## I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

**Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to: Adopt** the 2011 Palm Beach County's Disaster Recovery Plan which has been approved by the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management.

Summary: As required by the State of Florida Division of Emergency Management, Palm Beach County's Division of Emergency Management developed the County's Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP). DRP is one of several plans published by the County's Department of Public Safety, Division of Emergency Management, which is the framework for countywide response, recovery and mitigation activities. It is the intent of the DRP to provide a flexible structure that consists of the precaution taken so that the effects of a disaster will be minimized and Palm Beach County will be able to either maintain or quickly resume mission-critical functions countywide. It is also to facilitate interoperability between local, state, and federal governments. Countywide (GB)

Background and Policy Issues: The Disaster Recovery Plan (DRP) addresses the short, intermediate, and long-term challenges of managing disaster recovery. Like the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan and the Local Mitigation Strategy Plan, the DRP address all hazards events, whether natural or technological, and provide constructs that are scalable, adaptable, and responsive to the changing needs of different disasters. The DRP provides recovery concepts and principles important to all disaster recovery stakeholders. It provides guidance for engaging in pre-disaster recovery planning and other recovery preparedness and resiliency building efforts; clarifies roles for local, state, and federal governments, post-disaster recovery planning to expedite long-term disaster recovery; and provides assistance in identifying recovery needs beyond replacement or return to pre-disaster condition. The DRP provides quidance that impacted communities may use to develop recovery priorities, and measure recovery progress and outcomes against their objectives. It lays out a systematic approach to disaster recovery, applicable to all levels of government and sectors of communities with recovery responsibilities. The DRP also provides guidance for both County government and non-governmental agencies providing recovery assistance, ensure accountability, and make adjustments to ongoing assistance. .
