AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA, PERTAINING TO POSTING OF UNDERAGE DRINKING SIGNS; PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS; PROVIDING FOR GENERAL REQUIREMENTS; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING REPEAL OF LAWS IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR INCLUSION IN THE CODE OF LAWS AND ORDINANCES; PROVIDING FOR CAPTIONS; PROVIDING FOR APPLICABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Palm Beach County, Florida, finds that underage drinking and service of alcoholic beverages to minors is an increasing problem in Palm Beach County; and

WHEREAS, medical studies and highway statistics note serious health risks and adverse effects associated with consumption of alcoholic beverages by minors; and

WHEREAS, the general public should be informed regarding the law prohibiting service of alcoholic beverages to minors; and

WHEREAS, the general public should be informed regarding the penalties associated

with the sale or provision of alcoholic beverages to minors; and

WHERAS, the posting of signs with such information by vendors and certain other

dispensers of alcoholic beverages warning of the prohibition against and the penalties

associated with the sale or provision of alcoholic beverages to minors will make the public

aware of the possible consequences of providing alcoholic beverages to underage minors; and

WHEREAS, the Palm Beach County Substance Abuse Awareness Coalition has endorsed posting of these types of signs as an effective measure to generate awareness and

deterrence of the provision of alcoholic beverages to underage minors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that it will serve the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Palm Beach County to inform the public as to

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PALM BEACH COUNTY BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PALM BEACH COUNTY, FLORIDA,

Section 1. Definitions

The following words, phrases, or terms when used in this Ordinance shall, unless the content otherwise indicates, have the meanings provided below. No attempt is made to define

ordinary words which are used in accordance with their established dictionary meaning except when necessary to avoid misunderstanding.

- a) Alcoholic Beverage means alcohol, spirits, liquor, wine or beer, regardless of amount, containing more than one percent (1%) alcohol by weight.
- b) Business Establishment includes, but is not limited to, any place of business or any club, organization, person, firm, corporation or partnership, such as: a golf club; country club; veteran's fraternal or benevolent organization; grocery store; drug store; night club; bottle club; bar; tavern; restaurant; grill; filling station; convenience store; or any other building, structure or location or portion thereof, wherein one person directly or indirectly pays another for the purchase or dispensing of an alcoholic beverage.
- c) Conspicuously posted means clearly visible, easily readable and immediately apparent upon viewing.
- d) Dispense means the storing, handling, apportionment, preparation, gift, distribution, or serving, directly or indirectly, of any amount of an alcoholic beverage to or for any person by any officer, owner, operator, lessee, or employee of a business establishment. For purposes of this definition, permitting or allowing any person to carry alcoholic beverages on the premises of any business establishment to be consumed thereon shall constitute the "dispensing" of such beverages.
- e) *Minor* means any individual under the legal drinking age as set forth by Florida Statutes ss. 562.11 and 562.111, as may be amended or replaced.
- f) Person means an individual, person, firm, joint venture, partnership, corporation, estate, trust, business trust, syndicate, fiduciary, association, and all other groups or combinations.
- g) Sale means any transfer of an alcoholic beverage for consideration, or any gift of an alcoholic beverage in connection with or as a part of a transfer of any property or product for consideration.
- h) Vendor of Alcoholic Beverages means any person who owns or operates a business establishment which sells or dispenses any alcoholic beverages for consumption on or off the premises.

### Section 2. General Requirements

a) All persons who own or operate a business establishment in Palm Beach County which

sells or dispenses alcoholic beverages for consumption on or off the premises shall conspicuously post a notice within said business establishment where alcoholic beverages are displayed, purchased, or consumed. Failure to post such required notice pursuant to the requirements of this Section 2, shall constitute a violation of this Ordinance.

- b) Required notice shall consist one or more signs or notices, each of which is not less than fifteen square inches (8-1/2"x11"), with at least a 14-point type, which contains the following information, clearly discernable by persons to whom alcoholic beverages may be sold or dispensed:
  - 1. It is unlawful to purchase alcohol if you are under 21 years of age.
  - 2. It is unlawful to sell or dispense alcohol to persons under 21 years of age, unless exempt pursuant to Sections 562.11 or 562.13, Florida Statutes.
  - 3. The penalties associated with the sale or dispensing of alcoholic beverages to persons under 21 years of age include imprisonment in county jail for a period of up to 60 days a fine up to \$500, or both.
  - 4. A telephone number to report those who are in violation of the law. Such telephone numbers may include but are not limited to:
    - a. 211 Palm Beach County
    - b. 561-650-6840 Office of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco.

### Section 3. Enforcement

It is unlawful to violate any provisions of this Ordinance. Such violations may be enforced by all means available at law including but not limited to enforcement proceedings before Palm Beach County Code Enforcement Special Masters, the prosecution of violations in the name of the State of Florida pursuant to the authority granted by Sec. 125.69, Florida Statutes, as may be amended, or any other lawful actions as are necessary to prevent or remedy any violation of this Ordinance.

#### Section 5. Severability

If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Ordinance is for any reason held by a Court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, inoperative, or void, such holding shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.

### Section 6. Repeal of Laws in Conflict

All local laws and ordinances in conflict with any provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

### Section 7. Inclusion in the Code of Laws and Ordinances

The provisions of this Ordinance shall become and be made a part of the Palm Beach County Code. The sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered or re-lettered to accomplish such, and the word "ordinance" may be changed to "section," "article," or other appropriate word.

### Section 8. Captions

The captions, section headings, and section designations used in this Ordinance are for convenience only and shall have no effect on the interpretation of the provisions of this Ordinance.

### Section 9. Applicability

All provisions of this Ordinance shall apply to the unincorporated areas of Palm Beach County, Florida, and to all municipalities within Palm Beach County that elect to have the provisions of this Ordinance apply within their respective jurisdictions.

### Section 10. Effective Date

The provisions of this Ordinance shall become effective on2012.
