#### I. **EXECUTIVE BRIEF**

MOTION AND TITLE: Staff recommends motion to: A) Receive and File A Grant Adjustment Notice from the Florida Department of Law Enforcement (FDLE) to extend the expiration date from June 30, 2011, to September 30, 2011; and (B) Approve The Second Amendment to the Contract for Professional Services (R2010-0925) with the national non-profit corporation, Gulfstream Goodwill Industries, Inc. The Second Amendment will extend the Agreement from June 30, 2011 to September 30, 2011 for the provision of reentry services.

**SUMMARY:** Gulfstream Goodwill Industries, Inc. is working to bridge a large gap in services in the Glades. The grant project expiration date has been extended by FDLE and the project will be completed by September 30, 2011. Gulfstream Goodwill Industries, Inc. provides intensive case management and job development services to ex-offenders returning from the County Jail and from the State Department of Corrections. There is no match requirement for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program. <u>Countywide</u> (GB)

BACKGROUND AND JUSTIFICATION: Palm Beach County has received a Florida Department of Law Enforcement award as part of the FY2009 (R2010-0924) Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program: State Solicitation. This award was received and filed by the Board of County Commissioners on June 8, 2010 as R2010-0924 and R2010-0925. Gulfstream Goodwill Industries, Inc. was selected by the Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) to provide case management and employment services in the Glades for ex-offenders returning from County Jail and the Florida Department of Corrections. Gulfstream Goodwill Industries, Inc. has been a major service provider working in the area of reentry in West Palm Beach, Gramercy Village, and Delray Beach since 2006. There was a scrivener's error on the First Amendment to the agreement in which the agreement was titled First Amendment to the Interlocal Agreement where the correct title should have been First Amendment to the Contract for Professional Services.

Reentry services in the Glades were identified as an area with a gap in services in a 2008 study called the "Palm Beach County Reentry Assessment Study." This report highlighted reentry services offered throughout the county and also exposed the geographic gaps in services. Palm Beach County's CJC has convened a Task Force on this topic since 2008. Recently, the CJC signed a letter of memorandum with the State Department of Corrections to open a reentry facility in Palm Beach County. Although nationwide, the number of people incarcerated equals one million, Palm Beach County's CJC is searching for methods to reduce costs to the tax payer through prevention services such as these.

#### SECOND AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

THIS SECOND AMENDMENT, dated \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_, to the Contract for Professional Services (R-2010-0925), by and between PALM BEACH COUNTY, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as COUNTY, and the Gulfstream Goodwill Industries Inc., a non-for-profit corporation authorized to do business within the State of Florida, hereinafter referred to as the SERVICE PROVIDER.

#### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the parties have entered into the Contract for Professional Services of June 8, 2010 under which the SERVICE PROVIDER, agreed to provide "reentry" services as more specifically set forth in the Scope of Work as detailed in "Exhibit A" of said Contract for Professional Services and in accordance with the Palm Beach County Reentry strategic plan.

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has agreed to provide support to the SERVICE PROVIDER for reentry and case management services to clients in the Glades area who have been released from either the Palm Beach County Jail or the Florida Department of Corrections which shall be located in an area accessible to clients and under the direction of the Manager of Gulfstream Goodwill Industries Inc.; and

**WHEREAS,** the term of said Contract for Professional Services is from October 1, 2009 through September 30, 2010 and has been amended to extend the project through June 30, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to extend the Contract for Professional Services for an additional three months, until September 30, 2011; and

**WHEREAS**, the COUNTY agrees to reimburse the SERVICE PROVIDER from the Criminal Justice Commission's Florida Department of Law Enforcement Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant program.

**NOW, THEREFORE,** in consideration of the mutual covenants expressed herein, the COUNTY and SERVICE PROVIDER agree as follows:

1. The term of the Contract for Professional Services is amended to provide that the Contract for Professional Services shall continue until September 30, 2011 with an effective date of July 1, 2011.

All other provisions of said Contract for Professional Services are hereby confirmed, and except as provided herein are not otherwise altered or amended. All the terms and conditions of the Contract for Professional Services (R-2010-0925), of June 8, 2010 as amended, are hereby confirmed and remain in full force and effect.

In accordance with Palm Beach County Code, Chapter 2, Article III, Section 2.51, this Second Amendment shall not take effect until executed by the SERVICE PROVIDER and COUNTY.

**IN WITNESS WHEREOF,** the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida has made and executed this Second Amendment to the Contract for Professional Services on behalf of the COUNTY and the SERVICE PROVIDER has hereunto set its hand the day and year above written.



#### Problem Identification

Belle Glade, FL is a place of great hope and hopelessness. The city has staggering poverty and unemployment levels. Youth and adult violence is a way of life in this area. Poverty, joblessness, inadequate schools, poor early childhood stimulation, and fatherless homes all help create a ripple affect. Large percentages of young people commit crimes and go to jail. These are part of the vast numbers of inmates, over 90% that will return to their home communities after serving sentences in the State Department of Corrections. These former offenders have served their debt to society and need services in order to re-enter society. Up until now, a concentrated case management system has not exsisted in Belle Glade for ex-offenders. The Glades area, which includes Belle Glade, Pahokee, and South Bay has tallied in the top five locations in Palm Beach County for returning inmates from the County jail. Without support services, and job prospects many are destined to return to jail.

#### Project Summary (Scope of Work)

The goal of this project is to replicate the activities and success of an existing collaborative effort between three coastal Palm Beach County Weed & Seed sites and GGI by providing services in the designated Weed & Seed site in Belle Glade. The current collaboration supports a re-entry initiative addressing the increasing number of offenders re-entering Weed & Seed sites, and specifically: their need for supportive services for successful community reintegration; the reduction of recidivism rates; and employment. It is our proposal to replicate the program in its entirety in Belle Glade. It is our intention that this program will build linkages between partners in the re-entry effort including service providers, businesses, residents and other stakeholders, establish contact with ex-offenders returning to the Weed & Seed Belle Glade area from State prisons through outreach and recruitment efforts in cooperation with local law enforcement, develop a treatment plan for participants and provide case management, and facilitate the delivery of services to returning ex-offenders in order to support their successful re-entry into society.

Further, the proposal does not duplicate existing services, therefore support services will only be provided when the provision of similar no cost services through community partners such as Workforce Alliance, Project R.E.A.P. Success and others are not available.

Services include the following: It is our intention that this program will build linkages between partners in the re-entry effort including service providers, businesses, residents and other stakeholders, establish contact with ex-offenders returning to the Weed & Seed Belle Glade area from State prisons through outreach and recruitment efforts in cooperation with local law enforcement, develop a treatment plan for participants and provide case management, and facilitate the delivery of services to returning ex-offenders in order to support their successful reentry into society.
