I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to:

A) approve Contract with Shoreline Foundation, Inc. in the amount of \$1,547,615.18 for the construction of the Snook Islands Public Use Facilities within the City of Lake Worth, Project No. 2010ERM02 for a period of 290 calendar days;

B) adopt a Resolution authorizing the Clerk of the Board to disburse \$150,000 from the Vessel Registration Fee Trust Fund to cover the costs of artificial reef portion of the public use facilities; C) approve a Budget Transfer of \$150,000 in vessel registration fees in the Environmental Enhancement Non-Specific Fund from reserves to the Snook Islands Public Use Facility Project; and

D) approve a Budget Transfer of \$80,000 in the Natural Areas Fund from reserves to the Snook Islands Public Use Facility Project.

Summary: This project includes the removal of a portion of the "old" Lake Worth Bridge to create an artificial reef, construction of a fishing pier, boardwalk and shade shelter, floating docks, kayak launch, seawall, as well as roadway and upland improvements at Snook Islands Natural Area in Lake Worth. Three (3) eligible bids were received for this project. A bid protest delayed this construction procurement for one (1) month. Shoreline Foundation, Inc., a Broward County company with 15% of the work to be performed by a Palm Beach County subcontractor, was the lowest responsive, responsible bidder with a bid that exceeds the established 15% Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal with 15.2% participation. The approval of resolution and budget transfers will provide \$230,000 to cover costs of the artificial reef component of the project and other ancillary costs for an estimated total project cost of \$1,610,651. Remaining funding comes from Florida Inland Navigation District (FIND) and the \$25M Parks and Cultural Facilities 2003 Bond Fund. District 3 (JM)

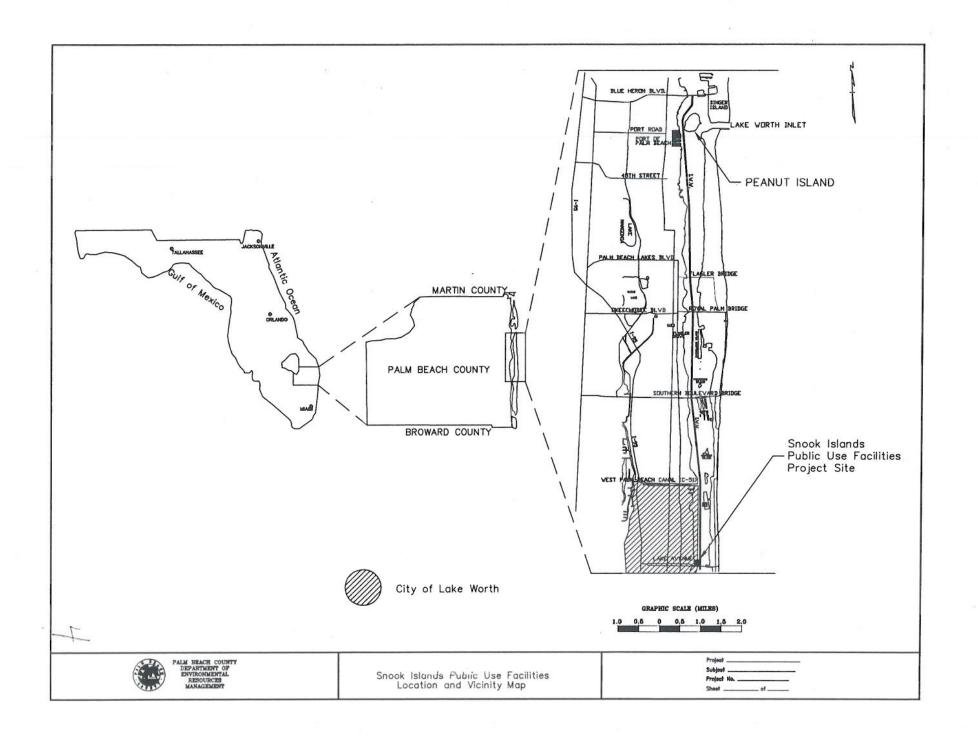

Background and Justification: The Snook Islands Natural Area (SINA) was completed in 2005 resulting in the creation of 100 acres of wetlands including seagrasses, mangroves, smooth cord grasses and oyster reefs. The \$17,5000,000 project costs were covered by many agencies namely: the Florida Inland Navigation District, Untied States Army Corps of Engineers, Florida Department of Environmental Protection, City of Lake Worth and Palm Beach County.

On September 11, 2007, the City of Lake Worth and Palm Beach County approved a lease agreement (R2007-1539) authorizing the County to manage the SINA site on City-owned lands. On April 7, 2009, an amendment to the lease (R2009-0570) was approved that extended the term of the lease to 99 years. The lease agreement included the construction of a public use facility to provide access to the SINA project.

Bids for constructing this public use facility were received through the Department of Environmental Resources Management by the Board of County Commissioners on November 23, 2010. The Contract time is 290 calendar days. There are federal requirements for the floating docks due to MPO funding from Florida Department of Transportation/U.S. Department of Transportation/Federal Highway Administration, which has reimbursed the County 100% for ERM expenses. The Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) goal associated with the floating docks is 8.18%.

A portion of the funds for this project came from outside sources including \$130,000 from a Metropolitan Planning Organization grant (R2008-1507) for designs and plans and \$559,575 from a Florida Inland Navigation District Waterway Assistance Program grant (R2008-2219) for designs and construction.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA TO UTILIZE A PORTION OF THE COUNTY VESSEL REGISTRATION FEES FOR CONSTRUCTING AN ARTIFICIAL REEF AT THE SNOOK ISLANDS NATURAL AREA.

WHEREAS, Palm Beach County enacted the Vessel Registration Fee Ordinance, No. 88-40 which began collecting fees June 1, 1989; and

WHEREAS, the Vessel Registration Fee Ordinance provides that monies collected from vessel registration fees be utilized to protect coastal marine and estuarine habitats, maintain and enhance fisheries and other salt and freshwater habitats, and construct artificial reefs; and

WHEREAS, the County and City of Lake Worth entered into a lease agreement (R2007-1539; R2009-0570) to manage the 100 acre Snook Island Natural Area and the construction of a public use facility within the southern portion of the site; and

WHEREAS, the public use facility includes the removal of a portion of the old Lake Worth Bridge and making an artificial reef; and

WHEREAS, approximately 2300 tons of bridge materials consisting of concrete pilings, bridge spans and railings will be removed and placed within a designated artificial reef site north of the planned public use facility; and

WHEREAS, this material will be used to create ledges and fish habitat within the vicinity of the planned fishing pier and floating docks in 10-15 ft. of water; and

WHEREAS, the costs to remove the old bridge and place within the designated reef location is estimated to cost \$150,000, including contingencies, and will come from the County's Vessel Registration Fee Trust Fund; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Environmental Resources Management recommends that the Board of County Commissioners authorize the Clerk of the Board to disburse Vessel Registration Fee monies in the amount of \$150,000 to cover the costs of the artificial reef project.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY

COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY FLORIDA, THAT:

Section 1: The foregoing recitals are hereby adopted and ratified.

Section 2: The Board hereby authorizes the Clerk to disburse funds of \$150,000 for the construction of an artificial reef project.
