I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: A) ratify the signature of Chair Aaronson on a Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) grant application submitted to the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) on September 28, 2010, requesting \$200,000 for the John Prince Memorial Park Phase II Improvements project; B) authorize the County Administrator or his designee to execute the grant project Agreement and all future time extensions, task assignments, certifications, standard forms, or amendments to the Agreement that do not change the scope of work or terms and conditions of the Agreement if the grant is approved; and C) authorize the Director of the Parks and Recreation Department to serve as Liaison Agent with DEP for this project.

Summary: This Grant Application requests \$200,000 from FRDAP for the John Prince Memorial Park Phase II Improvements project. The project is located in the Mound's Circle area of the park, and project elements include a new restroom, picnic facilities, playground, fishing pier, bike trail, dog park, landscaping and parking, as well as renovation of the existing picnic facilities, bike trail and parking. The total project cost identified in this grant application is \$400,000. The requested grant is for \$200,000, and requires a \$200,000 match, which will be funded from Zone 2 Park Impact Fees. Only grant funding will be used for the renovation portions of the project. If the grant is awarded, and once the project is complete, the grant project agreement requires a Notice of Limitation of Use to be recorded in public records limiting the project site to outdoor recreation for the use and benefit of the public in perpetuity as part of the close-out documentation. <u>District 3</u> (AH)

Background and Justification: John Prince Park is a 727-acre County park located around the shores of Lake Osborne. The land was donated to Palm Beach County in 1939, and the park opened to the public in 1952, making it the County's oldest regional park. Lake Osborne is part of Palm Beach County's Chain of Lakes, which stretches 30 linear miles and provides excellent boating and fishing opportunities. The Mound's Circle area of John Prince Memorial Park is located on the north side of 6th Avenue South. The majority of the improvements in this portion of the park are over 30 years old, and are in need of updating. The County would like to renovate the Mound's Circle portion of the park in several phases as funding permits.

FRDAP grants are provided by DEP, and the State's time frame for this application did not allow for prior approval by the Board of County Commissioners. In order to meet the grant application submission deadline, Commissioner Burt Aaronson, Chair, signed the application on behalf of the Board of County Commissioners, as authorized by PPM CW-F-003 (Policy B.3). The PPM requires that the grant be presented to the Board of County Commissioners for approval at the next available Board meeting after signature by the Board Chairperson.

John Prince Park is a 727-acre County Park located around the shores of Lake Osborne. The land was donated to Palm Beach County in 1939 and the park opened to the public in 1952, making it the County's oldest Regional Park. One of the areas centrally located in the park is known as Mound's Circle. Many of the amenities in the Mound's Circle area are original construction and are sorely in the need of updating. Lake Osborne is part of Palm Beach County's Chain of Lakes, which stretched 30 linear miles and provides excellent boating and fishing opportunities. The County would like to renovate the Mound's Circle portion of the park in several phases as funding permits. New amenities will be resource based and will be designed to take advantage of the water view as well as the cooling breezes from Lake Osborne.

Lake Osborne appears on historic State of Florida survey maps as early as 1845. There are no known archeological resources on the project site. The site was conveyed to Palm Beach County by the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Fund of the State of Florida in 1939 for park and forestry purposes.



The project is consistent with the following issues and goals outlined in the Outdoor Recreation in Florida 2008 manual:

<u>Outdoor Recreation in Florida, 2008, 6-5</u> recognizes the importance of nature-based tourism in Florida including fishing, hunting, paddling, boating and nature viewing.

John Prince Park is a 727 acre County Park located around the shores of Lake Osborne, and is the County's oldest Regional Park. Lake Osborne is part of Palm Beach County's Chain-of-Lakes which consists of five interconnected lake systems covering a linear distance of approximately 30 miles. Lake Osborne's 380-acres provide habitat for a wide variety of wildlife including large mouth bass, bluegill, speckled perch, catfish, egrets, herons, cormorant, wood storks, osprey, alligators, turtles, foxes, armadillos, and raccoons. The County has completed several habitat restoration projects in John Prince Memorial Park involving removing exotic vegetation and replanting with native species. The John Prince Memorial Park Phase IV project includes construction of a canoe/kayak launch and will also provide fresh water fishing opportunities along the shoreline of Lake Osborne.

Outdoor Recreation in Florida, 2008, 7-8

Public park and recreation agencies should continue to work with local planning, growth management and greenway and trail programs to improve the ability of Floridians to walk and bicycle to work, school and other daily activities, and to provide public outdoor recreation opportunities."

The Palm Beach County Parks and Recreation Department has been working closely with the Palm Beach County Metropolitan Planning Organization – Bicycle/Greenway/Pedestrian Advisory Committee to include John Prince Memorial Park in the County's Master Bicycle Plan and the City of Lake Worth's Master Bicycle Plan. The Parks and Recreation Department is looking at potential funding to widen existing multi-purpose paths to 12 feet, as well as creating additional internal pathways along the water. The Department is also working with the County's Engineering Department to develop bike paths and sidewalks to connect nearby neighborhood to the park.

I. CALL TO ORDER/ROLL CALL

MR. OFFORD called the September 9, 2010 meeting to order at 9:10 A.M. The roll call was made by MR. BARONAK. A quorum was present as depicted on page two of these minutes.

II. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

MR. OFFORD inquired if there were any additions, deletions or changes to the agenda.

A motion was made by MR. HOWE to adopt the September 9, 2010 agenda; seconded by MS. PUERTA. The motion carried unanimously.

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

MR. OFFORD inquired if there were any additions, deletions or changes to the July 8, 2010 minutes.

A motion was made by MS. MATTHEWS approve the July 8, 2010 minutes; seconded by MS. PUERTA. The motion carried unanimously.

IV. PUBLIC COMMENT OPPORTUNITY

There were none.

V. OLD BUSINESS

A. Transportation Enhancement Program - Eligibility Review

MR. BARONAK received comments from FDOT on the West Palm Beach and EMR projects. MR. BARONAK said in regards to Boca's projects ranked 6th and 7th in consecutive order, the Patch Reef Trail (ranked 6th) and 13th Street and 12th Avenue (ranked 7th), the City has decided to forfeit the ranking of the Patch Reef Trail and move up their 13th Street and 12th Avenue bike lane project. Originally those projects were "out of the money" but given this situation with the Parks Department, FDOT said that the John Prince Park project (#1 ranked project) is ineligible because they are cited it has just a recreational project that only serves the existing park facility and does not contribution to the overall transportation network. The Parks Department and MS. MATTHEWS are aware of this and a lengthy letter has been sent to FDOT stating their case as to why this project should be eligible. Thus far, there has been no reply from FDOT.

MS. MATTHEWS commented that she strongly believes this is a transportation project because there are so many low income residential areas surrounding John Prince Parks. These areas are among the poorest in Palm Beach County with many residents not having access to cars. She said that residents nearby are able to travel through John Prince Park to get to Palm Beach State College, JF Kennedy Medical Center and Lantana Airport. Riding a bike or walking through the Park provides a safe alternative versus traveling busy thoroughfares including Congress Avenue, Lake Worth Road or 6th. The Palm Beach County Parks and Recreation Department's Administration building and main maintenance compound are located in the Park and have over 230 employees reporting for work. It is one of the largest employment centers in Palm Beach County. Many employees ride Palm Tran or Tri Rail to get to work and then walk or ride their bikes from the bus stop or train station to their work location. The proposed project includes pathway connecting to Palm Tran bus stops to the maintenance and administration buildings.

MR. BARONAK said if the above mentioned project remains ineligible, West Palm's project that was previously partially funded based on where it ranked, would become fully funded; then Boca Raton's project would get partial funding (approximately \$370,000).

MR. BARONAK said we are awaiting FDOT's decision on the John Prince Park project. MR. BARONAK voiced his frustration because the Committee ranked this project #1 and it is now being deemed ineligible. What bothers him is it takes into question the Committee's scoring process. MR. BARONAK indicated that changes may have to be made to the scoring process in the future.

A discussion ensued.

MR. PALACIOS arrived at 9:15 a.m.

B. PBC Bicycle Master Plan Update

MR. BARONAK said progress continues to be made. MS. PUERTA, MESSRS. HANSEN, PALACIOS AND SABIN have attended steering committee meetings. Recommendations have been developed. A table of road segments has been created and will be categorized to make them more meaningful. MR. BARONAK said in October he will give a complete presentation to the Committee of where we are with the plan and will have a clearer idea of priorities, policies and recommendations. Base mapping suitable map for the County is currently being worked on. Level of Service information has been worked out and all the information that goes along with that which will serve as the foundation for the new bicycle suitability map. Different "pilot corridors" around the County that identify some road corridors that have unique configurations related to bicycle access have been identified. The consultants came up with different recommendations for those corridors. MS. PUERTA had some of concerns regarding the consultants findings in Boca Raton and the consultants are responding to her concems.

MR. BARONAK described some of these corridors. Next month he will go into more detail.

MR. BARONAK hopes to have a draft of the plan by late next month and gave the schedule for presentation and completion of the plan.

MR. BARONAK responded that the Plan relates a great deal to what our County Engineers will be undertaking in the development of future roadway projects. They had some concern about how much weight this plan will affect their decision making process, and to what extent it will dictate or recommend what they should or shall incorporate in the projects for bicycle accessibility

MR. BARONAK said a meeting will be scheduled with George Webb, Randy Whitfield and Dan Weisberg to discuss how the Bicycle Master Plan will relate to the County Engineering Department. MR. BARONAK is confident that a plan to be adopted will be used as a tool for guidance when developing the multi-modal aspect of transportation projects.

A discussion ensued.

C. BGPAC Membership

MR. BARONAK said that a couple of members can no longer serve on the BGPAC because they left their current positions or changed jobs. MS. SKAKANDY has been promoted and can no longer serve on the Committee and MS. WHITFIELD, who represented the Health Department, moved to the School District. MR. BARONAK has talked to the School District about who they want to appoint to the BGPAC. Randall Granberry's name was recommended.

He was a member of this Committee sometime ago, but his attendance record was below average. For one full year, he did not attend meetings. MR. BARONAK received a phone call from Mr. Granberry's boss who wants him to again serve on this committee. MR. BARONAK faxed over his attendance record, but she assured MR. BARONAK that Mr. Granberry does want to be on the BGPAC and that he would attend the meetings. She added that Mr. Granberry is now in charge of "Safe Routes to School" funding, obtained by the District, and because of this responsibility he wants to serve again and use the BGPAC as an advisory group to help him along as he works to develop the "Safe Routes to School" project.

MR, BARONAK had requested that MS. WHITFIELD continue as a member and Mr. Granberry be the alternative. After continued discussion, it was decided that Mr. Granberry would be the member and Ms. Whitfield would serve as the alternate. MR. BARONAK agreed but said they would be tracking his attendance closely. MR. BARONAK said that even though Mr. Granberry would attend as the member, Ms. Whitfield planned to attend also.

MR. BARONAK is still waiting to hear back from the Sheriff's office on getting a replacement for MR. PRICE who no longer attends Committee meetings. Mr. Baronak mentioned that Ms. Whitfield, formerly of the Palm Beach County Health Department gave him the names of a few people at the Health Department who may want to serve on the BGPAC. Ms. Whitfield will be starting as an alternate member of the BGPAC, given her new position with PBC School District.

MS. MATTHEWS commented that she has worked with Mr. Granberry in the past and spoke positively on Mr. Granberry's membership.

MR. OFFORD asked MR. BARONAK what is the attendance policy. MR. BARONAK replied that when a member misses three meetings in a row then a letter is sent notifying the member that they need to start attending and if they do not respond to that request, then they are asked to resign from the Committee.

Fiscal Administration Changes to Transportation Enhancement Grant D.

MR. BARONAK this issue was discussed with FDOT in July clarifying how they are centralizing the fiscal decisions and administration of the Enhancement Program (i.e. money that is not spent and will go back to Tallahassee with no guarantee that the funds will be returned to District IV. MR, BARONAK said a motion was made and approved at the July meeting about writing a letter to FDOT from the MPO regarding this issue. MR. BARONAK said that shortly after the July BGPAC there was going to be a MPOAC meeting in Orlando that Mr. Whitfield attends. MR. BARONAK said this may be a better venue to discuss this issue because all the MPO directors would be there to talk about it. MR. BARONAK said it was brought up at this meeting and FDOT in Tallahassee is aware that around the state the MPO directors are concerned that his money is not going to remain local and go back to Tallahassee and that the local control is "lost". MR. BARONAK said that tomorrow, September 10th, is the Policy and Technical Subcommittee meeting of the MPOAC. The enhancement funding issue is on the agenda for that meeting. MR. BARONAK reported to the Committee that this issue is being pushed from the state-wide level and hopefully FDOT will look more seriously at this and perhaps change their position. MR. BARONAK said the people who administer the program at the local level are much more knowledgeable about the enhancement/LAP process than many of the staffers in Tallahassee and he has heard this directly from the people who work at the District level. MR. BARONAK said that hopefully with the continuing push around the state from the MPOs that we can get some resolution and get control at the local level.

MR. BARONAK will learn from Mr. Whitfield what transpired at the MPOAC meeting.

A discussion ensued.

VI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Palm Beach County Parks – Presentation on Application for Funding Okeechobee Park South and John Prince Park Projects

Jean Matthews, Senior Planner with Palm Beach County Parks and Recreation Department presented the Committee with an overview of two proposed park improvement projects, for which she will be applying for Florida Recreation Development Assistance Program (FRDAP) funding to assist in financing the projects. The first, Okeechobee Park South, is centrally located in Palm Beach County. Ms. Matthews reviewed the site plan and proposed improvements which include new car/trailer parking, boat ramp, beach area, restroom, picnic facilities, playground, volleyball court, fishing pier, canoe/kayak launch and renovation of the multi-purpose path. The project was well received.

The second project is located in John Prince Memorial Park. Improvements include a new dog park, fishing pier, restroom, playground, volleyball court, and renovation of the parking, picnic facilities, and bike trail. John Prince Memorial Park is a multi-phase development project.

Ms Matthews thanked the Committee for their attention and the opportunity to present this information.

VII. COORDINATOR'S REPORT

MR. BARONAK informed the members that Barbara Handrahan will be leaving her current position at FDOT in October. She will no longer be our primary point person for the LAP and Enhancement programs. She is transferring to another position within the FDOT. MR. BARONAK said Ms. Handrahan has been of been a great help to this committee and he asked if the Committee wanted to draft a letter of appreciation/certificate.

A motion was made by MS. ARNOLD to send a letter or certificate of appreciation to Barbara Handrahan; seconded by MS. CHANNON. The motion carried unanimously.

VIII. MEMBERS' COMMENTS

MS. MATTHEWS said she received an Email from "Bikes Rails to Trails" saying that Federal Transportation dollars coming to Florida, that are dedicated to Bicycle and Pedestrian Projects, which would include Transportation Enhancement Funds, are endanger of being cut due to fiscal decision-making at the Federal level.

MR. BARONAK said he was glad she brought this up and he will be working with Mr. Whitfield so that the MPO can get the word out regarding our concern.

IX. ADJOURNMENT

A motion was made by MS. PUERTA to adjourn the meeting; seconded by MR. HOWE. The motion carried unanimously





Visits Per Year





Recreation Activities





Satisfaction with Facilities





Proposed Dog Park




5. How often do you use Lake Osborne, Lake Ida or Square Lake for fishing or boating?

Fishing/Boating Frequency of Use







PALM BEACH COUNTY PARKS RECREATION DEPARTMENT ORGANIZATIONAL CHART FY 2010










Palm Beach County Park 1 Recreation Department Special Facinges Division Organizational Chart FY 2010


