I. <u>EXECUTIVE BRIEF</u>

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Budget Transfer of \$407,993 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2012 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The current State LETF balance is \$2,524,350. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$2,116,357. The year-to-date transfer for all donations after approval of this item is \$446,271. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. Organization Purpose:

The mission of the Boys & Girls Clubs of Palm Beach County is to inspire and assist all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible and caring citizens.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

The program to be funded is for services provided to the teen population in Belle Glade at our Teen Center. The Boys & Girls Club's Teen Center is open when teens need a safe haven during those critical hours after school and when school is not in session. Without the Club, the vast majority of these young people would spend those hours in unsupervised situations and statistically be far more likely to become involved in negative behaviors such as drug and/or alcohol abuse, gang involvement or other criminal activities, premature sexual activity, truancy and poor academic performance. Currently, the Teen Center serves more than 350 teenagers each year and provides a wide variety of programs such as: Education & Career Development; The Arts; Sports, Fitness and Recreation; Citizenship & Leadership Development; Health & Life Skills; and Technology. These funds would be used to provide these young people with a host of caring adult role models and highly acclaimed programs to help them succeed. Exhibit "A" Attached & Included.

What results are you committed to achieving?

The Boys & Girls Clubs is committed to keeping young people out of trouble with the law and in school. In addition to providing a safe, supervised and educational haven, the Club provides an array of opportunities which help youth improve academically, emotionally, physically and socially. As youth who are significantly behind in school are much more likely to drop out, the Club provides certified teachers to tutor them. Club staff also provide encouragement and incentives for the youth. Attendance is tracked as well as reading and math FCAT scores, reading Lexile scores and school attendance. The Club experience works as statistically, our young people stay in school longer, graduate at a much higher rate and outperform their same school peers.

BOYS & GIRLS CLUBS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY CRIME AND DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION PROGRAMS

SMART Moves - The nationally acclaimed SMART Moves (Skills Mastery and Resistance Training) prevention/education program addresses problems such as drug and alcohol use and premature sexual activity. The program uses a team approach involving Club staff, peer leaders, parents and community representatives. More than simply emphasizing a "Say No" message, the program teaches young people ages 6 to 15 how to say no by involving them in discussion and role-playing, practicing resistance and refusal skills, developing assertiveness, strengthening decision-making skills and analyzing media and peer influence. The ultimate goal is to promote abstinence from substance abuse and adolescent sexual involvement through the practice of responsible behavior.

<u>SMART Leaders</u> - This is a booster program to SMART Moves. This program keeps teens involved in the SMART Moves program by reinforcing skills and knowledge youth learned in SMART Moves and prepares teens as leaders to help their peers resist using alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs, and postpone sexual activity.

SMART Girls - An outgrowth of the effective SMART Moves program, SMART Girls is a small-group health, fitness, prevention/education and self-esteem enhancement program designed to meet the developmental needs of girls ages 8-12 and 13-17. Through dynamic sessions, highly participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own and societal attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good healthcare and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.

<u>Passport to Manhood</u> - Passport to Manhood promotes and teaches responsibility while reinforcing positive behavior in male Club members ages 11 to14. Passport to Manhood consists of 14 small-group sessions, each of which concentrates on a specific aspect of manhood through highly interactive activities. Each participant is issued his own "Passport" to underscore the idea that he is on a journey of maturation and personal growth. Passport to Manhood represents a targeted effort to engage young boys in discussion activities that reinforce positive behavior. Passport to Manhood is a complement to SMART Girls.

<u>Date SMART</u> - Through fun and easy-to-use sessions, members between the ages of 13 to 18 learn how to achieve mutually supportive relationships free of violence and abuse. The program also encourages youth to become community advocates for relationships that promote equality and respect while combating the attitudes and behaviors that lead to dating, sexual and domestic violence.

<u>Bullying Hurts</u> - This program is a community service program that focuses on positive youth development and prevention of the anti-social behavior of bullying in schools and communities. Understanding the importance of role models, mentors and the idea that youth just naturally learn from their peers, the Bullying Hurts Program is presented to elementary grade children by more

mature students who are members of high school youth groups in their local area. Equipped with workbooks, videos, posters and their own bullying stories, the high school students work with the younger students teaching them what bullying is and how to deal with bullying in their classrooms and communities. As both groups grow more familiar with each other the high school students become mentors of their younger peers giving them the confidence and tools they will need to seek out support to deal with bullying.

<u>Teen Time Survivor Skills</u> - This Planned Parenthood sponsored program has 10 modules: introduction to sexuality including sex vs. sexuality; reproductive anatomy and physiology; human growth and development including puberty, hygiene, body image and self-esteem; personal skills including communications, values and decision making; abstinence and sexual health including preventing sexual risk-taking; relationships; disease prevention; teen pregnancy prevention; cultural and societal impact on teen sexuality; and a review of what the Club members have learned.

Meth Awareness - The lethal scourge of methamphetamine abuse is spreading across the country and affects us all. "Meth" is a powerful, highly addictive stimulant that is cheap and easy to produce. It is the nation's fastest growing drug threat. Our Clubs participated in National Meth Awareness Day on November 30, 2008. This was collaboration with local agencies and residents to raise awareness about Meth abuse and its terrible effects among all members of our community.

<u>Sporting Competitions and Social Events</u> – These types of programs attract and retain teens at the Club, the positive alternative to being on the streets with nothing to do except to fall prey to at-risk behaviors.

Organization Purpose:

Children's Case Management Organization, Inc. (dba Families First of Palm Beach County) established in 1990, is a private, non-profit social service agency that provides family-centered, strength-based coordination of services, to high risk families and children residing in Palm Beach County.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

The Targeted Outreach for Pregnant Women Program, through this grant, will serve women of child bearing age residing in the Gun Club or Stockade as well as throughout Palm Beach County who are considered high risk for substance abuse, high risk for HIV or women who are HIV+. The women who are pregnant and post partum will receive education concerning their pregnancy and post partum medical concerns, risk reduction information, referral and linkage to drug treatment facilities and ongoing medical care referrals. These women will be followed through ongoing case management and supportive services through the Healthy Beginnings System of Care and other prevention and intervention community-based services to ensure healthy birth outcomes and assist the family with their sobriety.

What results are you committed to achieving?

1. To ensure program participants are channeled into care network to change risk related behaviors; 2. To foster a change in risk-related behaviors among HIV+ women and women high risk for HIV; 3. To encourage women at high risk of becoming HIV infected to get tested for HIV by providing increased availability to HIV counseling and testing services; 4. To ensure that women needing substance abuse treatment are referred and linked to appropriate services; 5. To ensure that women served are referred and linked to appropriate medical providers.

Approximately 80-100 at risk students will participate in the week of JA BizCamp, where they will be taught the skills needed to succeed in the business world. Students will learn their responsibilities as citizens of the community, basics of personal money management, how to go on a job interview, business planning, the role of a business professional and entrepreneurship. Additionally, we will offer an anti-substance abuse curriculum with materials and input from the Caron Foundation.

What results are you committed to achieving?

Based on past performance, over 50% of camp participants will show an increased understanding of basic financial literacy skills, work readiness skills and entrepreneurship. Additionally they will gain an understanding of the necessity of remaining in school to secure a better future. Because of the experiential component of the the JA BizCamp program, participants retain what they are taught over an extended period of time. We also believe that all the participants will have a greater awareness of how substance abuse can negatively impact their future success.

We know that Mobile Eyes will reduce the amount of drunk drivers on the road and discourage people from wanting to take the chance of driving intoxicated. 

Organization Purpose:

Since 1958 the Naval Sea Cadet Corps has been committed to providing American youth with a drug and alcohol free environment to foster their leadership abilities, broaden their horizons through hands-on training and guide them to becoming mature young adults. In conjunction with community partnerships the Corps encourages and aids American youth to develop, train them in seagoing skills, and to teach them patriotism, courage, self-reliance and kindred virtues, such as honor, valor and commitment.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

Cadets drill one weekend per month, with their local unit throughout the year. All Sea Cadet Divisions are structured along military lines and headed by a Commanding Officer, LCDR Dave Boucher is the CO of the Palm Beach Division. The Unit drills at the Lake Worth Inlet Coast Guard Station in Riviera Beach and the Naval Operational Support Center in West Palm Beach. They also complete training at places like J.W. Corbett Wildlife Management Area and other specialized training facilities like Firearm practice ranges.

The Palm Beach Division is the only Sea Cadet unit that specializes in surface warfare and combat craft training. The unit is organized into boat crews, this structure closely reflects the Special Warfare Surface Navy SWCC and the SEAL Organization for which it is designed to support. The local unit has one main purpose, and that is to foster team work, camaraderie and an understanding of the military command structure and to safely operate water borne high speed craft

Cadets are instructed by Sea Cadet Officers, senior cadets and invited consultants through classroom and applied instruction in subjects such as basic seamanship, military drill, and leadership. In addition, Drug and Sexual Abuse, Equal Opportunity, Human Rights and Hazing Education are mandatory courses given annually.

The unit participates in community events such as parades, fairs, community clean-ups, and the annual USMC Toys for Tots Program. Cadets earn an average of 25 Community Service Hours each year.

Sea Cadet training consists of Navy Non-Resident Training Courses (NRTC), training evolutions (away from local units), shipboard training, and training arranged locally by units.

All new cadets enter the program at the rate of Seaman Recruit. In order for cadets to move up through the ranks they must complete the following: the Navy Non-Resident Training Courses (NRTC) Correspondence Course for that rate, one advanced training evolution of 7 to 14 days, and depending on the rate, the Navy's Military Leadership exam for that rate. The NRTC's cover basic military and naval subjects such as naval history, seamanship, leadership, and ship/aircraft familiarization. The cadet rate structure parallels that of the Navy and Coast Guard's enlisted rate structure, with Chief Petty Officer being the highest rate a cadet can achieve.

Advanced training evolutions take place during summer months and occasionally during winter and spring break periods and are generally one to two weeks in length. The first training evolution for all cadets is NSCC Recruit Training, better known as boot camp. It is a scaled down version of the Navy's boot camp. For two-weeks cadets are instructed by active and reserve military personnel and Sea Cadet officers in military drill and discipline, physical fitness, seamanship, shipboard safety, first aid, naval history, and leadership.

After cadets have successfully completed boot camp, they can then participate in advanced training. Sea Cadet advanced training currently consists of airman training, culinary, firefighting, medical, marksmanship, judge advocate general, construction battalion, music, mine warfare and seal team training, Coast Guard and Navy ships, and Petty Officer Leadership Academy to name a few.

The Palm Beach Division sponsors the advanced training of Surface Warfare Combatant Craft training (SWCC). SWCC are Special Operations Forces who operate and maintain an inventory of state-of-the-art, high-performance boats used to support special operations missions, particularly those of the U.S. Navy SEALs. Individually, SEALs and SWCC go through separate specialized training programs that emphasize special operations in the maritime environment. SWCC are trained extensively in craft and weapons tactics, techniques and procedures. Focusing on clandestine infiltration and exfiltration of SEALs and other special operations forces, SWCC provide dedicated, rapid mobility in shallow water areas where large ships cannot operate. SWCC must be physically fit, highly motivated, combat-focused, and responsive in high stress situations.

This training includes physical, emotional, and specialized training. Topics consist of discipline, safety, and commitment to mission. Cadets must complete the Florida Boating Safety Course (1 day), and other topics including Special Operations Craft (SOC) orientation, Navigation, VHF Radio, GPS and Radar operation. Actual hands on underway operation on SOC's. Cadets learn to assemble and operate CRRC's (Combat Rubber Raiding Craft). There is a minimum of one night at sea operation.

What results are you committed to achieving? The Palm Beach Division prides itself with the formation of the youth in a safe drug and alcohol free environment. It has the goal to foster cadet's leadership abilities, broaden their horizons through hands-on training and guide them to becoming mature young adults. Many of the graduates of the program have been awarded scholarships in military academies and/or have gone on to serve the community in law enforcement, fire safety and military service.
