I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: A) an artist's design project for the existing pedestrian bridge and overlook in Mount's Botanical Garden's Shade & Color Island to enhance the garden; and (B) a Budget Amendment of \$143,750 to the Cooperative Extension Revenue Fund to recognize and appropriate funding for this project from the Friends of Mounts Botanical Garden.

Summary: The Friends of Mounts Botanical Garden has made a donation of \$143,750 to the County to commission an artist to create artistic railings for the pedestrian bridge and overlook in Mounts Botanical Garden's Shade & Color Island. In addition to designing, fabricating and installing railings, the artist will address the bridge and overlook's ground plane to create unified artistic environments. The artwork will be durable, permanent, low maintenance, in compliance with ADA guidelines and will further enhance the garden. No ad valorem funding is required for this project. <u>Countywide (AH)</u>

Background and Justification: In October 2010, Palm Beach County's Art in Public Places sent out a "Call to Artists" Memorandum seeking to commission an artist to create artistic railings for the pedestrian bridge and overlook in Mounts Botanical Garden's Shade & Color Island. Funds have been received from the Friends of Mounts Botanical Garden to support this project and have been deposited into the Cooperative Extension Revenue Fund.

4: Written Narrative

We are all custodians of the environment.

It is my desire to incorporate the re-use and re-purposing of select existing pressure-treated (p-t) wood posts of the overlook and pedestrian bridge as part of my railing design. After thorough inspection of all existing material, my structural engineer has determined it to be structurally excellent and well-suited for twenty or more years of service. In addition, I am re-purposing a large number of the overlook pickets into a grill at the sides of the overlook's west and east facade.

My decision to re-purpose this material is influenced in part by the fact that; due to chemical treatment, p-t wood cannot be chipped or used as mulch. Disposal is limited to dumping it in a landfill. I believe this is wasteful and unnecessary when some elements of the existing project can be successfully re-purposed for this project.

These posts aesthetically provide a perfect segue of the organic to inorganic; from the natural environment / material to man-made fabrications. It is a metaphor for 'garden'; the place where man manipulates nature to suit man's needs. There is considerable use of wood elements at the Mounts Botanical Garden in the form of buildings, gazebos, trellaces, benches and railings. These posts visually blend the balance of the existing 'wood' overlook structure with the proposed aluminum railings.

My design intent is to subtly enhance the site with highly functional railings. The decorative images of the panels are designed with delicate strokes to provide maximum visibility through to the surrounding plant life while providing maximum safety. In particular, this is in consideration for wheelchair visitors to the overlook deck. I have presented a simple color scheme of a white top rail, neutral gray image panels, and yellow accent post hardware. The white crisply defines the protected walkway area with a sense of strength and security. The gray image panels allow the eye to travel beyond with minimal interference. The accent yellow has been chosen for its hue relationship to many of the flowering plants and trees on the Shade and Color Island planting plan. Regardless, alternate suggested color schemes are open for consideration.

A surface treatment for the concrete sidewalks includes the subtle surface staining of phrases from poetry pertaining to gardens.

My general proposal for this project includes:

BRIDGE

Remove horizontal p-t ties and top rail. Replace any p-t wood posts as deemed necessary. Pressure clean entire top bridge surface. Pressure clean all posts; stain as required. Replace all sleeper beams with new p-t material; stain as required, shim with stainless steel spacer to break deck contact, replace all through-bolts with new stainless steel threaded rod and acorn nuts & washers.

Pressure clean both north & south exposed sides of bridge surface, apply pattern mask, stain image pattern on north and south lower bridge side fascias. Install new railings & components.

OVERLOOK

Remove horizontal p-t ties, pickets, and top rail. Replace any p-t wood posts as deemed necessary. Pressure clean entire top overlook surface. Pressure clean all posts; stain as required. Replace all above-deck through-bolts with new stainless steel threaded rod and acorn nuts & washers. Pressure clean north, south, east & west exposed sides of overlook. Stain as required. Fabricate new west facade picket grill using select removed pickets. Install new railings & components. POETRY WALK

Pressure clean entire concrete walkway surface. Apply text masks, stain as required.


MAINTENANCE GUIDELINES

Pressure-treated wood:

Re-direct existing sprinkler system heads to avoid excessive puddling on wood deck surfaces. Apply suitable water-seal product as deemed necessary. Most exterior wood surfaces in our climate (direct sun, moisture) should be coated annually with a product such as Thompson's WaterSeal® to maintain optimum longevity and appearance.


Aluminum Railing Components: No general maintenance required.


Stainless Steel Components: No maintenance required.




