#### I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

**Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve:** a Budget Transfer of \$130,888 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

**Summary:** Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2010 estimated donation requirement is \$158,962. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The current State LETF balance is \$1,930,073. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$1,799,185. The year-to-date transfer for all donations after approval of this item is \$505,107. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. This Statute requires that no less than 15 % of the last fiscal year's revenues be donated or expended for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood or school resource officer programs. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055.

- Organization Purpose: <u>The mission of the Boca Raton Boys & Girls Club is to inspire and</u> assist all young children, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens.
- 3. Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded: <u>The Boys & Girls</u> Club Boca Raton currently provides after-school programming to 378 economically disadvantaged and culturally diverse youth between the ages of six to 18 each year. Research states that these critical out-of-school hours are when youth are at-risk for negative behaviors such as drug and alcohol abuse, premature sexual activities, poor academic achievement and truancy and gang involvement and petty crimes. The majority of our parents state that without the Club, their child/children would go home alone each day after school and would spend time unsupervised and alone.

The Club provides these youth with a safe and supervised alternative where they participate in programs conducted by positive and caring adult role models. Focusing on the social, emotional, academic and physical needs of our youth, the Club provides nationally recognized, outcome-driven programs in six core areas: education and career development; character and leadership; health and life skills; technology; cultural arts; and sports, fitness and recreation. The programs of the Club work as evidenced by statistics which show that the majority of youth who attend the Club score higher in both reading and math than their same school peers who do not attend the Club. Additionally, our youth stay in school longer and leave with the tools and skills necessary to successfully transition into adulthood.

Research conducted by the Clubs indicates that youngsters start leaving the Club at 12 or 13 – the time when they need us the most. The Boca Raton Boys & Girls Club has made a commitment to attract and retain teens and provide them with programs that not only encourage their Club participation, but outfit them with lessons to ward off many of the negative behaviors they are exposed to. These program also address overcoming peer pressure and encourage teens to make the right and healthy life style choices as well as develop a moral compass that will help them in school and in life.

Teens participating in Boys & Girls Clubs programs address both the <u>crime prevention</u> and <u>safe neighborhood</u> Law Enforcement Trust Funds grant. The Club is open from 2:30



p.m. to 8:00 p.m. daily and until 8:00 p.m. on Friday nights for the teens. Being a Club member and participating in Club activities rather than being left alone and unsupervised, vulnerable to a myriad of at-risk behaviors, Club teens are involved in positive, life-enhancing programs that are building self-esteem, a strong moral compass, skills and tools to stay out of trouble.

Among the crime and drug abuse prevention programs this grant will enable the Club to conduct are:

#### SMART Moves

The nationally acclaimed SMART Moves (Skills Mastery and Resistance Training) prevention/education program addresses problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity. The program uses a team approach involving Club staff, peer leaders, parents and community representatives. More than simply emphasizing a "Say No" message, the program teaches young people ages 6 to15 how to say no by involving them in discussion and role-playing, practicing resistance and refusal skills, developing assertiveness, strengthening decision-making skills and analyzing media and peer influence. The ultimate goal is to promote abstinence from substance abuse and adolescent sexual involvement through the practice of responsible behavior.

#### <u>SMART Leaders</u>

This is a booster program to SMART Moves. This program keeps teens involved in the SMART Moves program by reinforcing skills and knowledge youth learned in SMART Moves and prepares teens as leaders to help their peers resist using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs, and postpone sexual activity.

#### SMART Girls

An outgrowth of the effective SMART Moves program, SMART Girls is a small-group health, fitness, prevention/education and self-esteem enhancement program designed to meet the developmental needs of girls ages 8-12 and 13-17. Through dynamic sessions, highly participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own and societal attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good healthcare and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.

#### Passport to Manhood

Passport to Manhood promotes and teaches responsibility while reinforcing positive behavior in male Club members ages 11 to14. Passport to Manhood consists of 14 small-group sessions, each of which concentrates on a specific aspect of manhood through highly interactive activities. Each participant is issued his own "Passport" to underscore the idea that he is on a journey of maturation and personal growth. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young boys in discussion activities that reinforce positive behavior. Passport to Manhood is a complement to SMART Girls.

#### Date SMART

Through fun and easy-to-use sessions, members between the ages of 13 to 18 learn how to achieve mutually supportive relationships free of violence and abuse. The program also encourages youth to become community advocates for relationships that promote equality and respect while combating the attitudes and behaviors that lead to dating, sexual and domestic violence.

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# PALM BEACH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE LAW ENFORCEMENT TRUST FUND DONATION

#### Bullying Hurts

This program is a community service program that focuses on positive youth development and prevention of the anti-social behavior of bullying in schools and communities. Understanding the importance of role models, mentors and the idea that youth just naturally learn from their peers, the Bullying Hurts Program is presented to elementary grade children by more mature students who are members of high school youth groups in their local area. Equipped with workbooks, videos, posters and their own bullying stories, the high school students work with the younger students teaching them what bullying is and how to deal with bullying in their classrooms and communities. As both groups grow more familiar with each other the high school students become mentors of their younger peers giving them the confidence and tools they will need to seek out support to deal with bullying.

Teen Time Survivor Skills

This Planned Parenthood sponsored program has 10 modules: introduction to sexuality including sex vs. sexuality; reproductive anatomy and physiology; human growth and development including puberty, hygiene, body image and self-esteem; personal skills including communications, values and decision making; abstinence and sexual health including preventing sexual risk-taking; relationships; disease prevention; teen pregnancy prevention; cultural and societal impact on teen sexuality; and a review of what the Club members have learned.

Meth Awareness

The lethal scourge of methamphetamine abuse is spreading across the country and affects us all. "Meth" is a powerful, highly addictive stimulant that is cheap and easy to produce. It is the nation's fastest growing drug threat. Our Clubs participated in National Meth Awareness Day on November 30, 2008. This was collaboration with local agencies and residents to raise awareness about Meth abuse and its terrible effects among all members of our community.

 <u>Sporting Competitions and Social Events</u> – These types of programs attract and retain teens at the Club, the positive alternative to being on the streets with nothing to do except to fall prey to at-risk behaviors.

What results are you committed to achieving?

The Boca Raton Boys & Girls Club is committed to keeping young people out of trouble with the law and in school. In addition to providing a safe, supervised and educational haven with caring adult role models, the Club provides an array of opportunities which help youth improve their academic performance. As youth who are significantly behind in school are much more likely to drop out, the Club works closely with the youth who are in need of academic assistance and provides certified teachers to work with them. Club staff members also provide encouragement and incentives for the youth. Attendance is tracked as well as reading and math FCAT scores, reading Lexile scores

and school attendance. The Club experience does work as statistically, our young people stay in school longer, graduate at a much higher rate and outperform their same school peers.

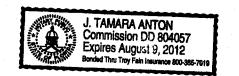

The \$25,000 grant from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund will underwrite one week of summer BizCamp. Approximately 80-100 at risk young people will participate in a week of BizCamp, where they will learn the skills needed to succeed in the business world. The young participants will learn the basics of personal money management, financial literacy as well as being exposed to the daily life of a business owner. In addition, we will offer a strong anti-substance abuse curriculum with materials and input from the Caron Foundation.

We believe that over 50% of all participants will show an increased understanding of basic financial literacy skills, skills that are required to enter the global job market, and understand the necessity of remaining in school in order to secure a better future. Salaries (list employees and individual compensation): 17% of Salaries for the following employees: Anne Coughlin, Director of Experiential Learning (\$45,000), Constanza Benton, Education Assistant (\$21,840). All Summer Camp Counselors wages are direct cost to summer Camp. An estimate of 8 counselors will be needed for the program, hourly wages will be \$12 and they will work at least 32.5 hours per week. 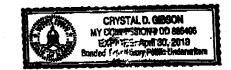
