I. <u>EXECUTIVE BRIEF</u>

MOTION AND TITLE: Staff recommends motion to approve: An Amendment to the contract (R2009-2153) with the Drug Abuse Foundation, Inc. to extend the expiration date from September 30, 2010 to March 31, 2011 for the provision of substance abuse treatment services.

SUMMARY: The Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) recommended the use of an amount not to exceed \$125,000 from the federal FY09 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG), and from the Drug Abuse Trust Fund (DATF) to be used to pay for contracted substance abuse treatment referrals from the Community Justice Service Centers (previously known as Community Court). Services will be provided by Drug Abuse Foundation, Inc. for both Community Justice Service Center (CJSC) sites. The CJSC is a court and jail diversion program which ended on December 10, 2010. This will fund treatment in progress at the time the centers closed. Countywide (GB)

BACKGROUND: The Board of County Commissioners (BCC) approved the establishment of a Community Court (now known as the CJSC) on July 21, 1998 to address non-violent misdemeanor offenses that erode the quality of life of a community. It was funded by the Federal Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA). The initial site opened in August 1999 and has relocated to 2107 Tamarind Avenue in West Palm Beach. A second CJSC site, funded by the Federal Bureau of Justice Assistance and located in the Westgate area at 4215 Cherry Road, was opened in May 2006. The CJSC addresses low-level, non-violent misdemeanor crimes and ordinance violations. It diverts offenders from county jail by providing assistance through a wide array of social and clinical services including substance abuse treatment. The CJSC emphasizes community service sanctions rather than fines or incarceration. The goal is for those who harm the community, to give back through community service.

An RFP was not issued as professional medical services are exempt from the Purchasing Code.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT FOR CONSULTING/PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This First Amendment is made October 1, 2010 to the Contract (R2009-2153) dated October 1, 2009 by and between Palm Beach County, a Political Subdivision of the State of Florida, by and through its Board of Commissioners, hereinafter referred to as the COUNTY, and Drug Abuse Foundation, Inc. (DAF), a corporation, authorized to do business in the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the SERVICE PROVIDER, whose Federal I.D. number is 23-7074625.

In consideration of the mutual promises contained herein, the COUNTY and the SERVICE PROVIDER agree to amend the Contract as follows:

Witnesseth

WHEREAS, the COUNTY agrees to continue in partnership with the SERVICE PROVIDER in providing services for the continuation of substance abuse treatment; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to extend the contract for an additional six months from September 30, 2010 to March 31, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY agrees to reimburse the SERVICE PROVIDER with funds received from the Edward F. Byrne Grant and the Drug Abuse Trust Fund and funding shall not exceed the original \$125,000 as provided in the original Contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants expressed herein, the COUNTY and SERVICE PROVIDER agree as follows:

<u>Article 2- Schedule</u> is hereby amended to provide that the Contract shall continue until March 31, 2011.

OFFICE OF THE INSPECTOR GENERAL

Pursuant to Ordinance No. 2009-049, Palm Beach County has established the Office of the Inspector General, which is authorized and empowered to review past, present, and proposed County contracts, transactions, accounts, and records. All contractors and parties doing business with the County and receiving County funds shall fully cooperate with the Inspector General. The Inspector General has the power to subpoena witnesses, administer oaths, require the production of records, and to audit, investigate, monitor, and inspect the activities of the contractor, its officers, agents, employees, and lobbyists in order to ensure compliance with contract specifications and to detect waste, corruption and fraud.

All other provisions of said Contract are hereby confirmed, and except as provided herein are not otherwise altered or amended and remain in full force and effect. All the terms and conditions of the Contract of October 1, 2009, as amended, are hereby confirmed and remain in full force and effect.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida has made and executed this Contract on behalf of the COUNTY and the SERVICE PROVIDER has hereunto set its hand the day and year above written.
