I. **EXECUTIVE BRIEF**

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Budget Transfer of \$220,879 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2011 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The current State LETF balance is \$2,307,161. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$2,086,282. The year-to-date transfer for all donations after approval of this item is \$220,879. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. - Organization Purpose: The mission of Alzheimer's Community Care is to promote and provide specialized quality compassionate care to Alzheimer's disease and related disorders patients and caregivers within a community-based environment.
- 3. Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded: Alzheimer's Community Care is requesting funding to help support the Alzheimer's 24-Hour Crisis Line (800 394-1771). The Crisis Line serves all of Palm Beach County and is staffed by registered nurses who specialize in dementia. There is a nurse on call 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. There are 48,000 people with Alzheimer's disease in the county, and 60% of are at risk for wandering and becoming lost. As the result of the disease, they become disoriented in familiar surroundings and are unable to find their way home. This is a very dangerous situation, as they are unable to take care of themselves. Other situations that may arise with dementia patients are reports of shoplifting, erratic driving or domestic assault. In each of these cases, chances are that law enforcement will be called. The 24-Hour Crisis Line connects law enforcement with a nurse specializing in dementia who can assist with the situation and help to avoid an inappropriate arrest or Baker Act. In addition, Alzheimer's Community Care provides quarterly education in dementia and dementia-specific crisis intervention to the Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) to assist first responders in working with individuals with possible dementia.
- 4. What results are you committed to achieving? 1) Respond to crisis calls from the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office within 15 minutes, and assist deputies by providing crisis intervention via telephone or on-site. 2) Provide quarterly dementia training for CIT.

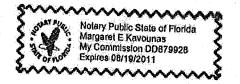

- 3. Organization Purpose: The mission of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Palm Beach County is to inspire and assist all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens.
- 4. Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded: The program to be funded is for services provided to the teen population in Belle Glade at our Teen Center, which is located at 350 S.W. 10th Street and Martin Luther King Boulevard. The Boys & Girls Club's Teen Center is open when teens need a safe haven during those critical hours after school and when school is not in session. The Center is open from 2:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. each day after school and from 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on those days when school is not in session. The Club is also open for evening programs and on Saturdays for a variety of special events. Without the Club, the vast majority of these young people would spend those hours in unsupervised situations and statistically be far more likely to become involved in negative behaviors such as drug and/or alcohol abuse, gang involvement or other criminal activities, premature sexual activity, truancy and poor academic performance. Currently, the Teen Center serves more than 350 teenagers each year and provides a wide variety of programs such as: Education and Career Exploration; The Arts; Sport, Fitness and Recreation; Citizenship and Leadership; Health and Life Skills; and Technology. These

funds would be used to provide these young people with a host of caring adult role models and highly acclaimed programs to help them succeed. Exhibit "A" Attached & Included.

5. What results are you committed to achieving? The Boys & Girls Clubs is committed to keeping young people out of trouble with the law and in school. In addition to providing a safe, supervised and educational haven with caring adult role models, the Club provides an array of opportunities which help youth improve their academic performance. As youth who are significantly behind in school are much more likely to drop out, the Club works closely with the youth who are in need of academic assistance and provides certified teachers to work with them. Club staff members also provide encouragement and incentives for the youth. Attendance is tracked as well as reading and math FCAT scores, reading Lexile scores and school attendance. The Club experience does work as statistically, our young people stay in school longer, graduate at a much higher rate and outperform their same school peers.

SMART Moves

The nationally acclaimed SMART Moves (Skills Mastery and Resistance Training) prevention/education program addresses problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity. The program uses a team approach involving Club staff, peer leaders, parents and community representatives. More than simply emphasizing a "Say No" message, the program teaches young people ages 6 to 15 how to say no by involving them in discussion and role-playing, practicing resistance and refusal skills, developing assertiveness, strengthening decision-making skills and analyzing media and peer influence. The ultimate goal is to promote abstinence from substance abuse and adolescent sexual involvement through the practice of responsible behavior.

SMART Leaders

This is a booster program to SMART Moves. This program keeps teens involved in the SMART Moves program by reinforcing skills and knowledge youth learned in SMART Moves and prepares teens as leaders to help their peers resist using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs, and postpone sexual activity.

SMART Girls

An outgrowth of the effective SMART Moves program, SMART Girls is a small-group health, fitness, prevention/education and self-esteem enhancement program designed to meet the developmental needs of girls ages 8-12 and 13-17. Through dynamic sessions, highly participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own and societal attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good healthcare and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.

Passport to Manhood

Passport to Manhood promotes and teaches responsibility while reinforcing positive behavior in male Club members ages 11 to14. Passport to Manhood consists of 14 small-group sessions, each of which concentrates on a specific aspect of manhood through highly interactive activities. Each participant is issued his own "Passport" to underscore the idea that he is on a journey of maturation and personal growth. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young boys in discussion activities that reinforce positive behavior. Passport to Manhood is a complement to SMART Girls.

Date SMART

This program, for members ages 13 to 18, is a supplement to SMART Girls and Passport to Manhood. Through fun and easy-to-use sessions, members learn how to achieve mutually supportive relationships free of violence and abuse. The program also encourages youth to become community advocates for relationships that promote equality and respect while combating the attitudes and behaviors that lead to dating, sexual and domestic violence.

Bullying Hurts

This program is a community service program that focuses on positive youth development and prevention of the anti-social behavior of bullying in schools and communities. Understanding the importance of role models, mentors and the idea that youth just naturally learn from their peers, the Bullying Hurts Program is presented to elementary grade children by more mature students who are members of high school youth groups in their local area. Equipped with workbooks, videos, posters and their own bullying stories, the high school students work with the younger students teaching them what bullying is and how to deal with bullying in their classrooms and communities. As both groups grow more familiar with each other the high school students become mentors of their younger peers giving them the confidence and tools they will need to seek out support to deal with bullying.

Teen Time Survivor Skills

This Planned Parenthood sponsored program has 10 modules: introduction to sexuality including sex vs. sexuality; reproductive anatomy and physiology; human growth and development including puberty, hygiene, body image and self-esteem; personal skills including communications, values and decision making; abstinence and sexual health including preventing sexual risk-taking; relationships; disease prevention; teen pregnancy prevention; cultural and societal impact on teen sexuality; and a review of what the Club members have learned.

Meth Awareness

The lethal scourge of methamphetamine abuse is spreading across the country and affects us all. "Meth" is a powerful, highly addictive stimulant that is cheap and easy to produce. It is the nation's fastest growing drug threat. Our Clubs participated in National Meth Awareness Day on November 30, 2008. This was a collaboration with local agencies and residents to raise awareness about Meth abuse and its terrible effects among all members of our community.

- 2. Organization Purpose: The Lord's Place is dedicated to breaking the cycle of homelessness by providing innovative, compassionate, and effective services to men, women, and children in our community.

We are a solution-focused agency. We constantly research 'best practice' programs throughout the nation and selectively incorporate components of these programs into our cohesive range of services tailored to the needs of our community and clients. Through our system of 'benchmarking,' we evaluate the outcomes of our programs to ascertain that we are changing lives. Our continuous quality improvement philosophy acts as a foundation to review our delivery of services so that we can offer stronger, more effective programs.

3. Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

For the past two years, over 26 partnering agencies, including representation from the Palm Beach Sherriff office, participated in an 18 month planning process to address ex-offenders' needs in Palm Beach County. The outcome of this process was the development of a new community-based pilot project, "The Transition from Jail to Community (TJC) Project." The TJC Project has developed strategic partnerships between local agencies that will address gaps in services in jail re-entry in South Florida. The pilot will explore a multitude of needs, including housing, physical and mental healthcare, substance abuse recovery, employment, education, financial literacy, rights restoration, and family reunification. It will also align and systemically reform existing services so that ex-offenders receive seamless services which in turn will reduce the rate of recidivism in our community. The project will serve up to 50 men each year.

Thousands of people return to our community from the Palm Beach County jail every year. These individuals face enormous difficulties finding housing, securing employment, and reconnecting with their families. A significant number continue to experience substance abuse

and mental health problems, which are often principal factors underlying involvement with crime. Many of these individuals will be rearrested and sentenced for new misdemeanor and low level felony offenses. This cycle of incarceration and release involving large numbers of mostly male offenders is increasingly concentrated in a small number of neighborhoods. These are the same neighborhoods in which many hard-working families remain relatively disconnected from the economic opportunities enjoyed by the community at large.

The TJC Program is represents a community's belief in gathering to break the cycle of incarceration and create a healthier and safer place to live and thrive. The Palm Beach Sheriff's Office (PBSO) operates one of the largest correctional systems in the nation, with an average daily population (ADP) of nearly 3,000 inmates in its three adult detention facilities and forecasted growth to 3,530 inmates by the year 2015. Approximately 17% of the ADP receive some form of mental health services, 4% (of the 17%) are taking medication for some type of mental health disorder, 2% (80 inmates) with SPMI, schizophrenia, or developmental disabilities are housed in one of four mental health units and approximately 80% of inmates housed in the County jail also have a substance abuse disorder.

Furthermore, over 2,400 individuals are incarcerated on any given day due to substance abuse problems. While the average length of stay for inmates in the general population is 33 days, those with mental health problems average 60 days in a setting not designed to meet their chronic needs. For many individuals unable to access care in the community, the only options to receive treatment is by accessing care through some of the most costly and inefficient points of entry into the healthcare delivery system including emergency rooms, acute crisis services, and ultimately the juvenile and criminal justice systems.

The TJC will work through a key alignment of networked, local agencies and providers to develop a cohesive and cost-efficient approach to this issue. Upon incarceration, the client will be given a battery of assessments, including education, mental and physical health, as well as program readiness. The client will then be assigned a re-entry coach, whose focus is to mentor the client prior to release, set up a personal plan for transition back into the community, and then administer the plan directly with the client upon release through the point of stability. Key areas of assistance will include physical and mental healthcare, as well as substance abuse recovery, housing, employment, education, finances/benefits, rights restoration, and family reunification.

Recently, this project has been awarded a four year national grant from the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation(RWJF). RWJF is funding \$125,000 per year with another \$125,000 from community funders. Support from the Palm Beach County Sherriff's Office Law Enforcement Trust Fund Donation will be used as a portion of the matching gifts. Currently, community funders committed to this initiative includes Department of Children and Family, the Quantum Foundation, Palm Health Care Foundation and Workforce Alliance.



- 3. What results are you committed to achieving? The ultimate goal of this project is to reduce recidivism and increase safety in our community, especially in the South portion of the County. Specific outcomes include:
 - 1. At least 80% of all clients will stay out of jail, for the duration of the grant and beyond.
 - 2. All participants will be assessed, assigned a plan of action toward personal success, with at least 80% of clients maintaining the course of action through the duration of the grant and beyond.
 - 3. Existing "silo" oriented re-entry programs around the county will be aligned, more cost effective, and the pilot will expand to encompass at least 2 additional communities by the end of the grant.
 - 4. Comprehensive data collection and evaluation process will assist in highlighting needed systemic reform in the delivery of services to incarcerated individuals.
