**FOURTH AMENDMENT TO MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
FOR PARTICIPATING FORT LAUDERDALE UASI AGENCIES**

This Fourth Amendment to Memorandum (s) of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies (the "Fourth Amendment") is entered into this 3rd day of July, 2012, by and between the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida (the "Sponsoring Agency") and Palm Beach Sheriff's Office, a political subdivision of the of the State of Florida (the "Participating Agency").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into a Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated February 18, 2009 (the "Primary MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of \$451,337.00 subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program, the initial term of which was to end on May 31, 2011; and which term has been extended through February 29, 2012 by way of three previous amendments approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency and the Participating Agency entered into another Memorandum of Agreement for Participating Fort Lauderdale UASI Agencies dated August 27, 2009 (the "Regional MOA") related to expenditures of funds allocated in the amount of \$336,900.00, subgranted to the Participating Agency under the FY 2008 Urban Area Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program for a regional project to fund: equipment and personnel for the South Florida Virtual Fusion Center, to be expended and reimbursed pursuant to the terms of the MOA, the initial term of which was to end on May, 31, 2011; and which term was extended through February 29, 2012 by way of three previous amendments approved by the parties; and

WHEREAS, the MOA(s) is/are subject to all terms, provisions and conditions of the Federally Funded Subgrant Agreement between the Sponsoring Agency and the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management for FY 2008 (the "State

Agreement"), the current term of which will end or has ended on February 29, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the Sponsoring Agency has applied to the State of Florida for an extension of the term of the State Agreement in order to provide additional time for the completion of procurement and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2008 UASI Grant Program; and

WHEREAS, the State of Florida has agreed, subject to execution of a written contract modification, to extend the State Agreement through August 31, 2012; and

WHEREAS, the parties mutually desire to reinstate and extend the term of all referenced MOAs between the parties related to FY 2008 UASI Grant funding through the same extension date as approved by the State of Florida for the State Agreement, to wit: August 31, 2012, in order to provide additional time for the completion of the procurement process and the expenditure of the grant funding available under the FY 2008 UASI Grant Program.


NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises contained herein, the parties agree as follows:



I. EXECUTIVE BRIEF

Motion and Title: Staff recommends motion to receive and file: the Third Amendment, with the City of Miramar, a municipal corporation of the State of Florida, as the fiscal agent for the Ft. Lauderdale Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) to extend the agreement period for the Regional Virtual Fusion Center from December 30, 2011, through February 29, 2012.

Summary: On January 12, 2010, the Board of County Commissioners accepted this agreement to provide \$336,900 in reimbursable funding; the original period for this agreement was August 27, 2009, through May 31, 2011 (R-2010-0121). On October 18, 2011, the BOCC received and filed an agenda item extending the grant period from May 31, 2011, through August 31, 2011 (R-2011-1653). On March 6, 2012, the BOCC received and filed an agenda item extending the grant period from August 31, 2011, through December 30, 2011 (3BB-3). This agenda item will extend the agreement period from December 30, 2011, through February 29, 2012. This agreement provides a means of funding various domestic security activities within the County and region using federal Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) funds through the City of Miramar as the Ft. Lauderdale UASI's fiscal agent. These funds and related equipment will be used for the Regional Virtual Fusion Center hosted by PBSO. There is no match requirement associated with this award. No additional positions are needed and no additional County funds are required. Countywide (PE)

Background and Justification:

The Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI) is intended is to create a sustainable national model program to enhance security and overall preparedness to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism. In general, the UASI provides financial assistance to States to address the unique equipment, training, planning, and exercise needs of large urban areas, and to assist them in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, respond to, and recover from threats or acts of terrorism. It also includes awards to (1) selected State and local governmental entities and commercial companies to develop plans and approaches to ensuring the safety and protection of the Nation's ports, and (2) selected State and local governmental entities to develop plans and approaches to ensuring the safety and protection of the Nation's transit systems. The Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance (CFDA) number is 97.008.
