I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

MOTION AND TITLE: Staff recommends motion to:

A) Ratify the signature of the Chairman on the submittal of the FY2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Formula Program: Local Solicitation application, previously called the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG), for the period October 1, 2009, to September 30, 2013, totaling \$287,336 in federal funds;

Authorize the Criminal Justice Commission's Executive Director, through the County Administrator, to execute electronically all related documents for the FY2010 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program and to execute all necessary forms, documents and the resulting grant agreement as required by U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs.

SUMMARY: Palm Beach County is eligible to receive a direct award of \$287,336 for the following proposals: 1) the Public Defender Re-entry Program (REAP) for \$200,500; and 2) Gulfstream Goodwill Belle Glade Re-entry Program for \$86,836. There is no requirement for match with the JAG funds. Countywide (DW)

BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION: The JAG Program replaces the Byrne Grant formula and the Local Law Enforcement Block Grant with a single funding source. The purpose of the JAG Program is to provide local units of government with funds to underwrite projects to reduce crime and improve public safety. The Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) staff provides program oversight and grant administration. On May 24, 2010, the CJC members approved the recommendation made by the CJC Finance Committee for the FFY2010 JAG Funds. They voted to recommend submittal of the two grant program proposals. JAG funds may be expended over a 48-month period to use within general federally mandated purpose areas.

A public notification was listed on the CJC website and a public hearing is no longer mandated. The interest-bearing trust fund account required by the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) was established by the BCC on August 20, 1996, to deposit and disperse all federal payments received under this Block Grant Program. This is the fifteenth (15th) fiscal year in which the Bureau of Justice Assistance, US Department of Justice, is able to provide JAG/LLEBG funds through Congressional appropriations.





Narrative

Palm Beach County's Public Defender's Office has administered a reentry since 2002. Project R.E.A.P. (Recovery, Empowerment, Achievement and Prosperity) Success, staffed by a social worker and a job developer, strives to prepare county-sentenced inmates for a successful transition from jail to community. Staff works with the clients to assess their needs, meet as many pre-release needs as possible and establish connections to community services for meeting post-release needs. Services provided include: substance abuse and mental health counseling, drug treatment and rehabilitation, family reunification, identification, public benefits, etc.

The project works in tandem with other jail and community programs to augment services rather than duplicate efforts. The program would like the flexibility to place staff as needed throughout the county to support reentry in capacities deemed appropriate by the CJC Reentry Task Force.

Palm Beach County has a formal Task Force for Reentry established by the CJC to address coordination of efforts and identification of system improvements. The goal is to improve public safety for the community by assisting ex-offenders in becoming more stable and preventing their recidivism.

Narrative

The Public Defender's Office received funding in 2010 to hire a paralegal to provide reentry support. The paralegal assists ex-offenders in areas of sealing and expunging, probation termination and driver's license reinstatement. Additionally the paralegal position will provide assistance to those being released from State prison by researching for open criminal cases in other jurisdictions that can be cleared up prerelease. These efforts assist the ex-offender in eliminating legal barriers to successfully reintegrating into the community. The position is designed to be a support position for existing reentry service providers to call upon when a client has one of the needs provided by the paralegal.

In an effort to support the Reentry Task Force and provide for more effective and efficient reentry services, the CJC funded the position of Countywide Reentry Coordinator in 2009. The position is designed to facilitate coordination between county funded reentry efforts, assist the task force in the implementation of the five year strategic plan and identify any new opportunities or partnerships that will aid in the transition of the incarcerated back into their communities. To accomplish these tasks, the coordinator researches and disseminates appropriate information, supports the Task Force's subcommittee structure and provides a central point for service providers to help build collaboration and eliminate duplication of efforts.

Narrative 2011

Palm Beach County Gulf Stream Good Will Reentry Project

This reentry initiative with Good will moves into its fourth year. The purpose is to provide case management and support services to the formerly incarcerated from the western and coastal communities. These communities include Belle Glade, Pahokee, South Bay, Delray and West Palm Beach. Reentry is part of the overall prevention program of the Criminal Justice Commission. The strategy includes providing comprehensive services in communities which have a sizeable number of returning citizens. They have a disproportionate number of formerly incarcerated adults and juveniles in need of services. This is coupled with a large number of unemployed persons and a large number of high school dropouts and teenage parents. Good Will has been successful in providing these services throughout the state FL and in Palm Beach County. They are part of an overall countywide effort to bring evidence based services and results to clients. The overall outcome is to reduce the number of clients who return to jail thereby reducing the recidivism rate. In addition, increasing the employment rate is another long term outcome. They provide support to the Weed and Seed efforts as well as the County-wide Task Force.

Palm Beach County will contract with Goodwill for the following services: To provide case management which will includes assistance with health care and public assistance benefits. Many will need driver's license or identification assistance. Employment services will include the following: Job coaching, resume development and employment counseling will be provided.

Counseling will be offered for ex-offender's reentering the community. Counseling includes sessions such as anger management, substance abuse, batterer's intervention and peer support groups.

The following notification requirements were originally presented to the governing body and public as required by the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program FFY 2010 Local Solicitation. The 2010 allocation is \$287,336.

Governing Body Notification - 30 days before the application is submitted

Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) Finance Committee submitted the proposal of programs that would use Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) funds to the Criminal Justice Commission on Monday, May 24, 2010. They voted unanimously to approve the recommendation of the CJC Finance Committee.

On May 25, 2010, a letter was written to Burt Aaronson, Chair of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners. The letter explained the JAG Program, jurisdictions eligible and the plan to use the JAG funds. The following programs were allocated the JAG funds of \$287,336:

Public Defender Re-entry Program (REAP) \$200,500 Gulfstream Goodwill Belle Glade Re-entry Project \$86,836

The application was presented to the Chair of the Palm Beach County Board of County Commissioners (governing body) on June 21, 2010. The Commissioners will ratify the signature of the Chair on the application and the electronic submittal of the application.

Signature authority for this grant was delegated by the County Administrator or his designee to execute electronically all grant related documents and all necessary forms and documents required by the OJP.

Notification to the Public

The public notification was placed on the Palm Beach County Criminal Justice Commission's (CJC) website on April 13, 2010. The public was advised that the CJC would vote on May 24, 2010 regarding the use of the available JAG funds and the recommended programs and amounts were listed. The CJC phone number was posted on the website and the public was advised the phone with comments. The CJC meetings are advertised and also listed on the website. The agendas of the meetings are also publicized and the public is invited to attend.
