I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: the Second Amendment, amending the agreement with the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, as the fiscal agent for the Ft. Lauderdale Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) to extend the agreement period for the Regional Virtual Fusion Center from August 31, 2011, through December 30, 2011.

Summary: On January 12, 2010, the Board of County Commissioners accepted this agreement to provide \$336,900 in reimbursable funding; the original period for this agreement was August 27, 2009, through May 31, 2011 (R-2010-0121). On October 18, 2011, the BOCC received and filed an agenda item extending the grant period from May 31, 2011, through August 31, 2011 (R-2011-1653). This agenda item will extend the agreement period from August 31, 2011, through December 30, 2011. This agreement provides a means of funding various domestic security activities within the County and region using federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funds through the City of Miramar as the Ft. Lauderdale UASI's fiscal agent. These funds and related equipment will be used for the Regional Virtual Fusion Center hosted by PBSO. There is no match requirement associated with this award. SECOND AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM(S) OF AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATING FORT LAUDERDALE UASI AGENCIES

This Second Amendment to Memorandum(s) of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies (the "Second Amendment") is entered into this <u>13</u> day of <u>2010</u>, by and between the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (the "Sponsoring Agency") and <u>Palm Beach Sheriff's Office</u>, a political subdivision of the of the State of Florida (the "Participating Agency").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into a Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated <u>February 18, 2009</u> (the "Primary MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of **\$451,337.00** subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program, the initial term of which was to end on <u>May 31, 2011</u>; and which term has been extended through <u>August 31, 2011</u> by way of a previous first amendment approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into another Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated <u>August 27, 2011</u> (the "Regional MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of **\$336,900.00**, subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program for a regional project to fund: <u>equipment and personnel for the South Florida Virtual Fusion Center</u>, to be expended and reimbursed pursuant to the terms of the MOA, the initial term of which was to end on <u>May, 31, 2011</u>; and which term was extended through <u>August 31, 2011</u> by way of a previous first amendment approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the MOA(s) is/are subject to all terms, provisions and conditions of the Federally Funded Subgrant Agreement between the Sponsoring Agency and the

State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management for FY 2008 (the "State Agreement"), the current term of which will end or has ended on August 31, 2011; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency has applied to the State of Florida for an extension of the term of the State Agreement in order to provide additional time for the completion of procurement and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2008 UASI Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida has agreed, subject to execution of a written contract modification, to extend the State Agreement through <u>December 30, 2011</u>; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to extend the term of all referenced MOAs between the parties related to FY 2008 UASI Grant funding through the same extension date as approved by the State of Florida for the State Agreement, to wit: <u>December 30, 2011</u>, in order to provide additional time for the completion of the procurement process and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2008 UASI Grant Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. In conjunction with the extension of the State Agreement through December 30, 2011, the term of the referenced MOA(s) between the parties shall be extended to December 30, 2011.

2. All terms, provisions and conditions of the MOA not inconsistent with this Second Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
