### I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

- A) adopt a Resolution authorizing the Clerk of the Board to disburse \$250,000 from the Vessel Registration Fee Trust Fund to cover the costs of two artificial reefs offshore of Jupiter and Juno Beach; and
- B) approve a Budget Transfer of \$250,000 in the Environmental Enhancement Non-Specific Fund from reserves to the Jupiter/Juno Artificial Reef Project.

**Summary:** The Resolution and Budget Transfer from County Vessel Registration Fees will provide the estimated \$250,000 to cover costs of the Jupiter Inlet and Juno Beach Artificial Reef Projects. Reef projects would include 1) the placement of approximately 750 tons of concrete in proximity to the Jupiter Inlet in 25-30 ft. of water and 2) installation of concrete poles into the ocean bottom in 20-25 ft. of water 500-1000' east of the Juno Beach Fishing Pier to create a "bait reef". Funding for these projects will come entirely from County Vessel Registration Fees. <u>District 1</u> (SF)

**Background and Justification:** The Board of County Commissioners enacted the Vessel Registration Fee Ordinance, No 88-40 that provides for the collection of boat registration fees. Fees are collected and deposited in the Vessel Registration Fee Trust Fund and utilized for saltwater and freshwater environmental enhancement and restoration projects. Disbursement of these funds shall only be made upon the approval of a resolution by the BCC authorizing the Clerk of the Board to disburse funds for a particular project.

Two artificial reef projects are proposed in northern Palm Beach County. The County holds a lease with Florida Power and Light for the use of the Riviera Beach Artificial Reef Staging Site. Our latest lease (R2005-1097) specifies that all concrete and limestone boulders currently stockpiled at the staging site be removed by September 2011 in preparation for the demolition and construction of the new power plant at this site. Currently, approximately 750 tons of miscellaneous concrete and rock need to be removed from the site and used to build artificial reefs. The offshore site selected to receive these materials is the Jupiter Inlet Mid-Water Reef Site in 25-30'of water. This reef will act as an intermediate habitat or "stepping stone" for migrating fish and shellfish species moving from the Loxahatchee River to the offshore reefs.

A second artificial reef will be the construction of a reef 500-1000 ft. offshore of the Juno Fishing Pier in 20-25' of water. The reef will consist of the vertical placement of concrete poles and pilings in groupings of 4-5 spread out over several thousand feet.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA TO UTILIZE A PORTION OF THE COUNTY VESSEL REGISTRATION FEES FOR CONSTRUCTING HABITAT ENHANCEMENT TO THE JUPITER INLET AND JUNO BEACH ARTIFICIAL REEF SITES.

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County enacted the Vessel Registration Fee Ordinance, No. 88-40 which began collecting fees June 1, 1989; and

WHEREAS, the Vessel Registration Fee Ordinance provides that monies collected from vessel registration fees be utilized to protect coastal marine and estuarine habitats, maintain and enhance fisheries and other salt and freshwater habitats, and construct artificial reefs; and

WHEREAS, Florida Power and Light has requested that the County initiate the removal of all materials stockpiled at the staging site in order to satisfy the terms of the lease agreement (R2005-1097); and

WHEREAS, approximately 750 tons of miscellaneous concrete materials and limestone boulders are currently stockpiled ant the Florida Power and Light (FPL) Artificial Reef Staging Site; and

WHEREAS, this material will be used to create an artificial reef, one mile northeast of the Jupiter Inlet in 25-30 feet of water, that will boost fisheries and marine life habitat and provide additional areas for diving, fishing and boating activities; and

WHEREAS, County staff has received all environmental permits and completed plans for constructing a reef approximately 500' east of the Juno Fishing Pier; and

WHEREAS, the work described for both projects is estimated to cost \$250,000 and will come from the County's Vessel Registration Fee Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Environmental Resources Management recommends that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the Clerk of the Board to disburse Vessel Registration Fee monies in the amount of \$250,000 to cover the costs of the two artificial reef projects situated offshore of Jupiter and Juno Beach.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY FLORIDA, THAT: Section 1: The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted and ratified. Section 2: The Board hereby authorizes the Clerk to disburse funds of \$250,000 for the environmental enhancement of Jupiter and Juno Beach Artificial Reef Projects. 
