I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to approve: a Budget Transfer of \$49,307 from the Law Enforcement Trust Fund (LETF) to the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office (PBSO).

Summary: Florida Statute 932.7055 requires that no less than 15% of the LETF's previous year's revenues be used for the support or operation of drug treatment, drug abuse education, drug prevention, crime prevention, safe neighborhood and school resource officer programs of various non-profit organizations. The PBSO's FY 2012 estimated donation requirement will not be finalized until year-end close-out. The funds are requested to aid qualified organizations that meet the requirements set forth in F.S. 932.7055. The PBSO's support of these programs exemplifies its strong commitment to the prevention and reduction of crime throughout the communities it serves and its desire to put money back into these communities to support organizations that provide such services. The current State LETF balance is \$1,862,607. Approval of this request will reduce the State Law Enforcement Trust Fund balance to \$1,813,300. The year-to-date transfer for all donations after approval of this item is \$749,328. The PBSO certifies that the use of these funds is in accordance with F.S. 932.7055. Below is a table indicating the organizations the PBSO seeks to fund and the corresponding amount of funding proposed per respective agency. Organization Purpose:

The mission of the Achievement Centers for Children and Families (ACCF) is to provide programs and services designed to help low-income families break the cycle of poverty while preparing children for academic success.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

The program to be funded is for services provided to the teen population in our Afterschool, Beacon Center Extended Day and Teen Programs at the Village Academy which is located at 400 SW 12th Street, Delray Beach, FL 33444. The Center is open when teens need a safe haven during those critical non school hours, from 2:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. every day after school. Without the Center, the vast majority of these young people would spend those hours in unsupervised situations and statistically be far more likely to become involved in negative behaviors.

What results are you committed to achieving?

The Achievement Centers is committed to keeping young people out of trouble with the law and in school. In addition to providing a safe, supervised and educational haven, the Center provides an array of opportunities which help youth improve their academic and physical performance. As youth who are significantly behind in school are much more likely to drop out, the Center provides certified teachers and volunteers to help them improve academically. Staff also provide encouragement and incentives for the youth. Attendance is tracked as well as reading and math FCAT scores and school attendance. The Center's experience works as statistically, afterschool youth stay in school longer, graduate at a much higher rate and outperform their same school peers.

Teens Programs Conducted by the Achievement Centers for Children & Families

Teen programs will be conducted for more than 100 economically disadvantaged youth between the ages of 12-18 who attend the Achievement Centers for Children & Families. The programs offered provide these youth with programs that help stem school truancy and drop out and give youth with the tools and skills to boost their academic achievement as well as provide resources to help youth develop good personal skills and healthy lifestyle choices. Specialized research-based programs help teens make positive lifestyle choices by staying away from drugs and alcohol; staying in school; preventing bullying and violence; and becoming active members of their community. The program operates year-round from school dismissal time until 7:00 PM. It includes most out-of-school days and extended evening hours and some weekend days for special events. Summer camp operates 10 hours per day for 8 weeks.

- The Achievement Centers for Children & Families annually collaborates with the City of Delray Beach and the Delray Police Department to host a Youth Crime Prevention Summit. This full-day Summit brings together community leaders, members of the police force and organizational experts to discuss such salient topics as bullying, cyber bullying, gangs, teen suicide prevention, teen drug use and prevention, teen pregnancy prevention, and social network safety. Last year's Summit was attended by 1,200 South Palm Beach County students.
- Family Strengthening The Beacon Center hosts an annual Family Strengthening event for 500 of the Center's youth and their families. Scheduled for early October, the focus of the event is two-fold. The event provides important educational information for the entire family on such topics as bullying (how to identify and handle a bully and where to go for help); cyber bullying (how to monitor your child's computer activity, how to ask for help and where to go for help); gangs (how to prevent your child from becoming involved in gangs and identifying gang recruitment techniques); and a variety of prevention discussions (including drugs, alcohol, guns and other weapons and pregnancy.)
- Career Day The Beacon Center conducts an annual Career Day for its teens. Local businesses, government agencies, nonprofit organizations, restaurant franchisers and colleges and universities are invited to present information to teens about their companies/organizations/schools informing teens about job opportunities, requirements for various positions, application procedures and scholarship applications/availability. The event broadens the world of opportunity for our teens and gives them the chance to practice their interviewing skills as well as explore potential career fields and areas of further study. More than 100 teens attend the annual Career Day.

- The Wise Skills Curriculum is an interdisciplinary character education program that highlights inspiring role models and helps reduce behavior problems, increase instructional time, and build a positive culture of character. The program features instruction and role playing in such topics as: bullying prevention, service learning, social and emotional learning, drug and violence prevention and positive role models.
 - Bullying Prevention This character education program focuses students on positive principles of character and teaches specific ways to demonstrate good character, respect others, and create a positive and healthy school environment. Wise Skills includes a variety of classroom and family activities that teach students these critical life skills and character traits that proactively prevent bullying and other aggressive behaviors. Among the topics covered are: communication skills, managing feelings, conflict resolution, peer mediation, positive speech, friendship, respect, responsibility, self-discipline, compassion, courage, forgiveness, humility, cooperation, patience, and tolerance/fairness.
 - O Service Learning Engaging young people in meaningful service experiences teaches them valuable life lessons about contributing to others. Service-learning can involve a variety of family, school, or community projects where young people make a positive difference in others' lives and identify connections to the academic program. The Wise Skills character education program embeds service-learning into the curriculum. Among the service learning ideas are: environmental and beautification projects; building relationships with residents at Senior Centers; visiting the sick at hospitals; raising funds for a local/global project; or helping to provide food to the needy/homeless in the community.
 - O Drug & Violence Prevention Recent research into effective strategies for drug prevention and violence prevention has found that there are important experiences that make young people less likely to abuse drugs and engage in violent behavior. The Wise Skills character education program applies drug and violence prevention research by involving young people in a variety of classroom, family, and service activities that develop the critical character qualities that help them make healthy choices. Prevention research has shown that young people who face "risk factors"--including parental drug use, poverty, family conflict, and academic failure--become more *resilient* to using drugs or committing acts of violence when they were provided with Protective Factors. These Protective Factors serve to "protect," or reduce, the impact of the negative experiences and, thus, foster effective drug and violence prevention, all of which are integral to the program.
- Teens participate in academic tutoring and guided coursework instruction, educational enrichment programs, homework assistance, and preparation for the Florida Comprehensive Assessment Tests (FCAT.)
- Teens participate in a variety of Clubs in the fields of computer technology, graphic and web design, culinary arts and catering, financial literacy, video production and

- photography. Career Path Clubs are focused in areas of interest and relevance and have been selected by students. Skills for entrepreneurial options such as sewing, jewelry design, and airbrushing are offered.
- Teens also participate in a music production studio, dance teams, a chess club and small
 discussion groups for topics of interest and program input. Guest speakers from various
 professions and local vocational schools are regularly scheduled. Students take field trips
 to businesses and post graduate institutes.

Organization Purpose:

Since its inception in 1949, the Mental Health Association of Palm Beach County (MHA) has been dedicated to improving the lives of people who are touched by mental illness through education, advocacy, and outreach. MHA operates a support center for people with mental illness.

Provide a brief summary of program's activities/services to be funded:

MHA's Peer Place Support Center offers aftercare, rehabilitation and behavioral support groups, peer mentoring, supported employment, care coordination, and life-skills training for adult mental health and co-occurring clients. In addition, we offer AA/NA meetings, Access to Recovery services targeting veterans and others with mental illness. Our RAP program helps clients create recovery plans and work toward their goals. Our licensed mental health counselor provides screenings for basic needs and mental illness through our new Care Access System (CANSS). Established in 1992, Peer Place provides specialized services to about 500 people each month. They will total over 5,500 visits in the coming year. We have grown and are ready to help PBSO by taking people who can benefit.

What results are you committed to achieving?

We would like to provide a safe place for people with mental illness to drop in to avoid incarceration, hospitalization and worse. We will provide peer mentoring, support groups, and links to community resources to help people become stabilized and work towards becoming productive members of society. Peer Place offers an array of restorative aftercare, rehabilitation, and behavioral support services, care coordination, and life-skills training for adults with serious mental illnesses and co-occurring chronic conditions. There is a significant over-representation of people with mental illness and the behavior, which led to being incarcerated. It is also widely accepted that there are far more mentally ill persons in jails than in mental health facilities. By providing services to individuals with mental illness, we hope to divert those individuals away from jails (thereby reducing law enforcement's role) and into treatment and recovery programs.
