I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to adopt: an Ordinance of the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, amending Sections 17-115 and 116 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances; codifying the "Tourist Development Ordinance" of Palm Beach County, Florida, Ordinance 95-30, as amended, providing for an amendment to the Tourist Development Plan relating to the expenditure of 'Bed Tax' revenues for the payment of debt service for bonds issued to finance the planning, design and construction of a professional sports franchise facility and a convention center and for the operation and maintenance of the convention center; providing for compliance with a revised code of ethics; providing for repeal of laws in conflict; providing for severability; providing for inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances; and providing for an effective date.

Summary: This Amendment to the TDC Ordinance authorizes the expenditure of TDC "bed tax" revenues for debt service payments for bonds issued for the planning, design and construction costs of the Roger Dean Stadium and Convention Center and operational costs of the Convention Center. These expenditures have been paid exclusively from 4th cent TDC revenues. However, due to declining "bed tax" receipts, it will be necessary, in order to meet these debt service obligations, to use revenues from the 1st cent as well. This Amendment also provides for a revised Code of Ethics. Countywide (MC)

Background and Policy Issues: On September 14, 2010, this Ordinance was approved by the Board of County Commissioners on preliminary reading and has been advertised in accordance with Florida Statutes. In 1997, the Board increased the Tourist Development Tax ("Bed Tax") from 3% to 4% to pay the debt service on bonds issued to finance the planning, design and construction costs of a professional sports franchise facility and convention center (Category I). Since that time one cent of the total "Bed Tax" revenues has been expended for those purposes.

Background and Policy Issues continued

In 2006, the Board levied an additional cent to provide for future improvements and repairs for the convention center (Category H). Since that time those revenues have been held in reserve for those purposes.

At the TDC Finance Committee meeting on December 14, 2009, forecasts were presented indicating that 4th cent revenues were declining and would not be sufficient to meet future obligations for the payment of the debt service for bonds issues for the Roger Dean Stadium and the Convention Center as well as operating costs for the Convention Center (Category I). The Finance Committee recommended to the TDC Board that revenues from the 1st cent, currently allocated only to Category H, be used to meet the future Category I expenses.

At the January 2010 TDC meeting, the Board unanimously approved amending the current TDC Ordinance to authorize the expenditure of the revenues from the 1st cent revenues to meet the future obligations of the Stadium and Convention Center beginning FY 2010-11.

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AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING SECTIONS 17-115 AND 116 OF THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES; CODIFYING THE DEVELOPMENT ORDINANCE" OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, ORDINANCE 95-30, AS AMENDED, PROVIDING FOR AN AMENDMENT TO THE TOURIST DEVELOPMENT PLAN RELATING TO THE EXPENDITURE OF 'BED TAX' REVENUES FOR THE PAYMENT OF DEBT SERVICE FOR BONDS ISSUED TO FINANCE THE PLANNING, DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF Α **PROFESSIONAL SPORTS** FRANCHISE FACILITY AND A CONVENTION CENTER AND FOR THE OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF CONVENTION CENTER; PROVIDING FOR COMPLIANCE WITH A REVISED CODE OF ETHICS; PROVIDING FOR REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

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WHEREAS, the "Local Option Tourist Development Act," Section 125.0104, Florida Statutes, authorizes the Board of County Commissioners (hereinafter "Board") to levy and impose a Tourist Development Tax or "Bed Tax" on the exercise within County boundaries of the privilege of renting for consideration any living quarters or accommodations in any hotel, motel, apartment, rooming house, mobile home park, recreational vehicle park or condominium for a term of six (6) months or less; and

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WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority established in that statute, the Board enacted Ordinance 95-30, which has been amended from time to time and is codified in Section 17-111 through 17-116 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances relating to Palm Beach County, Florida Government, which Ordinance levied a five percent (5%) tourist development tax for certain permissible uses as set forth in the statute; and

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WHEREAS, the Ordinance established the Tourist Development Plan (hereinafter referred to as "Plan") which establishes the specific "Categories" of uses and allocation of "Bed Tax" revenues; and

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WHEREAS, the County wishes to amend the "Plan" to provide that "Category H" be amended to include the payment of the debt service for bonds issued to finance the construction and design and planning costs of a

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professional sports franchise facility and a convention center and to pay the operation and maintenance costs of a convention center; and

WHEREAS, the Board hereby finds and determines that the "Plan" revisions set forth in this Ordinance are in the best interest of Palm Beach County and Palm Beach County tourism.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, that:

Section 1: Sec. 17-115. Tourist development council, (e) Compliance with code of ethics, is amended to read as follows:

(e) Compliance with code of ethics. Council members shall be governed by the applicable provisions of the Palm Beach County Code of Ethics, Ordinance 2009-051, as it may be amended and as codified in Article XIII, Sections 2-441 through 2-448 of the Code of Laws and Ordinances

Section 2: Sec. 17-116. Tourist development plan, (b) Use and allocation of tax revenues, is amended to read as follows:

- (b) Use and allocation of tax revenues: The following categories of use of each individual percent of the bed tax are set forth below in Section (1) with the percentage of the total amount of yearly revenue to be expended for, or credited to, each category, subject to the provisions of subsection (3) of this section 17-116, as set forth in subsection (2):
 - (1) Categories of use:
 - a. Category A: Promote and advertise county tourism in the state and nationally and internationally, including the provision of a convention and visitors bureau.
 - b. Category B: Provide for cultural and fine and non-fine arts entertainment, festivals, programs, and activities which directly promote county tourism.

- c. Category C: Provide for beach improvement, maintenance, renourishment, restoration, and erosion control with an emphasis on dune restoration where possible.
- d. Category D: Provide for film and television marketing and development activities which directly promote county tourism.
- e. Category E: Provide for special major projects and events which directly further, advance, improve, promote and generate county tourism: To be selected and funded pursuant to subsection (c) of this section.
- f. Category F: Provide for the operation and maintenance of a convention center. To be funded pursuant to subsection (c) of this section.
- Gategory G: Attract, stimulate, market, and execute sports events and activities in order to promote the county nationally and internationally as a sports destination, including the financing of the construction of Blum Stadium, a sports stadium, all of which promote county tourism.

h. Category H:

- 1. Construct, extend, enlarge, remodel, repair, and/or improve a convention center;
- 2. Debt service relating to bonds issued to finance the construction of a professional sports franchise facility and a convention center and the planning and design costs incurred prior to the issuance of such bonds; and
- 3. Operation and maintenance costs of a convention center.

i. Category I:

- 1. Debt service relating to bonds issued to finance the construction of professional sports franchise facilities and a convention center; and
- 2. The planning and design costs incurred prior to the issuance of such bonds; and

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3. The operation and maintenance cost of a convention center for ten (10) years.

Section 3. Repeal of Laws in Conflict:

All local laws and ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. Savings Clause:

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, all provisions of Palm Beach County Code Section 17.111 through 17.116, codifying Palm Beach County Ordinance No. 95-30, as amended, are specifically preserved and remain in full force and effect for the limited purpose of enforcing any alleged violations of said Code which occurred prior to its repeal or amendment.

Section 5. Severability:

If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

Section 6. Inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances:

The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Palm Beach County Code. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or relettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

Section 7. Enforcement:

This Ordinance is enforceable by all means provided by law. Additionally the County may choose to enforce this Ordinance by seeking injunctive relief in the Circuit Court of Palm Beach County.

Section 8. Penalty:

Any violation of any portion of this Ordinance shall be punishable as provided by law.
