I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: Consultant Services Authorization (CSA) No. 1 with Leo A. Daly Company (R2011-0112) in the amount of \$199,767 for design services for Main Detention Center Video Visitation System.

Summary: On April 25, 2006, the Board approved the Jail Expansion Program II (JEP) which includes the implementation of a Video Visitation System (VVS). The public will use the new Central Video Visitation Center adjacent to the Stockade to visit with inmates at the new West Detention Center and the Main Detention Center on Gun Club Road. CSA No. 1 authorizes design services for the final phase which is the installation of inmate VVS kiosks at the Main Detention Center. The VVS reduces costs and enhances security associated with the operation of the detention system. CSA No. 1 is funded from the Criminal Justice and Public Improvement Revenue Bond Series 2008. Leo A. Daly Company is a Palm Beach County firm. The contract includes a Small Business Enterprise (SBE) goal of 15% which can be met through the use of either M/WBE or SBE firms. This task has 1.6% M/WBE participation and 0% SBE participation as the design work involves a non-M/WBE/SBE specialty engineer who was not on Daly's team at selection. (Capital Improvements Division) Countywide/District 2 (JM)

Background and Justification: On April 25, 2006, the Board approved proceeding with Jail Expansion Program II consisting of the expansion of the West County Detention Facility, Stockade and renovations to the Main Detention Center. The first phase of the JEP is the design and construction of the Jail Expansion at the West Detention Center and a Central Video Visitation Center, which are complete. CSA No. 1 is for design services associated with adding new Video Visitation units throughout the Main Detention Center. Video Visitation replaces contact visitation between inmates and the public which reduces contraband entering the facility, as well as reduces the need for additional staffing.



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



Exhibit "A"

Level 2 East Infirmary



Level 1 West Tower






Exhibit "D" Level 2 West Infirmary


Level 3A South Tower Levels 2A Similar, 3D & 2D Opposite Hand (4 Locations total)


Levels 4,6,8,10 South Tower East (Similar)




Exhibit "I"
