I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:

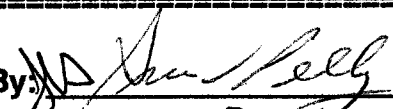
- (A) A contract with Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. in the amount of \$4,260,995 for the Miscellaneous Airfield Pavement Repairs and Rehabilitation Project at Palm Beach International Airport (PBIA); and
- (B) A Budget Amendment of \$2,130,497 in the Airport's Improvement and Development Fund to recognize Passenger Facility Charge (PFC) revenue, and to increase Airport Reserves by \$2,130,497; and
- (C) A Budget Transfer of \$2,130,497 in the Airport's PFC fund to transfer PFC funds to the Airport's Improvement and Development Fund, including a transfer from PFC Reserves.


Summary: This project was advertised utilizing the County's competitive bid process. On November 5, 2009 five (5) bids were received for the Miscellaneous Airfield Pavement Repairs and Rehabilitation Project at PBIA. Of the five (5) bids, Ranger Construction Industries, Inc., a Palm Beach County company, has been identified as a responsible/responsive bidder in the amount of \$4,260,995. In addition to the construction contract, project expenditures also include design costs, permitting fees and contingency funding. The Small Business Enterprise (SBE) Goal for this project was established at 15.00%. Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. SBE participation is 15.02%. Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) grant funding of \$2,130,498 and PFC funds of \$2,130,497 are funding this project. **Countywide (JCM)**

Background and Justification: In order to provide for the safe and efficient movement of aircraft on the airport surfaces at PBIA, the Department of Airports prepared an extensive bid package for the maintenance, repair, and rehabilitation of various apron, runway and taxiway systems at the Airport aimed at extending the useful life of the airfield pavement sections. This project addresses asphalt and concrete crack and joint repair, partial- and full-depth patch repairs, milling and overlay, drainage inlet repairs, and hot mix asphaltic concrete/Portland Cement Concrete (HMA/PCC) interface repairs. Builder's Risk Insurance is not required for this project.

THIS CONTRACT, made and entered on _____, between **PALM BEACH COUNTY**, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the "OWNER" and **RANGER CONSTRUCTION INDUSTRIES, INC.**, hereinafter referred to as the "CONTRACTOR".

WITNESSETH:

That the said Contractor having been awarded the contract for:

and to accept as full compensation for the satisfactory performance of this Contract the sum of **Four Million Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Nine Hundred Ninety Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$4,260,995.00)**, which includes Base Bid Schedules 1 and 2 plus Bid Alternates 1, 2 and 3, for the **Miscellaneous Airfield Pavement Repairs and Rehabilitation Project at Palm Beach International Airport**.

The prices named in the Bid are for the completed work, and include the furnishing of all materials and all labor, tools, and appliances and all expense, direct or indirect, connected with the proper execution of the work and of maintaining the same until it is accepted by the Board of County Commissioners.

Time/Liquidated Damages

Time is of the essence. The Contractor shall commence the work to be performed under this Contract on the date set by the Owner in the written notice to proceed, continue the work with due diligence and shall complete the entire work per Attachment No. 2 to the Bid Form. Further, in the event interim milestone completion dates are established in Attachment No. 2 of the Bid Form for separable portions of the work, the Contractor agrees to complete said separable portions of the work in accordance with said milestone dates.

In case of failure on the part of the Contractor to complete the work within the time(s) specified in the Contract, or within such additional time(s) as may be granted by formal action of the Board of County Commissioners or fails to prosecute the work, or any separable part thereof, with such diligence as will insure its completion within the time(s) specified in the Contract or any extensions thereof, Owner will suffer damage, the amount of which is difficult, if not impossible to ascertain. Therefore, the Contractor shall pay to the Owner, as liquidated damages, the amounts indicated in the Milestone and Damages Data (Attachment #2 of the Bid Form) for each calendar day of delay that actual completion extends beyond the time limits specified in said Attachment until such reasonable time as may be required for final completion of work. In no way shall costs for liquidated damages be construed as a penalty on the Contractor.

Liquidated damages due to the Owner may be deducted from payments due to the Contractor, or may be collected from the Contractor or its surety or sureties. These provisions for liquidated damages shall not prevent the Owner, in case of the Contractor's default, from terminating the Contractor's right to proceed as provided in the General Conditions.

Utilization of Small Business Enterprises

It is the policy of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, that SBE(s) have the maximum practical opportunity to participate in the competitive process of supplying goods, services and construction to the County. To that end the Board of County Commissioners established Ordinance No. 2002-064 (as amended), which sets forth the County's requirements for the SBE program, and are incorporated in this solicitation. Compliance with the requirements contained in this section shall result in a bidder being deemed responsive to SBE requirements. The provisions of this ordinance are applicable to this solicitation, and shall have precedence over the provisions of this solicitation in the event of a conflict.

Convicted Vendor List

As provided in F.S. 287.132-133, by entering into this contract or performing any work in furtherance hereof, the contractor certifies that it, its affiliates, suppliers, subcontractors and consultants who will perform hereunder, have not been placed on the Convicted Vendor List maintained by the State of Florida Department of Management Services within the 36 months immediately preceding the date hereof. This notice is required by F.S. 287.133 (3) (a).

LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION TO AWARD

Dear Mr. Tompkins:

ADA Engineering, Inc. has conducted a review of the five (5) bid proposals for the above referenced project. The bid proposals were submitted by Hardrives of Delray, Inc., Ranger Construction Industries, Inc., Community Asphalt Corp., J.W. Cheatham, LLC, and Kiewit Southern Co. A summary of the total bid amounts, including Bid Schedules 1 and 2 and Bid Alternates 1, 2 and 3 is provided in the table below.

Attached is a detailed tabulation of the bid prices submitted by all bidders and a checklist summarizing all attachments and schedules submitted by the bidders in each bid proposal. The checklist indicates any items that were left out and also includes commentary regarding any minor discrepancies in the bid proposal documentation.

Notably, the two lowest bidders, Hardrives of Delray, Inc. and Ranger Construction Industries, Inc. did not include signed copies of Addenda 1 and 2. Both bidders included the signed formal documentation shown on Bid Form Sheet 3 that demonstrates receipt of both addenda. Also of note, the bid proposal from the lowest bidder, Hardrives of Delray, Inc. includes minor discrepancies with regard to Attachments 3, 9, 12 and 17. As documented in the comments for the checklist these concerns are discrepancies regarding the subcontractors. Of these discrepancies the most significant is the missing Attachment 9 for Southwide Industries, Inc. since as indicated on Attachment 8, Southwide Industries, Inc. is a Small Business Enterprise and counts approximately 1% towards the 15% goal described in the Contract Documents.

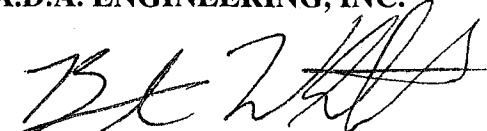

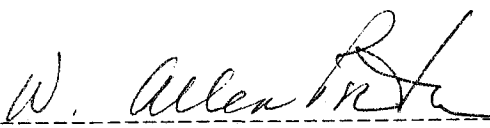

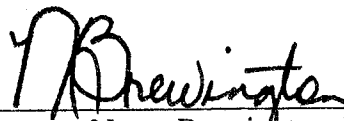
