I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Amendment No. 5 to the contract with the Center for Family Services of Palm Beach County (R2007-1928), increasing funding for the Traveler's Aid Program by \$31,000, for a new not-to-exceed total amount of \$388,782.

Summary: The Department of Community Services through the Financially Assisted Agencies program has been requested to provide \$31,000 in additional funds to the Center for Family Services, specifically in the Traveler's Aid program. This program is currently funded at \$13,470 and will be raised to \$44,470. Funding under this amendment will be used for non-refundable bus tickets to transport homeless individuals to locations where permenant housing has been arranged, as well as case management services, and administrative expenses. This agency is working closely with the County's Homeless Outreach Teams under the direction of the Human Services Division to make sure all individuals who qualify will receive this emergency assistance. The funding for this amendment is from unused allocated funds to Financially Assisted Agency Big Brothers/Sisters. This agency discontinued services as of November 1, 2009, and thus the County did not fund this agency its entire contract amount. Countywide (TKF)

Background and Justification: In providing for human service needs, Palm Beach County augments its own service mix through the provision of funding for programming and services delivered by community-based agencies. The Financially Assisted Agencies program was established in the early 1980s to overcome the adverse impact of reduced federal funding. It is now an important component of the federal, state and local funding sources that support our County's system of care. The Board of County Commissioners has directed staff to pursue datadriven, evidenced-based programming and outcome measures that ensure effective changes in people's lives in our community. Funded organizations are monitored by the Community Services Department to maintain programmatic and fiscal accountability. Contracts include the following safeguards to protect the County: insurance coverage is mandatory, funds are paid out on a unit cost basis and funds cannot be used to initiate or to pursue litigation against the County.

AMENDMENT TO FINANCIALLY ASSISTED AGENCIES CONTRACT FOR PROVISION OF FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

THIS AMENDMENT TO THE FINANCIALLY ASSISTED AGENCIES CONTRACT
(R2007-1928, November 6, 2007) made and entered into in Palm Beach County Florida, on this
day of2010 by and between PALM BEACH COUNTY, hereinafter referred to as
"COUNTY" and Center for Family Services of Palm Beach County, Inc. hereinafter referred to as
the AGENCY, a not-for-profit corporation, entitled to do business in the State of Florida, whose
address is 4101 Parker Avenue, West Palm Beach, Fl 33405.

WITNESETH:

WHEREAS, the parties entered in a contract on November 6, 2007, which provided for the Traveler's Aid program which assists homeless individuals in returning back to homes out of the state; and

WHEREAS, the contract was extended and modified by Amendment 01 (R-2008-1284), Amendment 02 (R-2008-2115,), Amendment 03 (R-2009-0826), Amendment 04 per (R2009-1849) and currently has an expiration date of September 30, 2010 and;

WHEREAS, the need exists to further amend the contract to add additional dollars of the Traveler's Aid program by modifying Article 3 – Payments and Exhibit B4 "Service/Program To Be Provided FY 2010 Financial Assistance Contract".

NOW THEREFORE, the above named parties hereby mutually agree that the contract is hereby amended as follows:

- I. <u>Article 3 Payments</u> is amended to read "The COUNTY shall pay to the AGENCY for services rendered under this contract, an amount not to exceed <u>Three Hundred Eighty-Eight Thousand, Seven Hundred and Eighty Two Dollars (\$388,782)</u>.
- II. Exhibit B4 is hereby amended and replaced with Exhibit B5 attached hereto and made a part hereof.

OTHER PROVISIONS

All provisions in the Contract or exhibits to the Contract in conflict with this Fifth Amendment to the Contract shall be and are hereby changed to conform to this amendment.

All provisions not in conflict with this Amendment are still in effect and are to be performed at the same level as specified in the Contract.
