THIRD AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT FOR PARTICIPATING FORT LAUDERDALE UASI AGENCIES

This Third Amendment to Memorandum (s) of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies (the "Third Amendment") is entered into this 20 day of 20 2, by and between the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (the "Sponsoring Agency") and Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office, a political subdivision of the of the State of Florida (the "Participating Agency").

RECITALS

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

- 1. In conjunction with the extension of the State Agreement through February 29, 2012, the term of the referenced MOA(s) between the parties shall be extended to February 29, 2012.
- 2. All terms, provisions and conditions of the MOA(s) not inconsistent with this Third Amendment shall remain in full force and effect.
