquisitions and interlocal agreement); 7) Hybrid Trolleys for the City of West Palm Beach Downtown Development Authority. (To be included in amendment - project needs interlocal agreement) ARRA capital projects are funded at 100% cost for the federal share, no match funds are required.

Belle Glade Facility Construction: FTA granted on August 11, 2008 a Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) for this project based on the Environmental Assessment (EA) submitted to FTA. The EA details the project will not include land acquisitions or displacements of residences or business.

Federal Funding allocated for the Belle Glade Facility over the past four years totals \$7,419,270. \$75,545 have already been spent on the design process, and the construction cost of the Belle Glade Facility is currently estimated at \$5,761,930, ARRA funds will be used for the construction costs of the Belle Glade Facility. All costs for engineering, design and remaining construction costs will be fully funded by Federal Grants FY06-5309 FL-04-0002 \$666,250; FY07-5309 FL-04-0026 \$702,240; FY08-5309 FL-04-0060 \$760,760; FY08-5307 FL-90-X673 \$1,500,000; FY09-5309 FL-04-0094 \$790,020 and \$3,000,000 from this Stimulus ARRA Grant. Once construction is completed, the remaining federal funds will be used to outfit the facility with the necessary, equipment, maintenance supplies, furnishings, electronics and supplies to make this maintenance facility operational.

The Board of County Commissioners also understands that after approval of this grant, and upon Execution of the Grant Agreement, the following documents will be incorporated by reference and made part of this Grant Agreement:

- (1) "Federal Transit Administration Master Agreement," FTA MA(15), October 1, 2008,
- (2) The Certifications and Assurances applicable to the Project that the Grantee has selected and provided to FTA.

The Board of County Commissioners on December 16, 2008 approved The Federal FY 2009 Master Agreement and Certifications and Assurances to be used in connection with all Federal assistance programs the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) administers during Federal Fiscal Year 2009.

Section 15 (Procurement) of the Master Agreement approved by the Board reads: The Recipient also agrees to follow the provisions of FTA Circular 4220.1F, "Third Party Contracting Guidance," November 1, 2008, and any later revision thereto, except to the extent FTA determines otherwise in writing. The Recipient agrees that it may not use FTA assistance to support its third party procurements unless there is satisfactory compliance with Federal laws and regulations.

Furthermore the current purchasing policy reads:

It is the policy of Palm Tran that the procurement of goods and services be accomplished in such a way as to ensure fair and open competition among participating vendors. These policies and procedures are intended to be consistent with the regulations of the Federal Transit Administration FTA Circular 4220.1F and the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).

Palm Beach County has been awarded 81% or \$17,145,000 of the \$21,235,245 allocated under the Public Transportation Capital Assistance under the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA).
