I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to appoint: a Commissioner to the Southeast Florida Regional Partnership Executive Committee which represents a three year commitment with anticipated quarterly meetings.

Summary: South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) and Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) has joined together to create the Southeast Florida Regional Partnership (Partnership). The Southeast Florida Regional Partnership has requested the County appoint a commissioner to serve on the Executive Committee of the Partnership. Commissioner Karen T. Marcus has volunteered to serve on the Executive Committee. This Partnership consists of volunteers from seven (7) county areas that include Monroe, Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River. Southeast Florida Regional Partnership is responsible for the oversight of federal sustainable communities grants in the amount \$4.25 Million. Countywide (TKF)

Background and Justification: South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC) and Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC) has joined together to create the Southeast Florida Regional Partnership (Partnership). This Partnership is a voluntary affiliation of over 200 public, private and nonprofit/civic organizations within a seven (7) county area that includes Monroe, Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River. The Partnership is committed to working together to assure the Southeast Florida region enjoys a prosperous economy, livable communities and a sustainable environment. The Partnership applied for and received a grant from U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for sustainable communities grants in the amount of \$4.25 Million. The Partnership created a work plan, approved by HUD, to develop a regional vision and blueprint for economic prosperity. This work plan requires further refinement and monitoring by the Partnership's Executive Committee. The appointment requires a three year commitment with anticipated quarterly meetings.

Subject: Southeast Florida Regional Partnership - Executive Committee Membership

Dear Chairwoman Marcus:

The South Florida Regional Planning Council (SFRPC), working in partnership with the Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council (TCRPC), created the "Southeast Florida Regional Partnership" (Partnership). The Partnership is a voluntary affiliation of over 200 public, private, and nonprofit/civic organizations within a seven-county area (Monroe, Miami-Dade, Broward, Palm Beach, Martin, St. Lucie and Indian River) committed to working together to ensure the Southeast Florida region enjoys a prosperous economy, livable communities, and a sustainable environment.

Last year, the Partnership submitted an application to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and was selected as one of 45 recipients of the first round of Federal Sustainable Communities grants in the amount of 4.25 million dollars.

The Partnership created a Work Plan (approved by HUD on May 11, 2011) to develop a "Regional Vision and Blueprint for Economic Prosperity". The Work Plan's milestones, deliverables and schedule need to be more fully developed and monitored throughout the duration of the project by the Partnership's Executive Committee — the chief governing board for the Partnership. The role of the 13-member Executive Committee (list of names attached), is critical to the success of this landmark project.

In an effort to ensure authentic and direct local and regional representation, the Partnership is seeking to expand the Executive Committee's membership

Since Palm Beach County is currently a Consortium Member of the Partnership, but has no representation on the Executive Committee, I would like to respectfully request at this time that the Palm Beach County BOCC appoint a Commissioner to the Executive Committee.

This appointment represents a three-year commitment (the duration of the project). Meetings are regional in nature, so they generally occur in the mid-region area (West Palm Beach to Broward County), in locations always accessible by train. The Partnership anticipates four (4) meetings annually that may be attended via webinar. Appointments need to be decided on by September 30, 2011.
