#### I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a two-year extension to all Water Utilities Department Development Agreements and Renewal Agreements that were originally scheduled to expire between September 1, 2008, and January 1, 2012.

Summary: Developers who meet certain criteria as outlined in the Water Utilities Department's Uniform Policies and Procedures Manual (UPAP) are required to enter into Development Agreements (Agreement) to reserve potable water, wastewater, and/or reclaimed water capacity (Capacity) for their projects. The terms of the Agreement require the submittal of a Mandatory Agreement Payment (MAP) to reserve Capacity for a period of five years. Any unused Capacity remaining in the Agreement after five years can be renewed for one (1) additional five year term upon payment of another MAP and execution of a Renewal Agreement. No further renewals are available after ten years. The ten-year expiration provision puts a significant obstacle in the way of economic development in the current economic environment. On January 13, 2009, the Board approved a one-year extension for Agreements and Renewal Agreements expiring between September 1, 2008, and September 30, 2013. The recently enacted Section 14(1), Chapter 2009-96, Laws of Florida, provides for a two-year extension for development orders and building permits expiring between September 1, 2008, and January 1, 2012. Although the County Attorney's Office has determined that the law does not apply to Water Utilities Department (WUD) Development Agreements, granting an additional two-year extension will assist the development community while not significantly impacting WUD's operations. Background and Justification: The Department Director has been delegated the authority to enter into Standard Development Agreements on behalf of the County. However, Board authorization is being sought in this case due to the desire to extend expiration dates of all Standard and non-Standard Development Agreements in recognition of the current economic downturn.
