**Summary:** The Resident Education to Action Program (REAP) is a five (5) week, hands-on educational course on community revitalization and civic leadership development for residents and neighborhood organizations that are seeking to improve the quality of life within their communities. Remaining funds from REAP Fiscal Year 2009-2010 were carried forward to implement projects for REAP Fiscal Year 2010-2011. The Agreements being submitted represent the REAP projects selected by the OCR Director to receive grant funding.

**Background and Justification:** On September 13, 2005, the BCC authorized the OCR to make eligible for REAP grant funding all participating neighborhoods from both unincorporated Palm Beach County and municipalities. This fiscal year, the OCR implemented two (2) five (5) week REAP sessions. One session was conducted in the Glades/Lake Region from March 2<sup>nd</sup> through March 30<sup>th</sup> 2010, and the other session was held in central Palm Beach County from April 6<sup>th</sup> through May 4<sup>th</sup> 2010. The OCR Director is recommending grant funding for the implementation of sixteen (16) projects that were submitted for consideration as part of the community action plan developed during the five (5) week REAP session. This will be the fifth year, since the program's creation, that OCR seeks to financially assist the participating neighborhoods. A total of Twenty Three Thousand Two Hundred and Twenty Five Dollars (\$23,225) will be awarded in REAP grant funding if the grant agreements are approved by the BCC. All funds will be drawn from the general REAP Account.
