- c) Making it a requirement that each employee to be engaged in the performance of the grant be given a copy of be statement required by paragraph (a);

Abbreviated Project Description

This is an application for continued funding for Palm Beach County's Head Start and Early Head Start grant #04CH3046 for the budget period 10/01/2010-09/30/2011. The Grantee is in year 2 of the application cycle and is submitting an abbreviated application.

1. Objective Need for Assistance and Geographic Area

The annual review of the Community Assessment indicates no significant changes. <u>As a result, there are no proposed changes</u> in the program that have resulted from a re-consideration of the decisions described in the six areas listed in 45CFR 1305.3(c):

- 1) The demographic make-up of Head Start eligible children and families
- 2) Other child development and child care programs that are serving Head Start eligible children
- 3) The estimated number of children with disabilities four years old or younger
- 4) Data regarding the education, health, nutrition and social service needs of Head Start eligible children and their families
- 5) The education, health, nutrition and social service needs of Head Start eligible children and their families
- 6) Resources in the community

2. Program Approach

There are no major changes in the program's long-range goals and shorter-term program objectives. There is one major change to the structure of management staff position. Head Start fiscal Unit will be shifted from the direct supervision of the Division of Head Start and Children's Services to the Department of Community Services Director of Finance and Support Services. This is part of a reorganization plan of the Community Service Department to consolidate the fiscal units of the divisions and programs in the department. The intent is to allow the department's fiscal director to provide more oversight and support. See Organizational Chart attached.

3. Results or Benefits Expected

Significant results and benefits have been realized towards meeting the goals and objectives established.

<u>School Readiness</u> 8 of 10 Head Start Centers were rated as high performing based on 08/09 State Kindergarten Readiness Assessment. This is a significant improvement from the previous year's scores of 1 of 5. The improvement is attributed to the following:

- Improvement in intervention strategies with English Language Learner's (ELL's) driven by the work of the Language Committee
- Implementation of the CLASS
- Increased early literacy-based training for staff
- Increased in the time spent on early literacy-based activities in the classroom and
- Enhanced parent involvement in their children's learning

<u>Availability of ECE programs in the County.</u> We successfully applied our ARRA HS and EHS Expansion Grants. As a result, 154 additional 3 and 4 year olds and 91 pregnant women, infant and toddlers are now receiving comprehensive services in HS and EHS.

<u>Disabilities / Inclusion.</u> PBCHS/EHS is enrolling more pre-diagnosed children into the program. This was made possible through closer partnership with Early Steps and such agencies as Blind Services and Deaf Services, and enhanced marketing efforts.

<u>Children in Poverty</u>. PBCHS/EHS has conducted the 40 hour child care certification for two cohorts of up to 35 parents each. With this certification, parents can become employed as child care assistants. Many of the parents who participate in these classes are employed by Head Start as Child Care Assistants and work towards attaining a higher level position in the organization.

We are working with PBC Criminal Justice Commissions Weed and Seed Program to reach out to incarcerated fathers and mothers, including any formally incarcerated parents.

<u>Affordable Workforce Housing.</u> Several First Time Home Buyers Workshops have been conducted at the centers. The Family and Community Partnership Staff are working in conjunction with the Housing and Community Development (HCD) to ensure that our families get priority for housing.

4. Items from Risk Management Meeting March 3, 2010

Since the Risk Management meeting the staff continue to work towards improving the percentage of children who completed dental treatments as follows: (1) more intense monthly monitoring by the Health Services Supervisor and Health Services Coordinators on the status of dental treatment of the children at the Centers and (2) intentionally focused efforts by the Family Services Specialists to work closer with the parents of children who need dental treatment, and (3) sent the attached Letter to the parents of children who have not completed dental treatment as of April 2010.

In addition, the newly hired Health Services Coordinator is a Registered Nurse and Registered Dental Hygiene who will be attending the Florida Dental Conference to learn the latest research and trends in the field of Pediatric Dentistry. She will design and develop creative parent and staff strategies to assist in improving the percentage of children who complete dental treatments.

Palm Beach County Head Start/Early Head Start continues the daily dental hygiene instructions and tooth brushing in the classrooms, "Give Kids A Smile" event which included fluoride varnish for the children, the National Dental Health Month activities, National Nutrition Month activities, distribution of the monthly Health & Nutrition newsletter, and other dental health education materials provided for the parents at the Centers.

Certification Regarding Cap on Staff Compensation

Section 653 of the Head Start Act places limitations on the compensation of Head Start Staff. Specifically, the Act prohibits the use of any Federal funds, including Head Start grant funds, to pay any part of the compensation of an individual employed by a Head Start agency if that individual's compensation exceeds the rate payable for Level II of the Executive Schedule, currently \$179,700. Program Instruction ACF-PI-HS-08-03, issued May 12, 2008, provides guidance on this requirement and defines compensation. No funds may be charged to the Head Start grant or to any other Federal program either as a direct cost or any pro-ration as an indirect cost for an employee whose compensation exceeds \$179,700. This provision is effective with the award of your FY2009 Head Start grant.

The undersigned certifies that Palm Beach Head Start and Early Head Start including its delegate agencies are in compliance with the compensation cap guidelines.
