I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Budget Transfer of \$253,750 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2012 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The current State LETF balance is \$2,116,357. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$1,862,607. The year-to-date transfer for all donations after approval of this item is \$700,021. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. No new positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. <u>Countywide</u> (GB)

We offer a multi-year commitment to at-risk children in Palm Beach County. We deliver proven, life changing results to our students by providing mentors, case management, early intervention and self improvement workshops. We help reduce crime in our neighborhoods, by making criminal behavior a disqualifying offense for the program and by providing two research-driven factors for the prevention of crime: a positive relationship with an adult from outside the family and hope for a brighter future. By keeping the doors of opportunity open to our students, they have less reason to give up on their future. Successful completion of the program results in a full-tuition college scholarship!

What results are you committed to achieving?

It is our goal to give students the help they need to graduate from high school and attend college so they may go on to be productive citizens with meaningful employment. With LETF's donation we will continue to provide direct services to 300 low-income, mainly minority, at-risk youth ages 12-18 living in PBC. The Lord's Place is dedicated to breaking the cycle of homelessness by providing innovative, compassionate, and effective services to men, women, and children in our community.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

The Transition from Jail to Community (TJC) Project aligns 31 local agencies and providers to offer a cohesive and cost-efficient approach to reentry services in Palm Beach County. Upon incarceration, clients participate in a battery of assessments, including education, mental and physical health, as well as program readiness. The clients are then assigned a re-entry coach, whose focus is to mentor the client prior to release, set up a personal plan for transition back into the community, and help the client administer the plan upon release. Post-release, key services include case management, physical and mental healthcare, recovery services, housing, employment, education, finances/benefits, rights restoration, and family reunification.

What results are you committed to achieving?

The ultimate goal of this project is to reduce recidivism and increase safety in our community: (1.) At least 80% of all clients will stay out of jail, for the duration of the grant and beyond, (2.) All participants will be assessed, assigned a plan of action toward personal success, with at least 80% of clients maintaining the course of action through the duration of the grant and beyond. (3.) Existing "silo" oriented re-entry programs around the country will be aligned, more cost effective, and the pilot will expand to encompass at least 2 additional communities by the end of the grant, (4.) Comprehensive data collection and evaluation process will assist in highlighting needed systemic reform for reentry services.
